THE Grand Jury of the County of Meath, fully convinced of the benefit likely to result to the County, from an observance of the following Rules, (wherever circumstances may permit,) do earnestly recommend them to the attention and observation of the Landholders thereof.

ORDERED,

THAT all Affidavits, as well for Presenting as Accounting, be, so far as they can be procured, printed.

THAT to each Presenting Affidavit be annexed a certificate, signed by the Conservator or principal Overseer, stating that the work is necessary; and also a certificate, signed by the Acting Overseer, stating the rates of wages at which he has made his estimate. That each Car shall draw at least six hundred weight of gravel, and also that he has estimated the damages likely to be occasioned by taking gravel, and the distance at which it is situated from the centre of the perches to be repaired.

THAT on all roads to be repaired, the stones be broken small before the gravel is laid on; and that to each Accounting Affidavit be annexed a certificate, signed by the Conservator or principal Overseer, stating that the work is well executed.

THAT it is adviseable to postpone, until the Map of the County now executing by Mr. WM. LARKIN, be completed, the opening of any new line of road in this County, except in continuation of any road already in part opened in this or any adjoining County, or where circumstances of the clearest public utility shall appear to render a speedier formation of any such new road manifestly desirable.

ORDERED,

THAT *Edward E. Chambers Esq.* be directed to attend as our Solicitor, on behalf of the County upon the trial of all traversers for damages, that he shall employ counsel in such cases, when he shall think the assistance of counsel necessary, and use every professional exertion to prevent excessive damages from being found and charged upon this County, and to apprise the Grand Jury of each of such cases.

ORDERED,

THAT *Allan Mc. Lane*, late Secretary, be and is hereby dismissed from his office, as Secretary of the Grand Jury of the County of Meath.

ORDERED,

THAT *James Allen* be and is hereby appointed Secretary to the Grand Jury of the County Meath, and to commence to act as such, from and immediately after this present Assizes.

ORDERED,

THAT *John Pratt Winter*, High Sheriff of the County of Meath, *James Nangle*, *John Pollock*, and *Robert S. Tighe*, be and they are hereby appointed a Committee, to inspect the state of the County-Records,

in the hands of *Allan Mc. Lane*, (late Secretary,) and to give such directions as may to them appear best calculated to insure their preservation and proper arrangement.

ORDERED,

THAT *James Nangle* and *George Bomford*, be and are hereby appointed to inspect the present state of the County Court-house, and report accordingly.

ORDERED,

THAT it be an instruction to the Committee, appointed by the order of the Grand Jury, at this Summer Assizes, for examining into the state of the County-Records, in the hands of *Allan Mc. Lane*, (late Secretary of the Grand Jury,) to direct *Mr. Chambers*, our Solicitor, to take such steps as may appear to be necessary for the security or recovery of the public money, in consequence of the difficulties resulting from the misconduct of the late Secretary.

THAT *Christopher A. Nicholson* be added to said Committee.

THAT the Clerk of the Crown, or his deputy, do in future take charge of all Presentments and Quere Books, as directed by Act of Parliament.
