





A Message from the TOWN CLERK

Canine Commons Dog Park permits MUST be renewed annually after January 1st. Dogs using Canine Commons must have a valid New York State license and a valid dog park permit issued at the Town Clerk's office. Permits are available to Town of Bedford residents for a fee. A limited number of non-resident permits are issued each year. Please call the Town Clerk's office at 914-666-4534 to inquire the status of available non-resident permits.

PLEASE NOTE: The park is checked on a regular basis by the Bedford Police Department and Dog Control Officer. Fines for non-permit holders may be as high as \$250. Permit holders are reminded to display their valid permit in the designated drivers side, side window.

BEAVER DAM PARK HOME OF THE CANINE COMMONS

Beaver Dam Road off of Harris Road Bedford Hills

This park features the Canine Commons Dog Park which officially opened in the Spring of 2008. This 1.5+ acre site features three separate areas that are fully enclosed with fencing. There is a small dog area (under 30 lbs), large dog area (over 30 lbs) and an agility area. Use of the Canine Commons area is open to Town of Bedford residents who are licensed and have a valid dog park permit.

USE OF THE AGILITY ENCLOSURE

The Agility Training is unlocked and open for individual use except during times when Agility classes are being conducted. The "open" time in the agility area is first come first served with one person/dog permitted at a time. This separated area offers an option for permit holders in addition to the very social small and large dog enclosures. Agility use guidelines will be posted on the bulletin board and at the agility enclosure entrance. Use of the equipment is not permitted.



Finally, some hopeful news about reversing climate change, and how you can be part of that solution!

The Yale School of Forestry and Studies this year published an article that states:

"There is enough room in the world's existing parks, forests, and abandoned land to plant 1.2 trillion additional trees, which would have the CO2 storage capacity to cancel out a decade of carbon dioxide emissions, according to a new analysis by ecologist Thomas Crowther and colleagues at ETH Zurich, a Swiss university.

The research, presented at this year's American Association for the Advancement of Science conference in Washington, D.C., argues that planting additional trees is one of the most effective ways to reduce greenhouse gases."

Here are some of the benefits that trees provide us beyond absorbing C02: they clean the air of pollutants, provide oxygen for us to breathe, cool our streams and homes with their shade, conserve energy by reducing our air conditioning needs, save water by reducing evaporation, prevent water pollution by slowing or stopping run-off which carries fertilizers and pesticides into our waterways, prevent soil erosion, provide food to both us and pollinators, and, when grown sustainably, provide us with wood for almost infinite uses.

So besides reducing your carbon footprint, plant a tree on your property (or a number of trees). For a list of native trees appropriate to Bedford contact conservation@bedfordny.gov.

HELP PROTECT OUR CREEKS, LAKES AND RIVERS

What is Stormwater?

Stormwater is rainfall or snowmelt that runs off surfaces such as roads, compacted ground surfaces and rooftops. As the stormwater runoff moves, it can pick up and carry away natural and man-made pollutants such as fertilizer and animal waste. Eventually, the runoff deposits the pollutants into lakes, rivers, wetlands, coastal waters and even our underground sources of drinking water. This is called nonpoint source pollution.

COMMON STORMWATER POLLUTANTS

There are a variety of contaminants that can easily pollute our stormwater. Rain picks up oil and grit left on the roads; sprinklers wash pesticides, fertilizers and weed killers from our gardens and lawns; washing the car carries detergents, oils and grease from the driveway and into our waterways.

MOTOR OIL: Four quarts of motor oil can create an 8-acre oil slick and contaminate a million gallons of drinking water.

ANTIFREEZE: Antifreeze is a toxic pollutant that can kill not only aquatic life but also pets when they drink from contaminated puddles.

PESTICIDES: The use of harmful chemicals on your lawn can be reduced with proper mowing, fertilizing and watering. Apply pesticides only in areas where needed and only in directed amounts.

ANIMAL WASTE: Pet and other animal waste is raw sewage that releases bacteria and oxygen-consuming materials into our waterways. Pet owners should always "scoop the poop"!


SDAPS AND DETERGENTS: Detergents are pollutants that contain phosphorus which contributes to algae blooms. Algae blooms deplete waterways of oxygen and cause fish kills.

YARD DEBRIS: Yard waste (grass clippings and leaves) is a pollutant that releases bacteria, oxygen-consuming materials, phosphorus and nitrogen into our waterways. It also clogs storm drains, which contributes to flooding. If necessary, bag yard waste in clear plastic bags and place curbside on your regular garbage collection day.

Preventing Stormwater Pollution

Pollution is a problem but YOU can be the solution! There are many ways you can help prevent stormwater pollution.


- Don't dump waste, including organic material such as leaves and grass clippings, in storm drains.
- Inspect and maintain your car to prevent oil and antifreeze leaks.
- Use kitty litter to clean up leaks and spills. Never hose spills into the gutter.
- · Buy household and garden products that are environmentally safe.
- . Do not apply lawn or garden products when rain is forecast.
- Avoid over-fertilizing your lawn by testing your soil first to find out how much of which nutrient it needs.
- . "Scoop the poop" by discarding pet waste in the garbage or flushing down the toilet.
- Dispose of household chemicals properly. Take motor oil, antifreeze, oil-based paint, paint thinner, varnishes
 and solvents to a recycling station. See bedford2020.org/recyclopedia for more details.



NEW SEPTIC INSPECTION LAW & NEW REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

To protect the quality of the drinking water for Bedford and New York City, the NYS Department of Environmental Conservation and Westchester County have developed a new Septic Inspection Ordinance.

This law requires that you have a Westchester County licensed service provider pump your tank and inspect your system at least once every five years. The contractor is required to file a "Septic System Data Form" with the County and should give



you a copy. The Town will review the County's information and determine compliance with the new law.

If the County Department of Health has issued you a Notice of Non-Compliance that your system is failing, you should also go to the Town's website or call 666-4434 to find out about Bedford's septic system repair or replacement reimbursement program. You may be eligible for reimbursement up to 50% of the cost of your system's repair or replacement provided you meet certain conditions, including Department of Health approval for the work performed.

Opened and dedicated on July 4, 1920, this charming building was gifted to the Town of Bedford in 2001 by the Bedford Hills Community House Association. Presently, the building is maintained by the Building Department maintenance staff with scheduling of the building performed by the Recreation and Parks Department. Schedule permitting, there are a variety of rooms available for use/rent. You must be a Town of Bedford resident to reserve/rent space in the building. For additional information, insurance requirements, alcohol permit requirements, please contact the Recreation Office at 666-7004. Facility use rental forms may be found online at Bedfordny.gov on the Forms & Applications page in the Recreation Section.

The following rooms are available to rent -

MAIN ROOM

100 -125 PEOPLE

The Main Auditorium is air conditioned and provides a very comfortable setting in the hot months. Tables and chairs are available for use. Use of the Lounge Room and Kitchen is included in the rental fee.

*Rental Fee: \$450 for a 6 hour block of time. (1 hour set up; 4 hour event; 1 hour clean up). Includes an on-site building supervisor. A \$250 refundable security deposit is required. Note: During May through September the rental rate is \$480

LOWER LEVEL LEGION ROOM

50 PEOPLE/MEETING OR 40-45/PARTY

Tables, chairs and use of the kitchen is included in the rental fee.

*Rental Fee: \$60 per hour (1/2 hour or 1 hour blocks of time). A building supervisor is not provided. \$100 refundable security deposit is required.

LOUNGE MEETING ROOM

UP TO 16 PEOPLE

Located on the main floor, the Lounge Meeting Room is air conditioned and features a 35" TV, DVD player.

*Rental Fee: \$40 per hour

BOARD MEETING ROOM

UP TO 16 PEOPLE

Located on the main floor, the Board Meeting Room is air conditioned and features a wall mounted 52" flat screen TV with DVD player. This room connects to sun room for duel room use if desired.

*Rental Fee: \$40 per hour



SUN MEETING ROOM

UP TO 14 PEOPLE

Located on the main floor, the Sun Meeting Room is accessible through exterior side doors or through the Board Room and is air conditioned.

Dogs are *NOT* permitted in any of the playground areas, tennis courts, platform tennis courts, basketball courts or the pool facilities at any time. For safety and for sanitary reasons it is requested that dogs not be walked on any of the athletic fields located in the parks. Town of Bedford residents are encouraged to utilize the designated off leash areas at the Canine Commons Dog Area located at Beaver Dam Park.

Registrations by mail will be processed upon receipt but not before the first date of registration. NON-RESIDENT REGISTRATION

Most activities are offered to non-residents. Please refer to the activity information for eligibility and appropriate fee.

PAYMENT OPTIONS / CREDIT CARD TRANSACTIONS

Payment may be made by cash, money order, check (payable to Town of Bedford) or credit card. Please be advised all credit card or affiliated debit card charges will incur an additional 2.5% fee that is passed onto the user/ card holder. This includes ALL ON-LINE & IN PERSON credit/debit card transactions. This fee is not on your Town of Bedford receipt but will appear on your credit card or bank statement.

REFUNDS

The Town of Bedford refunds under the following conditions:

- Any program cancelled by the Recreation & Parks Department will be given a full refund.
- If the program participant moves from the Town or becomes ill or injured, a full or pro-rated refund will be made based on the number of sessions attended. Proof of relocation/doctor's note must accompany the request.

There is a \$10 processing fee (\$50 for camps) for all refunds approved except for programs that are cancelled by the Recreation Department. All refund requests must be made directly to the Superintendent of Recreation and Parks. Activity/Trip Refund Request form can be found on the Forms and Applications page under Recreation & Parks on the Town's website at BedfordNY.gov. NOTE: Specific activities may have their own refund policy which will be noted in the activity description

RETURNED CHECKS

There is a \$35 fee for any returned checks.

SENIOR CITIZEN DISCOUNTS

The minimum age for a senior citizen for program enrollment discounts* is age 65. This is for all Recreation and Parks Department sponsored programs and does not apply to joining the Bedford Seniors Club; Town of Bedford Refuse Program or Westchester County Park Passes where the age remains at 60.

*Not all programs offer senior discounts and are for Bedford resident seniors only

INSURANCE

The Town of Bedford carries standard liability coverage. This coverage does not include medical costs for anyone injured in the normal course of participation in any Town program. All individuals enrolled in Town of Bedford Recreation & Parks programs do so at their own risk.

SCHOLARSHIPS

No Town of Bedford resident will be denied participation in any recreation program solely because of an inability to pay the prescribed fee. The Town of Bedford & Town Board is committed to providing recreation opportunities to residents of all ages without regard to economic circumstances. Get your E-ZPass kit at the Town Clerk's office -- it's as easy as 1-2-3! The busy traveler can get an E-ZPass tag without waiting on a line or for it to come in the mail. Pay \$25 for the pass, follow the activation instructions (the \$25 pass fee will be applied to your account) and your E-ZPass will be ready for use 24 hours after activation.

PROGRAM CANCELLATIONS

Notification of program cancellations are made via email alerts. If you haven't provided us with an email address please do so upon registering or call us at 666-7004 to make sure we have it on file. Notification will also be made on our hotline number 864-3777. Generally, programs are not held when school is not in session. Postponed classes are made up at the end of the program session if time allows.

HOW TO WATCH A GOOD PROGRAM DIE

Please register early! Nothing kills a recreation program faster than waiting until the last minute to register. All programs require a high level of coordination including facility scheduling, staffing and volunteer recruitment and purchasing of supplies. There is a point when a program must be cancelled or modified if there is insufficient registration.

FIELD AND FACILITY PERMITS

Permits are required for group use of our fields/facilities. You must be a Town of Bedford resident to reserve a field/facility. Applications must be submitted at least two weeks prior to the scheduled activity. Facility Use Application and fee schedule is available on the website at

At the end of May, we said good-bye and happy retirement to Superintendent of Recreation & Parks, Bill Heidepriem. Bill began his 40 year career at the Village of Pleasantville, first as a part-time employee, then full-time. It didn't take long for Bill to become the Superintendent in Pleasantville. After Pleasantville, Bill went on to become the Superintendent for the Town of Lewisboro; where he spent 11 years of his career before coming to Bedford in March of 2001.

Bill made his presence in Bedford quickly known as he systematically made improvements to every hamlet park facility and then some. Bill was instrumental in completing renovation projects for all 3 pool bathhouse facilities, Bedford Village, Bedford Hills and Katonah. Katonah's bathhouse became quite the project as it neared completion it had to be taken down and re-done as it was discovered to be falling off the foundation. Unfortunately, this was not the end to Katonah's misfortune when the new bathhouse burned down in April of 2007. Both times, Bill worked tirelessly with his staff to bring in temporary facilities so that the pool would open on time, which it did! A year later a beautiful new Katonah Pool bathhouse was constructed.

Bill was also instrumental in working with BDOG (Bedford Dog Owners Group) in creating and opening the Canine Commons Dog Park in spring of 2008. Bill has worked closely with many organizations to help improve our hamlet parks including the Katonah Memorial Park Association (renovation of the shelter/fireplace) and Bedford Village Chowder and Marching Club (most recently new basketball courts, playground).

Other notable park improvements include the re-surfacing of all 3 hamlet park tennis courts, the renovation of the Bedford Hills Basketball Courts, the new picnic pavilion at Bedford Hills Park, pond beautification at Bedford Hills Park, and renovation of the paddle courts at Bedford Village and Katonah.

In addition, the Bedford Hills Train Station got a major face lift in April of 2017 – Bill was the "conductor" behind that project and we now have a beautiful multi-purpose meeting room to enjoy. Bill also initiated the process of creating Master Plans for our 3 hamlet parks which are a guide for future projects in our parks. Currently being completed is Phase 1 of the pedestrian path way at Bedford Hills Park.

Bill has always had great vision for the department and the Recreation & Parks profession. His forward thinking was instrumental in creating events such as the Family Campout and Bedford Tri-Festa, and he has also worked tirelessly to add a new part-time senior outreach worker to the department who just started this spring. Bill was also very involved with our professional society, WRAPS (Westchester Recreation and Parks Society). For many years Bill served on the Awards & Scholarship committee. Most recently Bill was co-chair of the Parks section, offering workshops for parks and recreation personnel on topics such as the Virginia Graeme Baker Act; CPO courses (Certified Pool Operator) and a Dog Park seminar.

Bill's professionalism, dedication, commitment, work ethic, and sense of humor will be greatly missed. His will definitely be hard shoes to fill but he has certainly left the department and facilities in good shape. The old saying, "Leave things better than how you found them" can surely be applied ten-fold. It is with much gratitude, appreciation and heartfelt thanks to Bill for all he has done for the Town of Bedford Recreation & Parks Department and its residents.
