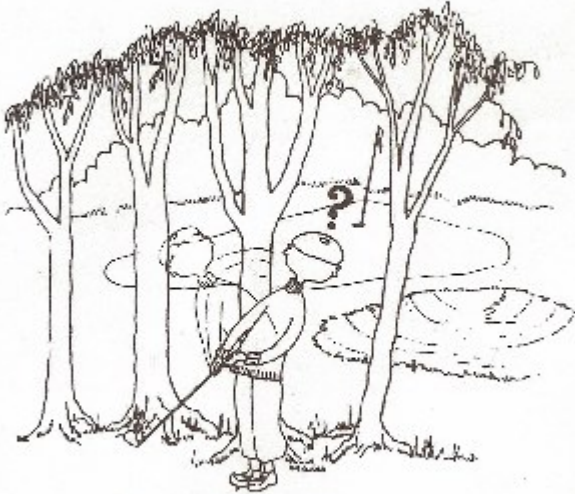

Behaviour

You'll probably hear, from non-golfers, that the game is "a good walk spoiled". The walking is a contributory factor to the overall charm of the game. Nothing quite compares with strolling a well-prepared surface, breathing in the fresh air, soaking up the sights of so many, many lovely trees. All this punctuated by the puzzling challenges of the shot-making.



SO MANY, MANY LOVELY TREES

Avoid tantrums. Club thumping and throwing is an embarrassment to your playing partners and achieves nothing constructive.

Real champions are humble, placid people and accept the bad bounce with a shrug of the shoulders.

We can't all be like those champions, but you will enjoy the game so much more if you get your priorities right.

Try to banish the bad hole from your mind and step LO afresh at the next tee and remember what the pro has told you.

There are so many aspects in this fascinating pastime. Only a basic outline has been covered here.

When there is opportunity to see professional golfers in action go along and absorb through observation some of the rhythm of the golf swing — see and hear the "thunk" as a crisply hit long iron shot homes in on the distant flag.

If that makes you shiver with joy — then you are a golfer.

AVOID TANTRUMS
