Artist Profile

Quick Sketch - Bill Kobylorz By Steve Horvath

Sheboygan, Wisconsin, October 28, 2017 – Some of you may not know Bill Kobylorz personally but you see him, in a manner of speaking, every time you receive a newsletter. Bill is responsible for our newsletter masthead art.

Bill found his way to Sheboygan via Muskegon, Michigan where he was born and raised. He said he always had an interest in art even when he was a little kid. When he was in the 7th grade he was asked to do a mural on the blackboard. He produced a still life in the 8th grade that he was proud of and so was the teacher he said because she hung on to it. When Bill was a senior he took an art class. He said in his high school they had printing presses and typesetting that they were able to get involved in because it was kind of a trade school setting. He really enjoyed the printing and mechanical drawing was also part of the program.

Bill contacted several colleges around the country about enrolling in their art program and finally settled on Layton School of Art. He thought, "why not, it was close to Muskegon". He went to Layton from 1949 – 1952 and graduated with a degree in Graphic Design after changing from an Illustration major.



Bill went back to Muskegon after graduation and enlisted in the Army. He had basic training in Ft. Knox, Kentucky and then he was shipped off to Yokohama, Japan via Chicago and Seattle. He was deployed with the 1st Calvary stationed in Hokkaido, Japan waiting to be sent on to Korea... Bill said he lucked out because by the time he arrived in Japan he was on hold there because a truce had been implemented in Korea.

While Bill was in the Army he was doing art work for Division Headquarters so he was able to keep in touch with what he really enjoyed doing which was to follow after he finished his military service.

After return to his home town following military service Bill secured a job as an airbrush illustrator at a furniture company. When asked if he knew how to airbrush he said yes never having touched an airbrush. To get ready he went to the art supply store and bought an airbrush so he could practice over the weekend before starting the job on Monday. Now that's what I call confidence.



After a couple of years working for the furniture company Bill left the job to work for a printing company in Grand Haven, Michigan. At this job he did pre-press art and layout work for 2 or 3 years before taking a position working for an advertising agency for about a year doing illustration and layout work.

For those of you who are not familiar with the advertising / design business it is not unusual for artists and designers to change jobs every couple of years to get opportunities to work with different types of businesses to give your talent a chance to really blossom.

Bill was about to change jobs for one final time to begin a long career with the Vollrath company in Sheboygan doing product design, package design, comprehensive layouts, finished art and photography supervision. Bill said he really enjoyed his experience at Vollrath. He says, "You're designing a piece that goes out to the public. The only thing I didn't enjoy were the deadlines. Everything was always rush."

During all of those interesting jobs Bill had not forgotten about his own art work. He continued to work on the art he loved to create, from wildlife paintings to landscapes and even wildlife carvings. His illustrators' deft hand and eye for composition and color are evident in his work.

Bill and his wife Marilyn, for a number of years, would spend 3 months out of the winter in Florida so Bill could pursue his water coloring and of course to enjoy a respite from the northern winter climate. While in Florida he taught the art of watercolor to a senior group but decided that it was taking up too much of his time to engage in his own art work. Bill says he paints for his own enjoyment. And finally, "Besides painting I like to play my accordion."

Robert Krajecki – Demonstrator Annual Membership Meeting

We have an outstanding artist demonstrating at the April Annual Membership Meeting. Robert committed to pursuing his art interest after completing his tour of duty during the Vietnam conflict in 1967 and enrolled in the American Academy of Art in Chicago, IL. He majored in watercolor painting with nationally known painter, Irving Shapiro, AWS, who was also at that time, President and Director of the Academy. Robert studied at the Chicago Academy of Fine Art in Chicago, IL and is a graduate of the American Academy of Art. Two years after graduation, Mr. Shapiro invited Bob to become a full time instructor of Fundamentals of Drawing and Painting at the American Academy, where he taught for 28 years. He was appointed chairman of that program, a position he held from 1989, until his retirement in 2000. Currently, Bob teaches watercolor painting and Fundamentals of Drawing and Painting at the prestigious Palette and Chisel Academy of Fine Art in Chicago, and watercolor painting in his hometown of Kaneville, Illinois.

Robert is a Signature member of the Illinois Watercolor Society.

Anthony Theodore Handzlik 1921 - 2017

Anthony Theodore Handzlik passed away peacefully on December 12, 2017 at the age of 96. Born in June, 1921, to Joseph and Louise Handzlik in Milwaukee WI, Tony was one of five children. Tony married Hattie Zwicker while serving in the U.S. Air Force as a Staff Sergeant, and lived happily with the "love of his life" for 72 years. Tony is survived by his wife, children and their spouses. He is loved and missed by his seven grandchildren, ten great grandchildren, and many nieces and nephews. Tony will be remembered by his family and friends as a kind and loving gentleman with a great sense of humor and the skills to design, paint, sculpt, invent, teach, coach and mentor. He was an artist, musician, poet and comedian. Tony attended St. Mary of Czestochowa, Messmer High School, and Layton School of Art-all in Milwaukee. He left art school to enter the Air Force during World War II. In his retirement, he taught art at Alverno College, was a dedicated member of the Milwaukee Sketch Club, and an esteemed member of the Wisconsin Watercolor Society. He was an avid tennis player and golfer, enjoying the links until he was 95. He was a passionate fan of Wisconsin sports.
