Winterton on Sea Parish Council

Nine residents were welcomed to the Parish Council meeting which took place on Thursday 17th November 2011 in the Village Hall.

1. Public discussion:

- A resident expressed concern that a fence had been erected down the bridleway leading from Kings Street to residential properties and asked if a planning application had been received since it would appear that part of the fence exceeded the limit over which planning consent would be required. In addition, a solid gate had been erected which blocked off the bridleway and it was noted that this now made the bridleway extremely dark, especially for elderly residents who needed to use it to access Kings Street. Clerk to investigate.
- A resident reported that there were 3 very aggressive bull seals on the beach between Bush Road and Hemsby which were attacking dogs. A warning would be put in the Newsletter and other residents would be warned by word of mouth where possible.

2. To Receive a report from Borough/County Councillors

• Cllr Weymouth reported that GYBC would dig out Bulmer Pit in the near future and the vegetation would be left on the side. Clerk to inform In Bloom.

3. To consider planning Applications and review planning permissions:

Applications:

• **06/11/0641/F**. Proposed alteration, extension and roof conversion of existing detached bungalow. Red Cliff, Bush Road, Winterton. 2nd application (previous Application **No 06/11/0317/F**). Unanimously rejected for the following reasons: loss of privacy and light to neighbouring properties; over-development of site; not in keeping with existing dwellings and character of area; does not comply with Planning Policy HOU18. It was noted that 5 letters of objection from neighbours had been received.

- 06/11/0542/O. Construction of detached three bedroom dwelling. Bush Road. GYBC Approved.
- **06/11/0598/F**. One and two storey extension and conversion of existing bungalow to create a family eco house. Pebble Lodge, The Craft. **Application Withdrawn**
- 06/11/0616/F. Extension to North Elevation. 4J Bungalow, Low Road. GYBC Approved.

The Parish Church of Holy Trinity & All Saints, Winterton-on-Sea
