What with car accident, broken leg, you all have been most understanding with my schedule and "sick time". I've asked for a better year in 2010 so with a great attitude of gratitude, here we go.

There were some awesome things that happened in 2009—a second Sharing of Service (SOS) held in Arroyo Grande, Southern California Alateen Conference (SCAC) where there were great speakers and meetings, HOT TOPICS were an exciting addition to our Assembly agenda, and I sensed a new enthusiasm in our membership of representatives of over 1000 groups in Southern California. Hopefully you feel like I do: that we are doing something relevant with lots of other good news to share.

Thank you for allowing me to attend Pacific Regional Alcoholics Anonymous Service Assembly (PRAASA) in Oakland, the Southwest Regional Delegates Meeting (SWRDM) in Grand Junction, CO, SCAC and, of course, the World Service Conference. I visited several districts and intergroups to share information about the Conference, and service. (Please keep inviting me; I want to visit every district).

This year's World Service Conference will be held in Virginia Beach, VA.

The conference dates are April 11 – 16, 2010 at the Wyndham Virginia Beach Oceanfront Hotel

The conference theme is :  
"Celebrate! Embrace the group conscience to expand our circle of hope. – 50 years of the World Service Conference.

Agenda: There is a full agenda for this year's conference. All delegates had an opportunity to submit suggestions for additional "Chosen Agenda Items" and the two which were selected were

"How can the members of the World Service Conference develop an effective strategy that would bring Al-Anon Family Groups into communities and cultures of specific minorities in the U.S. and Canada? If we are effective in reaching minority communities, what actions must we take as a fellowship to ensure that they remain as active members?" AND "Can we find effective and practical ways to make it easier for non-English speaking members to participate in Al-Anon service at the Area level and beyond?" *I would love you to share your thoughts about these 2 topics with me so I can participate in these discussions.*

Committee Assignment: I asked to be a part of the Thought Force to Support Areas in Dealing with Groups Whose Activities Fail to Consider Al-Anon or Alateen as a Whole" because, unfortunately, we continue to have meetings in our Area that fall into this category.

Policy Changes will be discussed and voted upon during the Conference. One in particular addresses setting up a separate Alateen policy for the Service Manual. This would include Area events, conferences, conventions, district functions, etc. and their adherence to the Group Conscience Safety and Behavior Requirements.

Property: Next year, 2011, marks the end of the 15-year trial period for owning property. I am providing a hand out of the history of the issue so you will be aware of what we will be talking about. This year the conversation will start and a vote will be taken at the 2011 Conference to 1-End the trial period and keep the building, 2-End the trial period and sell the building, or 3-Extend the trial period. World Service continues to be excited about the TV movie "When Love Is Not Enough" which will be broadcast on Sunday evening, April 25 on CBS. Tim P., our Public Information Coordinator for SCWS has been working very hard to provide information to our area from WSO for the movie.

The Forum Subscription is still a challenge for our Area. Remember the prize for the district with the most Forum subscriptions ~ The SCWS Board will come to your District Meeting and perform a skit! We were informed at SWRDM that worldwide the Forum Subscription is up 11% because of the push from the WS Conference last year.

I am a member of a Yahoo Group for the Area Chairman from all over the United States. This Yahoo Group has been so informative and useful for me. Recently, the question was asked about Action Committees and how they are doing in each of our Areas. I replied that our Area no longer was using the Action Committees rather we were using HOT TOPICS at our Assemblies. The excitement that this created was unbelievable! The second presentation was Southern California and I spoke about the enthusiasm and energy created in our Area because of the HOT TOPICS and why they are working for this area. The third presentation was from the area of Colorado and why the Action Committees were working for them. This call was an avenue to exchange information, share experience and learn different approaches. What a valuable tool!

In 2009, with the help of a steering committee and guidance from the Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual, suggested brief and concise job descriptions were established for DR, GRs, and board members. Additionally, in 2009, with the help of another steering committee, a website with an email account was created to provide another link of service to the groups and members served by District 40. In 2009, District 40 also created three board positions: 1) A Website Coordinator who is responsible for updating the district's website; 2) a Calendar Coordinator with a standing committee that creates and coordinates the sales of a yearly calendar where the proceeds are donated to the Al-Anon Inland Empire Service Center; and 3) a Fundraiser Liaison Committee of four members who serve as designated contacts and coordinates with each planning committee the district's annual fundraisers.

Each year since 1997 District 40 hosts a fund raising event in the fall to benefit the Al-Anon Inland Empire Service Center through an Alathon. Additionally, each year since 1998, the district hosts a Spring Fling in order to raise funds to help carry the message. Through the years, funds raised through the Spring Fling as well as group and individual donations have made it possible for Public Outreach to do mass mailing of information and pamphlets to professional community, and public institutions; provided free copies of the *Forum* to group meetings, individual members, professional community, and public institutions; and provided informational panels to professional community and public institutions.

District 40 looks forward to continued service to the Al-Anon community in the coming year - one day at a time.

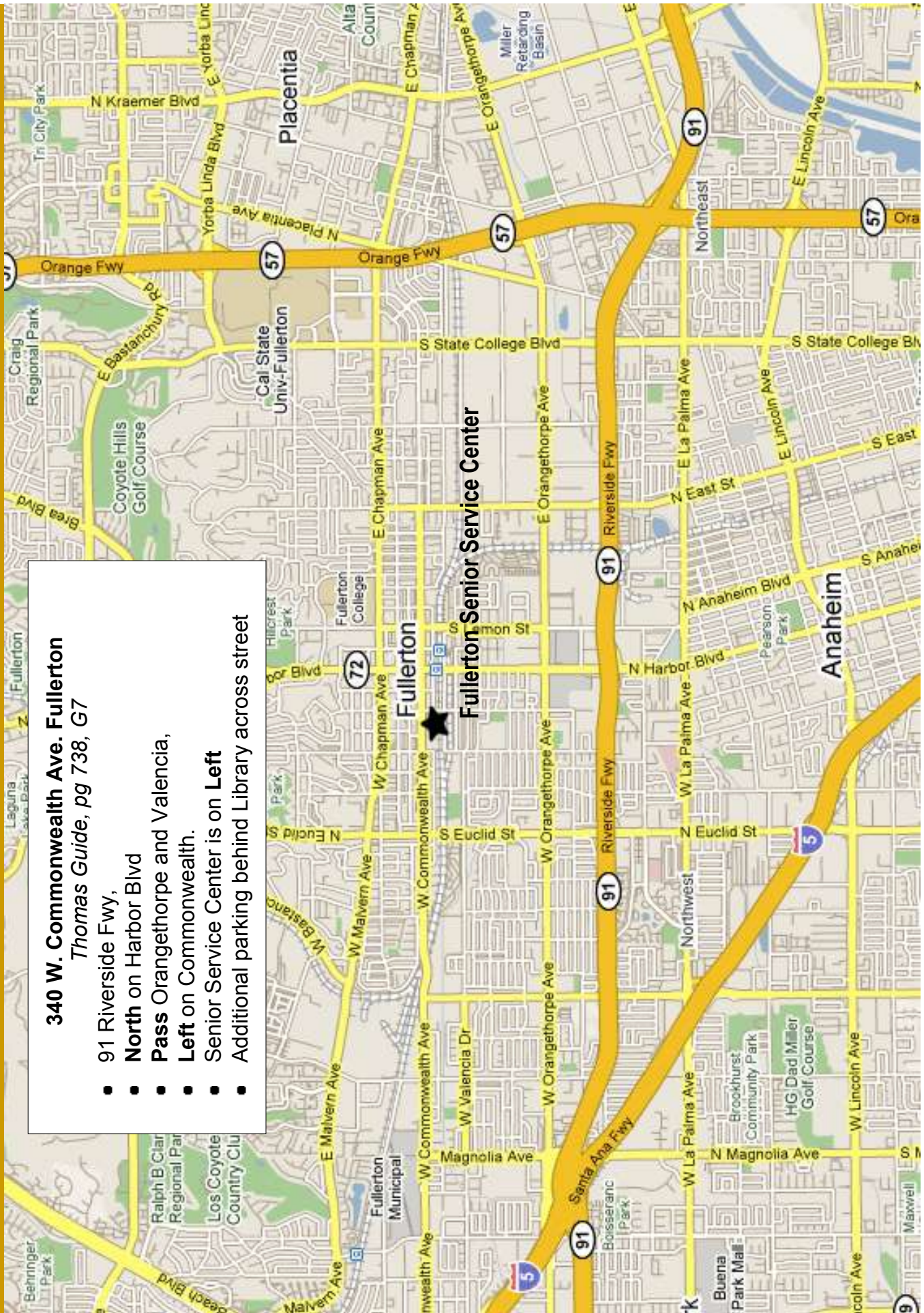
