Although I tell my parents I am a computer security expert. That way they don't **freak out** and it sounds much nicer than „hacker“. So can you guess what I'm paid a lot of money to do?



Exactly. I am hired to break into organizations' systems and networks and tell them how they can improve their safety before **ill willed** hackers do.



Everything I do is to make sure that an organization's information system is **safe and sound.**

My job is very interesting and challenging. I focus on attacking software and computer systems. I search all the **nooks and crannies** to find defects and issues.

I'm usually emailing staff to ask for passwords, **rummaging through** files, and well, **breaking and entering.**

Sometimes my job can be a little bit tricky because most of the time, only the CEOs, owners and boardmembers know what I am doing.



My bosses usually ask me to replicate some destructive techniques that a real attack would entail. I set up cloned test systems and organize a hack when it's pitch dark- late at night, and the systems are less critical.

My job is very **secretive** and often times requires immediate actions. It all depends on the condition of the security systems. We have to act fast when the systems aren't **up to standards**. So it's not a **first come first serve** basis, but depends on which system is most critical.



I love my job, the idea of **exploiting** a system's vulnerabilities and trying to **gain entry** into secured areas is like a puzzle and it's my definition of fun. Would you **fancy** doing what I do?

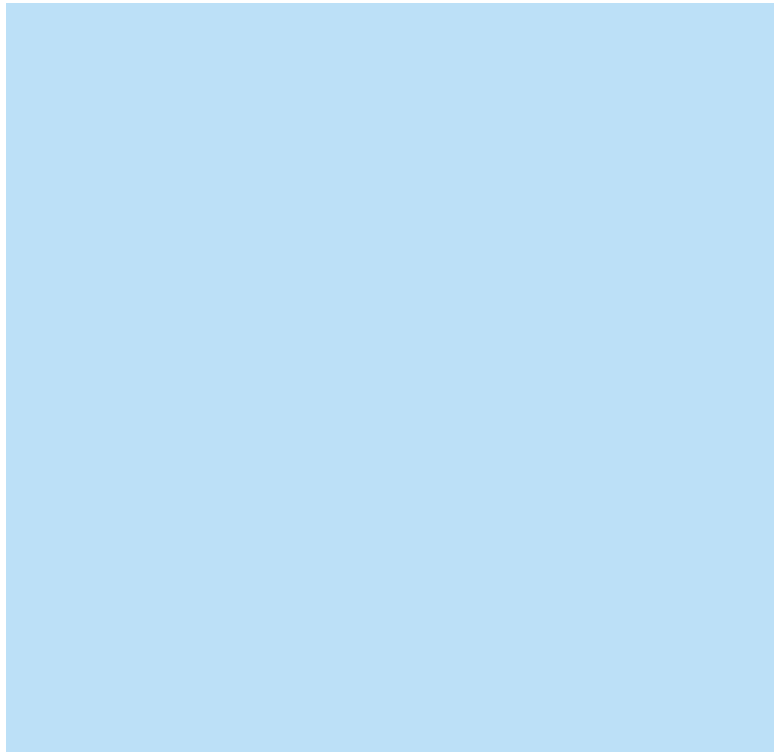
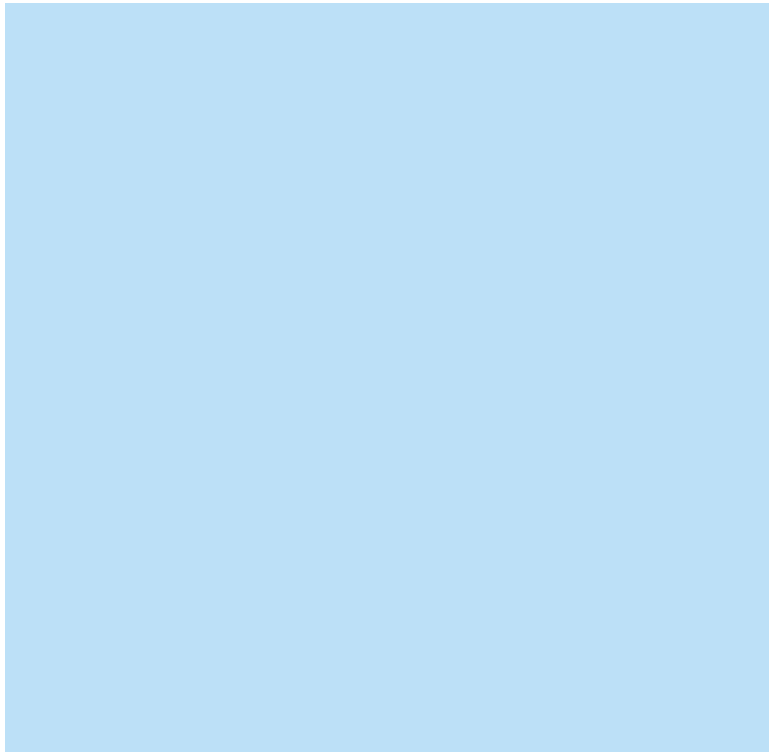
