Zero Waste of Resources

King County is working toward a goal of Zero Waste by 2030, meaning that materials of value, whether for reuse, resale, or recycling, will not be put in the garbage and end up in the landfill.

This does not mean that there will not be any garbage. Studies done at the Cedar Hills Regional Landfill (where our garbage goes) show that 75% of the "stuff" we throw away each year could be recycled, composted, or reused.

How can you help?

RECYCLING



Place only clean, dry, and loose items (as listed below) in your **blue** recycling cart. Collected every other week.

Metal

ALUMINUM & TIN CANS

Place tin lids (3" or larger) in can, crimp shut. SCRAP METAL

Small, non-working metal appliances, pots, tools, etc. Limit 2' x 2' x 2', 35lbs; no wood, plastic, or rubber attachments; no sharp metal.

Glass

JARS & BOTTLES (ALL COLORS ACCEPTED)

Only bottles and jars—no other types or shapes of glass are allowed.

Paper and Cardboard

CLEAN & DRY

Clean and dry paper and cardboard. Paper cartons are no longer accepted in the recycling. Corrugated cardboard no larger than 3'x3' in size, larger boxes cut down to size.

Plastic

BOTTLES, JUGS & TUBS

Only recycle these "shapes" of plastic containers—do not worry about the recycling symbol or number.

Cooking Oil Recycling Collection

COOLED, USED FRYER OR COOKING OIL

• Les Gove Park (collection box)

910 9th St SE (south of the water spray park)

Bring your cooled, used fryer or cooking oil in a container that pours easily. Pour oil into the collection tank marked "Mahoney Environmental". *PLEASE take your container home with you.*

Open during daylight hours, 7 days a week. For more information call 253-931-3038, option #2.

No plastic bags, garbage bags or "recycling" bags allowed.

Paper cartons are no longer able to be recycled, so they have been removed from the recycle list.

Empty and rinse out all food residue Labels do not need to be removed.

Extra recycling is free! Keep extra recyclables dry in a covered container or cardboard box, labeled "Recycling", at the curb next to your recycling cart.

Ignore the number on plastics Look at the SHAPE. Recycle plastic only if it is a bottle, jug or tub.

Your materials are being recycled! All the recyclable items collected will be made into something new.

New! Recycling All Stars— Win a month of free service!

Has your recycling container been tagged for contamination? WM will award a free month of service to 5 households per year that demonstrate improved recycling by keeping materials clean, loose, and only recycling items accepted in Auburn's program.

Gather food scraps

Extra Yard Waste



(collected for a charge)

If you often generate extra yard waste, additional yard waste carts are offered at a discounted rate. For occasional extra yard waste, place next to yard+food waste cart in any of the following:

- Heavy brown paper yard bags (available at hardware stores)
- 32-gallon cans labeled
 "Yard Waste" (65 lb. limit)
- Bundles tied with natural twine (4'x2' limit)

GARBAGE TIPS



Numbers do not matter. If a plastic item is not a bottle, jug or tub, it belongs in the garbage.

Cartons are no longer recyclable and should be placed in the garbage.

Double bag pet waste, vacuum dust, sawdust and cold ashes.

DO NOT put liquids, yard waste, hazardous waste or recycling in the garbage.



Latex Paint Cans may be placed in the garbage if paint is solidified. To solidify,



mix in cat litter, shredded paper, sawdust, or paint hardener. Once paint is dry, leave the lid off the can and place in your garbage. Alternatively, PaintCare[™] can recycle your paint. For more info, visit: **paintcare.org/states/** washington

Extra Garbage

(collected for a charge)

If you often generate extra garbage, consider increasing to the next size garbage cart. For occasional extra garbage, place next to garbage cart in any of the following:

- Securely tied plastic bags
- 32-gal cans with handles and lid (65lb limit)

On-Call Bulky Item Collection

All residential customers now receive a free annual pickup of four items.

Acceptable Bulky Items

Appliances: Refrigerator and freezer, stove, cook top or hood range, clothes washer, clothes dryer, hot water heater, dishwasher, trash compactor, window or floor air conditioner, dehumidifier, water cooler, small furnace.

Furniture: Sofa couch (no sleeper sofas), sectional sofa, love seat, futon, recliners, lounge chair, ottoman, mattress and box spring, bed frame and rails, dresser, bookcase, desk, end table or nightstand set, coffee table, dining table and chairs, small entertainment center, filing cabinet.

Power Yard Equipment: Remove all oil, fuels or batteries. Electric, motorized or non-motorized: Trimmer, weed whacker, lawn mower, table saw, chop saw, generator, snow blower, power washer.

Exercise and Recreation Equipment: Treadmill, circuit trainer, rowing machine, exercise bike, elliptical, bicycle, basketball hoop and base, metal swing set.

Miscellaneous: BBQ's, small rug, hot tub cover, small ladder, large plastic play toy and outdoor kiddie pool, wheelbarrow, microwave, small outdoor (pop-up) canopies, vacuum cleaner, child car seat or stroller, artificial Christmas Tree.

- Order construction/demolition waste containers (for remodeling clean-up, etc.)
- Request cart roll-out service for people with disabilities
- Find out if an item can go into the recycle or yard+food container
- Mobile Home Park Residents: Contact your property manager to start, stop, or change services, for damaged or missing carts, and for missed collections

Weather Delays

If weather conditions delay collection, up to twice the regular amount of garbage, recycling, and yard waste will be collected at no charge on your next regularly scheduled collection day. Please note that recycling is collected every two weeks.

Credits will not be issued for delays due to inclement weather.

Collection service is provided on all holidays except Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day and New Year's Day.

If your collection day falls on or after these holidays, your scheduled collection will be delayed one day that week. For example, if your regular collection day is Friday, holiday collection will take place on Saturday.

Cart Placement Tips



- Place containers at curb or alley by 7AM.
- 2' apart with lids opening toward street.
- 3' from cars, trees, mailboxes, fences and utility boxes.
- Please remove containers as soon as possible after collection.
- Please move basketball hoops out of the street on collection day.
- Avoid parking on the street in cul-de-sacs on collection day.
