### Principals Report P&C Generosity

Last Monday evening, at the monthly P&C meeting, the P&C approved three funding requests from the school. These funds will provide much needed resources which will improve the safety and education of the students. There were three main items:

- The increased needs of online learning, assessment tests and educational activities such as Robotics and STEM has shown a shortage of laptops in the school, mainly from Year 3-6. \$47,000 was approved to purchase 60 new laptops and associated docking caddies.
- 2) To upgrade the current communication system in the old building with an automatic remote messaging, safety and school bell system synchronised to the new building and hall, \$20,000 was approved to carry out this extensive work.
- 3) Since the establishment of a large library in the new building and the appointment of a conscientious and passionate librarian who is committed to improving the reading at BH, the number of students borrowing and reading more books has increased significantly. This request is for a library budget to purchase more quality literature and subscriptions was requested and \$10,000 was approved.

The students and staff at BH are blessed to have a conscientious and caring P&C, with dedicated committees and volunteers who raise these much appreciated funds.

#### **Building Fund**

It is now time to build our reserves in the building fund again, so please refer to the information inside today. The Building Fund has Deductible Gift Recipient status with the ATO. #### **Emergency Assistance**

As you would be aware, Bondi Beach Public School has been extensively damaged, losing

eight classrooms and most of the heritage building to a huge fire earlier this week, causing the whole school to be closed and students remaining at home until temporary accommodation could be organised.



Even though the DoE has eight demountables in place to be installed on the grassed area at the school, the site remains completely closed until it can be deemed safe for students and staff to return to areas not affected by fire, water and/or smoke damage.

In emergency situations like this e.g. in schools affected by floods, bushfires etc, local schools assist in every way possible. This week, Bellevue Hill PS has been able to assist Bondi Beach PS with temporary accommodation for the last two weeks of term.

I am extremely proud to report that Bellevue Hill teachers and office staff have been so positive and generous, offering space in their rooms, resources for the BBPS students and any assistance required for our visitors. In fact, a huge number of staff have said they are proud of what we have and quite excited about sharing our school with the visitors.

Similarly, Bondi Beach staff have expressed excitement about using our open plan classrooms and office area. Teachers are thrilled to have such beautiful classrooms, modern furniture as well as being exposed to future focused teaching and learning. I'm sure the students will benefit as well, hopefully making new friends and learning how other schools are organised and operate. It promises to be a busy but fruitful two weeks ahead.


#### **Library News**



Our Green Team teachers even got involved!!!!











## Grow Your Mind Character Strengths


In 'Grow Your Mind' lessons, Year 6 has been





exploring how the parts of our brain need to work together to promote good mental health. We have been learning about character strengths through the




