#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTES**

Shortly after World War I, theatre entered the Age of Isms. Motivated by the atrocities of war, for the first time multiple styles of theatre began competing for audiences. Alongside Realism, theatre introduced Expressionism, Dadaism, Symbolism, Existentialism, Surrealism and scores of other "isms." This in turn prompted the little theatre movement, in which cities and towns across America built community theatres to present more avant-garde works meant for artists and poets and scholars. One of the most prominent isms during this era was Absurdism.

Absurdism examines the question: why do people spend their entire lives trying to figure out why they exist—what their purpose is—even though they will never know for sure? Absurdist playwrights toy with this question by having random things occur in their plays. A clock strikes 14. An elderly couple live in garbage cans. A man changes into a rhinoceros.

Craig Lucas' *Reckless* is a dark, absurdist comedy. In it, Rachel struggles to find her purpose and identity after being cast out into a strange and surprising world. Her quest to find meaning among chaos and to stay positive in a time of crisis is what drives the play. It is also what resonated with us strongly enought to include it in our 2021-2022 season.

During this pandemic, seemingly everything has felt as shaken up as a snow globe. We find ourselves asking: am I happy in my job? Am I the person I want to be? Am I with the person I want to be with? Am I happy?

The theme of *Reckless* and the basic tenet of Absurdism is: things just happen. We can't always identify our purpose in life, and we can't always get the big questions answered, but we can find a community of other humans who will help us feel less alone on our journey.

It is my sincerest hope that tonight that we can be that community for you and that, perhaps, you might feel a little less alone.
