
Radisson Nursery School News


Radísson Nursery School Staff is dedicated to providing a safe, loving, and fun environment for children to learn and grow.

From The Executive Director

The Board of Directors held their Annual

Organizational Meeting in July to elect officers for this vear's board and discuss ongoing issues facing the community. The officers of this year's RCA Board are: Bill Lester, President; Tom Dietrich, Vice-President: Tammi Corrente. Treasurer: and Sharon Havford. Secretary. In addition to their roles on the Board, each Director is assigned as the liaison to a Radisson Committee. Thank you to the officers, as well as the remaining Directors: Luanne Christensen, Julian Clark, Nick Offredi and Rav Racha for their continued service to the community.

Even if you haven't played the game of Pickleball, it's likely you have heard of it. Pickleball is a paddle sport that combines elements of badminton, tennis, and ping pong. It seemed to be more popular, initially, among adults who no longer liked the physical demands of playing tennis. Now, this sport is growing in popularity for all ages and skill levels. Many local organizations, including the Northwest Family YMCA and the Town of Lysander, have now converted some of their tennis courts to pickleball courts.

Last year we queried residents to evaluate the level of community interest in adding a Pickleball court as a new Radisson Amenity. Several residents expressed an interest and the Operations Committee has been discussing how to bring this to the community, in the most practical way possible. Building a new court was cost prohibitive and converting one of our three tennis courts (Kerri Hornaday Park, Carpenter Road and Glacier Ridge Road) exclusively to pickleball courts was not something we felt was warranted at this time.

After a lot of research, it was agreed upon that the best option would be to add pickleball lines to the Carpenter Road tennis courts this year, during a previously scheduled painting and sealing project. The two tennis courts at this location will soon have boundary lines painted to accommodate four pickleball courts. During designated times, the Carpenter Road courts will be used for pickleball play only. Tennis players are asked to utilize one of the other courts during these hours. We are tentatively planning on designating one evening and one morning during the week for play. When those days and times have been confirmed. an eMail Bulletin will be sent

out with that information and it will also be in the next Reflections. At the beginning of times reserved for pickleball, RCA staff will put up temporary pickleball nets (lower than tennis nets) and then remove them at the end of the pickleball sessions. These designated hours will be for open pickleball play, for anyone interested. We are not organizing teams or leagues at this time. A standard tennis court key will be needed to access the court and can be purchased at the RCA Office or Oberon Pool by Radisson Members (residents and corporate park employees) for \$5.

Please note that with the end of summer approaching. the Oberon Pool schedule will be adjusted to shortened pool hours, as many of our lifeguards will be leaving to go back to college. However, we are fortunate to have enough staff members to be able to stay open until Labor Day. Effective Monday, August 20th, the hours of Open Swim will be 1:00pm to 7:00pm on Monday Friday. On the weekends. the pool hours will be 10am -Noon (for Adult Swim and/or Parent/Infant Swim) and Open Swim will be from Noon to 7:00pm.

I'd like to take a moment to thank Jake Naples, Summer Rec Program Director, and all of our Summer Rec Counselors for another year of great fun for the kids in the community!! I'd also like to thank Amanda Johnson, Oberon Pool Manager, and the entire Oberon Pool staff for their hard work in keeping patrons safe while enjoying swim lessons, water aerobics and some family 'fun in the sun' this summer! We wish all of our young adult staff members a successful year at school.

was completed as approved, we will send you a letter indicating such and we will close out your open application in our database.

Notifying the ASC will greatly help the ASC staff from trying to determine if you have completed your project or if you would like an extension to complete your project. Each approval is valid for 6 months. If you need an extension, please complete the ASC Project Status Form or e-mail the ASC.
