The family selected to receive this new home is the Dominguez family, which consists of Irma Dominguez and her 2 grandchildren, ages 7 and 9. Said Mrs. Dominguez, "I am so grateful to VTX1 and Habitat for Humanity for the opportunity to live in a brand-new home so that I can raise my grandkids in a safe and healthy environment. They're very happy and excited, and we can't wait to move in."

"This project highlights the true spirit of our employees and our corporate mission to serve those around us. time, John Bradford (now retired from VTX1), was known to us as he grew up locally; that always helps with the trust factor. Before VTX1 'came to town', fiber optic was only a dream.

So, to answer your question, the strong interest and investment VTX1 has in Live Oak County and our South Texas region was the basis for our selection of VTX1 services. I felt, and have not been wrong, that they are a solid, user-friendly company providing a service to our area we must have. I also like the fact that I can pick up the phone and talk to a live person about any problem I may have; in todays automated world, that is a luxury. Having a VTX1 office in George West is a big positive for our area."

How have VTX1 services benefited your area and the county as a whole? "VTX1 has allowed us to be competitive with the rest of the world with fiber optic services. VTX1 has allowed Live Oak County to advance to the next level in providing security for our employees as well as the public. VTX1 video security, emergency notification and other devices have brought our courthouse security to a manageable level. And importantly, our security plan with VTX1 was presented in a common sense, well-planned presentation. Even the installation of VTX1 security devices was accomplished without disruption; not always easy in a courthouse that is 99 years old. Any questions about our security system have been answered with a phone call.





Reasons Your Internet is Slow (AND HOW TO SPEED IT UP)



Is your internet connection sluggish?

Following are a few of the most common speed-slowing culprits -- and how to handle them.

Outdated devices

Is your connection slow – or are your devices? Try running a speed test which measures your upload and download speeds. This process can help you narrow down the sources of slowing speeds. Computers need to be connected via ethernet cable during this test to rule out any Wi-Fi glitches that may be contributing to the issue. To determine the rate of speed you need for the number of users and online activities you have, call VTX1 Customer Service at 1-800-446-2031.

As a rule, laptops will be more powerful than tablets, which will be more powerful than smartphones. However, specific configurations by device type will vary based on make, model, and age of the devices.

Multiple applications

As more and more applications have moved to the cloud, the amount of bandwidth required has also increased. Check devices to make sure all applications currently running are necessary, and close those that don't need to continue running in the background.

Blocked Wi-Fi signals

Obstructions between the Wi-Fi router and the connected

device will deteriorate the signal; a clear path will provide the best performance. Have your Wi-Fi-enabled Internet modem or standalone Wi-Fi router installed as close to the middle of your home as possible, or centrally located within the space where you will use Wi-Fi most often. The router should be in an open location, and oriented in the appropriate position so that the antenna has maximum effectiveness. A Wi-Fi (or range) extender, a device that extends the existing signal, may also be a simple fix.

Browser add-ons

Your browser could have add-ons and plug-in features that are consuming bandwidth. It might also have security features that scan pages for safety before loading. To disable unnecessary add-ons, go to the Tools menu and click "Manage add-ons."

If you go through the process of disabling add-ons and you are still browsing at a snail's pace, your browser may be corrupted. Install an upgrade to the latest version to ensure your devices are browsing at the maximum speed.

Bandwidth boost

If you implement all these tips and your Internet speed is still sluggish, consider upgrading your Internet service plan. In addition to providing robust, reliable connections, VTX1 also offers the latest modem and router as well as 24/7 support. Call VTX1 today at 1-800-446-2031.



Paycheck Checkup Can Prevent a Tax-Time Surprise

It's important to check your federal income tax withholding now to avoid an unexpected tax bill or penalty at tax time. The IRS Withholding Calculator can help.

Everyone should check their withholding. Due to tax law changes, it's especially important to check now if you:

- · Are a two-income family
- · Have two or more jobs at the same time
- · Work a seasonal job or only work part of the year
- · Claim credits like the child tax credit
- · Have dependents age 17 or older
- · Itemized your deductions on your 2017 return
- Have high income or a complex tax return
- Had a large tax refund or tax bill for 2017

Use the IRS Withholding Calculator to do a Paycheck Checkup

- The IRS Withholding Calculator helps figure out if you should submit a new Form W-4 to your employer.
- Have your most recent pay stub and federal tax return on hand.
- The calculator's results are only as accurate as the information you enter.
