



SYNOPSIS

Malcolm and Teresa is set in two time periods: the early 30's and the late 60's. Time changes in the play are denoted by dialogue, clothing and Bing Crosby songs of the era.



In 1932 Malcolm Muggeridge was posted to Moscow as a correspondent for the Manchester

Guardian. He went there by choice since he was a strong admirer of the Soviet Government. He was also an agnostic. Hearing reports of a famine in the Ukraine, Muggeridge decided to investigate. He filed reports via diplomatic pouch on what he witnessed. He was one of the first western reporters to do so. However, the investigation had consequences for Muggeridge. One of those consequences was ostracizaion by

his peers, an ostracization that had a profound effect on his character. In the 1960's Muggeridge



achieved considerable fame as an interviewer for the BBC. He interviewed some of the giants of his era. Despite the fame, there was a struggle within. By his own admission, he had "lost his way." One night he agreed to interview (reluctantly) a little known nun. Her name was Mother Teresa.

About the Playwright

Playwright **Cathal Gallagher** was born in County Donegal, Ireland. *Malcolm and Teresa* is his tenth major drama. Productions of his previous works include for Quo Vadis: *Claude Newman, A Question of Ethics, I Heard the Bell Toll,* (also produced by Boston's Fiat Productions, Ltd) *Plunkett, A Fiddler in Granby Lane,* and *The Pearl of York.* Short plays include *Arrival at Heathrow.* For the Mostly Irish Theatre Company: *A Woman For The Country* and *Anything to Declare,* the latter being staged at the Listowel Writers Week in County Kerry, Ireland,. His plays have been produced in Ireland, Canada, and the U.S. Mr. Gallagher is a founding member of Quo Vadis and currently serves as treasurer. He also co-wrote *Viva Cristo Rey!* with *Hidden Axis of Evil* author, Fred Martinez.


