The HSA Mental Health Service provides community based coverage to all five districts on Grand Cayman and the Sister Islands. It comprises eight acute inpatient beds available at the Health Services Authority, Grand Cayman, and a Day Hospital program with a current capacity of ten patients weekly and District Clinics. This post is for direct management of the child and adolescent outpatient clinics with supplemental adult clinics schedule permitting, prison clinics monthly with on-call participation units.

Primary Responsibilities: The post-holder provides psychiatric expertise and leadership through high quality assessments, diagnoses, treatment planning and the reviewing of Psychiatric services. The successful candidate will also work with other health professionals to produce a comprehensive multi-disciplinary team approach to service users, care and treatment planning.

Qualifications & Experience: The successful candidate should possess a primary medical qualification with a minimum of four years training in Psychiatry as well as a recognized post-graduate qualification, e.g. MRCPsych, MD, Board Certificate or equivalent. The successful candidate must also be eligible to obtain specialist registration with the Cayman Islands Medical & Dental Council.

A remuneration and benefit package, commensurate with experience and qualifications will be offered to the successful candidates of these posts.

Background Information

The Cayman Islands Health Services Authority ("HSA") provides and administers health care services and public health functions for residents of the Cayman Islands in accordance with the National Strategic Plan for Health.

Services are delivered primarily through the 124-beds at the Cayman Islands Hospital (the country's principal health care facility), and the 18-beds at the Faith Hospital on Cayman Brac. Ancillary services are offered at district health centres, and clinics for dental and ophthalmologic care. Residents of Little Cayman can access care through the island's clinic which is a purpose-built facility.

Job purpose

To provide psychiatric expertise and leadership to the Cayman Islands Government Health Service.

To provide high quality assessments, diagnoses, treatment planning and review in the care of service users.

To work with other health professionals to provide a comprehensive multi-disciplinary team approach to service users care and treatment planning.

Dimensions

The principal specialities are provided by the Health Services Authority to the 65,000 population of the Cayman Islands. Half of the population are expatriates working in either the government or private sector. They do not present much in terms of long term psychiatric morbidity.

The Cayman Islands Hospital has all modern diagnostic facilities including full laboratory facilities and a Radiology Department with spiral CT and Doppler facilities. An MRI service is available on the island. We also carry most of the modern medications used in Psychiatry.

There is a well-established inpatient, outpatient psychiatry service and a day hospital program.

There is also a developing psychiatry forensic service and extensive psychology and counselling services available on island.

Duties and responsibilities

To provide a 24 hour psychiatric service in conjunction with the other clinical colleagues.

To provide regular clinical monitoring of psychiatric inpatients and day hospital patients and ward rounds.

To provide for the involuntary detention of patients under the Mental Health Law.

To provide forensic psychiatric services to the Government Prison Service.

To provide psychiatric support to Caribbean Haven, a non-health service 14 bedded drug and alcohol dependency facility, with regard to medical detox.

To run an out-patient clinic at Faith Hospital (on our sister island Cayman Brac) as needed.

To develop, along with colleagues in the Cayman Islands Hospital, evidence-based guidelines and care pathways relevant to the mental health service.

To develop multidisciplinary team working within the service.

To develop and promote multidisciplinary educational and continuous profession development activities within the service.

To take part in continuing professional development, clinical audit and quality monitoring.

To participate in strategic healthcare planning of the psychiatric services. The post holder will be a member of the Pharmacy and Therapeutics Committee.

To liaise with other statutory and non-statutory agencies to develop mental health promotion strategies.

Provide psychiatry service to Faith Hospital on a monthly basis.

Qualifications, Experience & Skills Requirement

Must have a primary medical qualification with a recognised post-graduate qualification e.g., MRCPsych, MD, Board Certificate or equivalent. Must have a minimum of three (3) years postgraduate qualification experience in the related field.

Must be eligible to acquire registration to practice in the Cayman Islands. Must have current license in one of the seven recognized jurisdictions: New Zealand, South Africa, Australia, USA, Canada, Jamaica, UK.
