Ducky LaRocque and Rodney Phelps; St. John City Council met with the board at this time. Also present was Nathan Gustafson, Sheriff was also present. Discussion on policing for the City of St. John and the ability of the city to for police contract with no mill for policing. City representatives said they have saved money because the council and mayor are not getting paid. Also discussed was contract similar to

Bottineau County and including entire costs associated with policing contract. New police contract will discuss at the next meeting. The board took no action.

July 8, 2019

The board convened at 9:00 A.M. July 8, 2019 with members LaRocque, Albert, Poitra and Moors present. Chairman Boucher presiding.

The commission met in special session to discuss the Preliminary 2020 Budget. The board review and took no action at this time, other than to send back to the departments to provide a reduction of 5% in their respective budgets.

The board recessed until 1:00 PM.

The board convened at 1:00 P.M. July 8, 2019 with members LaRocque, Albert, Poitra and Moors present. Chairman Boucher presiding. The board met at the Rolette County Social Services Office with Chris Jones, Laural Sehn, and several employees, of DHS, Terry Traynor, NDACO Executive Director, Marvin Nelson and Tracy Boe, District 9 Representatives, Vivian Simpson, Social Services Board Member.

The board met in special session to discuss Social Services Redesign and impacts to Rolette County along with options and interest in Rolette County maintaining as an independent zone. Merle Boucher and Dinah Breland stated the case for Rolette County to be its own zone based on the caseload in the county to better serve the residents of the county. After much discussion, Chris Jones, informed the group that he knows the workers in Rolette County are the most efficient in the state, but with an interest in improving outcomes to clients Rolette County needs to join a zone. Joining a zone will only affect administration and will improve outcomes and will provide more access to services not less. The officer would be dedicated to the city unless called elsewhere for an emergency. The cities questioned details of such a contract. After much discussion, the meeting adjourned, and the board took no action.

Motion by Moors, to give employees a 0% raise for 2020. The motion died for lack of a second.

Motion by LaRocque, seconded by Poitra to approve 4% increase for employees for the 2020 budget year. On roll call vote, members LaRocque, Poitra, Albert and Boucher voted "AYE". Member Moors voted "NAY". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Moors, seconded by Albert to approve Agreement for housing inmates with the City of Rolla and Rolette at \$70/day. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

REGULAR MEETING, BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ROLETTE COUNTY

The board convened at 9:00 A.M on September 3, 2019 with members LaRocque, Albert, and Moors present. Member Poitra absent. Chairman Boucher presiding. Brian Grosinger, State's Attorney and Jon Rosinski, Turtle Mountain Star also present.

Nathan Gustafson, Sheriff, Ducky LaRocque and Rodney Phelps, St. John City, and Paul Frydenlund, St. John Public School appeared before the board at this time. Paul Frydenlund stated that the St. John School has been looking for ways to protect the school and after researching options for a School Resource Officer, reached an agreement, in July with Sheriff Gustafson for a School Resource Officer. Mr. Frydenlund stated the school wanted to stay out of the St. John City and County Commission politics and the agreement is that the school will pay \$2000 for resource office paid to the County Sheriff, for approximately 20 hours/week for security, which began September 1st of this year. Questions were raised if this had anything to do the with St. John City contract, and if it affects the Agreement for policing between the City and County. It was the intention of the Sheriff and St. John City to have the hours worked at the school be part of the contracted hours for the City of St. John, and likewise would reduce the cities payments for a full-time officer. After much discussion, motion by Albert, seconded by LaRocque to amend the Police Contract with the City of St. John and Rolette County to include school agreement for resource officer for 20 hours/week of the full-time officer in St. John, and with the School paying \$2000 towards the contract amount and the City paying the remainder on a monthly basis. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

The board then discussed other law enforcement issues with the Sheriff.

Motion by Albert. Seconded by Moors to approve Asset Forfeiture policy on file in the Auditor's Office with State's Attorney, Auditor and Sheriff making up an Asset Forfeiture Committee with authority to grant requests not to exceed \$2500, and requests that exceed that amount will be brought to the County Commission for board approval. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Pat Hemmy appeared before the board at this time regarding Rolette County VFW. Pat explained that he is the acting Commander and would like to have the Rolette County VFW in Rolla, the County Seat, not Belcourt. Pat requested start-up funds of \$1500-\$2000 for caps, uniforms, weapons, and office and meeting space. Mr. Hemmy would like to start a Color Guard for the County VFW. The Rolette County VFW will meet at the Legion Cabin in Rolla for the time being. The board took no action.

The board discussed Home Rule Charter at this time. Motion by Albert, seconded by Moors, to establish a Home Rule Charter Commission which will consist of 7 members, and which would meet and bring back to the County Commission a proposed Home Rule Charter. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Moors, seconded by Albert to appoint Alex Albert, Henry LaRocque and Valerie McCloud to serve on the Home Rule Charter Commission and authorize them to recruit other members to make up the 7 member commission. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by LaRocque, seconded by Albert to approve the Minutes from the July meetings. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

The board then discussed county issues and live streaming of meetings posted on Social Media. Brian Grosinger, State's Attorney stated that the Board can regulate government accounts but it is harder to regulate personal accounts, although they have to comply with any county policies on the issue. The board discussed looking into other options for video of meetings. No action taken.

Eldon Moors gave an update on the Road Committee, there is gravel crushing in place in the Evans and Foss Pits, and employees hauling gravel should be done shortly.

Alex Albert and Merle Boucher, Social Service Committee will be meeting in Devils Lake for Human Service Zone redesign next week.

Eldon Moors and Henry LaRocque gave a report on the Rolette County Housing Board. Ramsey County Housing Authority is taking over administration for now. Discussion on replacement for Emery Mears on the board. The board took no action.

Alex Albert informed the board that the BIA inmates have averaged 10-13/day for the Jail Committee report.

Eldon Moors, Sr. reported for the Building Committee that they would take the fencing down at the old jail when the road crew is available.

Motion by Moors, seconded by LaRocque to accept application and fees from Rolette Country Club for an extension for November and December for the seasonal liquor license. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

On motion and unanimously approved, the board then adjourned to October 15, 2019.

October 15, 2019

The board convened at 9:00 A.M., October 15 2019 with members LaRocque, Moors and Poitra. Member Albert absent. Member Boucher presiding. Alivia Poitra, also present.

The Board met with the Planning Commission for Public Hearing on Amendment to the Rolette County Zoning Resolution for Enforcement changes. Planning Commission members Gerald Krech, Hovi Mitchell, Dick Johnson, Mark Heinz, and Craig Poitra present.

Craig Poitra read the proposed changes relating to Enforcement Section. No one appeared in support of the amendment. Doug Lemieux appeared in opposition to the Rolette Zoning Ordinance amendment, stating that the zoning ordinance needed a complete revamp not just one section so, for that reason was in opposition to the amendment. Doug also recommend that the county have a Central Clearing House for building permits, not just volunteer building inspectors. The Planning Commission discussed the proposed amendment and reasoning for the change. The Applications are all available in the County Auditor's Office, and can be turned back in to office or work directly with the Building Inspectors in the respective areas. The board also discussed farm exemptions for building permits. State's Attorney will investigate if farms are exempted from zoning. Nathan also discussed youth county government information he received at the NDACO conference, to get kids involved in government. Will research further before pursuing. The board also discussed inclement weather policy and who is making the decision to close. Motion by LaRocque, seconded by Poitra to approve \$1/hour increase for Dixie Gladue for backup for Amber, relating to 24/7 and Community Services duties. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

The Sheriff/Jail Committee will meet an review transport vehicle and kitchen staffing and salaries to provide a recommendation to the Commission.

The Building Committee reported that they haven't met yet, will meet to discuss office space. Also the road crew will remove fence and razor wire at the old jail.

Motion by Henry, seconded by Moors, to approve Emergency Declaration for extreme for Snow storm in October leaving approximately 30" of snow, and additional costs and damages from the snow which threatens the well-being and safety of its residents, crops and livestock. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Moors, seconded by Poitra to approve sheriff's overtime in the following amounts \$582.52 for Ann Millerbernd, \$122.76 for Mitchell Slater, \$56.50 for Amber Azure, \$1213.19 for April Azure, \$54.54 for Myles Brunelle, \$56.50 for Gordon Chapman, \$110.74 for Brock Charette, \$237.09 for Ferdinand Charette, \$109.08 for Dixie Gladue, \$56.81 for Ryan Hiatt, and \$108.48 for Wesley Kom. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Moors, seconded by Poitra for approval of Letter of Permission to Access across School Trust Land to remove Beaver Dam in Maryville Township. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Moors, seconded by LaRocque to approve Application for Abatement of taxes for Donna Houle on parcel #2675 for 100% Homestead Credit for 2018 and Wanda Halone on parcel #29745 for 2017 and 2016 homestead Credit. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Poitra, seconded by Moors to approve appraisals of Real Estate for property acquired by Rolette County and set a City Hearing on Appraisals for cities to be held on October 29, 2019. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed the Home Rule Charter Committee and representation. Commissioner Potira requested a representative from the Tribe, since Belcourt is not an incorporated city. Motion by Poitra, to add another person to the Home Rule Charter Committee, who lives within the exterior boundaries of the Turtle Mountain Reservation and is an enrolled member from the Turtle Mountain Tribe. Motion seconded by LaRocque. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

On motion and unanimously approved, the board then adjourned to October 29, 2019.

October 29, 2019

The board convened at 11:00 A.M., October 29, 2019 in special session with members LaRocque, Albert, and Moors. Member Poitra absent. Member Boucher presiding. Rick Adams, North Central RSA 2 for Verizon Wireless. Doug Lemieux also present.

Alex Albert provided an update on the Public Hearing that the Planning Commission held at 10 AM today, regarding Conditional Use Permit for a Communications cell tower in Shell Valley township. The Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of the Conditional Use Permit and Building Permit for the communications tower for Verizon Wireless which will improve capacity in the area due to the casino. Motion by Albert, seconded by approve Conditional Use Permit and Building Permit for the communications tower for Verizon Wireless. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Albert, to grant 1 year from today to construct communication tower, seconded by LaRocque. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

The board then held a public hearing for appraisals of property acquired by Rolette County Motion by Albert to approve reducing Lots 2-4, Block 24, OTS, Dunseith from \$5000 to \$1889; and Lots 19-21-23, Block 33, OTS, Dunseith from \$5000 to \$2349.61 at the request of Dunseith City. Seconded by LaRocque. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Albert, seconded by Moors to approve appraisals for the Rolette County Real Estate sale. On roll call vote, all members voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by LaRocque, to accept the proposal for purchase of Cat motor grader, with trade-in of 2006 143H Cat Motor Grader, seconded by Poitra, with the full cost of the 2019 140M3AWD Cat Motor Grader with snow equipment of \$324,114.65 less trade in \$65,000 for \$259,114.65 applied to financing for five years; and annual payment in the amount of \$57,470.36. Motion carried unanimously.

The board then discussed the Memorial Hall heating replacement for boilers. The cost of the heating system is \$95,502, with ND Department of Commerce grant of 50%, and Ottertail Power rebates, in the amount \$10,944, leaving balance of \$36,807. Commission Boucher will discuss payment with the Rolette City Council, who owes the county \$35,000 for street project, and they may approve to pay that portion of the project and the county to pay the balance. The board took no action.

On motion and unanimously approved, the board then adjourned to December 17, 2019.

December 17, 2019

The board convened at 9:00 A.M., December 17, 2019 members LaRocque, Moors, Albert and Poitra present. Member Boucher presiding. Victoria Poitra videotaping. John Rosinski, Turtle Mountain Star and Brian Grosinger present.

Curt Bonn, 911 Coordinator and Mike Stewart, Emergency Manager along with Rick Gottbreht, Dunseith Fire Chief, Brad Ebensteiner, Rolla Fire Chief, Darren Welander, Rolla Ambulance and Tim Letvin, Rolette Fire Chief also present. The Fire Chiefs relayed concerns they were having reagarding dispatch and protocols not being followed. Fire Chiefs stated that dispatch is not providing common sense directions for calls for service, which hinders response. Responders also requested Sheriff's Office use the ER channel so they could follow traffic and be ready to assist sooner. Sheriff Gustafson expressed frustration because he thought many of the concerns had already been addressed at an emergency responder meeting last month. Curt Bonn, asked the responders to report when there is a problem with dispatch and Mike Stewart would like to see the group work towards a solution. After much discussion, it was suggested that Emergency Responders have regular meetings and have the Sheriff look at protocols for dispatch No further action was taken.

Sheriff Gustafson then discussed the 2019 Dodge Durango, which was totaled in a pursuit several weeks ago. Motion by Albert, seconded by Moors, to proceed with purchase of 2020 Dodge Durango from Nelson Auto to replace totaled Durango, in the amount of \$27,605, with

insurance reimbursement of \$24,168.70 and additional \$3436.30 to be paid from Sheriff's Car Lease line item. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

The board discussed salary increases for staff for change in the Jail Administrator duties possibility split of salaries. Nathan asked the County Commission to match salaries for staff if he split the \$750 for Jail Administrator that Kim Nadaeu was receiving. The board took no action.

Sandy Shively, North Central Planning Council met with the board at this time for 2018 Application for CDBG Grant for Rolette County Rec Center Water and sewer closeout of the project. Also present was Paul Frydenlund, Don Davis and Rusty Cain. The grant was \$100,000 with local match of \$85,908 local match, provided by the Rec Board. Motion by Albert, seconded by Poitra to approve amendment to reduce the grant by \$14,900 for project coming in under budget and closeout forms on the project. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously. The board thank Sandy for the support from North Central Planning Council on the project over the years.

Motion by LaRocque, seconded by Albert to approve Final Performance Report on the CDBG Grant for the County Rec Center Water and sewer closeout. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Moors, seconded by LaRocque to approve County Deed to Damian Dionne for Lots 1, 2 & 3, Block 7, Thorne, Russell Township. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Moors, seconded by LaRocque to approval of Application for Liquor License for Border Lounge, and upon receipt of Application and Fees for Keplin Entertainment and Kelvin Klinic. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Motion by Poitra, seconded by Moors to approve Application for Seasonal Liquor for Rolette Country Club for January-June, 2020. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

The board then discussed approval of Election precincts and polling locations for the upcoming elections in 2020. Auditor McCloud recommended moving the Precinct 3 Polling location from the KC Hall to the Turtle Mountain Schools Event Center in Belcourt, for a more secure location for election equipment, better parking, more adequate room for the volume of voters, and better handicap accessibility and restrooms. The board tabled until December 27th.

Motion by Poitra, seconded by Moors to approve Sheriff's overtime in the following amounts \$123.72 for Chris Bailey, \$649.53 for Andrew Saari, \$311.79 for Amber Azure, \$454.11 for April Azure, \$54.54 for Myles Brunelle, \$54.22 for Gordon Chapman, \$108.48 for Brock Charette, \$55.26 for Ferdinand Charette, \$109.08 for Dixie Gladue, \$54.54 for Ryan Hiatt, \$189.81 for Wesley Kom, \$29.70 for Amber Davis and \$54.54 for Zachary Smith. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Brad Robertson and Kent Indvik, Wold Engineering met with the board at this time. Preliminary Engineering for SC-4006(067) St. John Sliver Widening project south of St. John was discussed. Approach by bulk plants has two 36" CMP presently and would require two 42" CMP to adequately handle water flow in this area. Motion by Albert, seconded by Poitra to approve Chairman Boucher to sign Project Certification Letters as presented for this project. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously.

Brad and Kent will be back in January, 2020 with final plans for the project, which has a cost estimate of \$523,000 with county share 20%. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Albert, seconded by LaRocque to approve invoice for Preliminary Engineering in the amount of \$40,340 to Wold Engineering on Project SC-4006(067) Spur from St. John to ND 30; Phase I. 40,340. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously

Survey and Plat were submitted for board approval for Marleon Point Second Addition to Lake Upsilon. Motion by Moors, seconded by Albert to approve Survey and Plat for Marleon Point Second Addition to Lake Upsilon. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously

Motion by LaRocque, seconded by Albert to approve payment to Home & Electric Solutions, LLC in the amount of \$35,000 for Rolette Memorial Hall-Heating system replacement. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously

Motion by Albert, seconded by LaRocque to approve purchase of Kohler Generator Welder in the amount of \$1,000 from Eldon Moors for the Road Department. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously

Social Service Board update regarding transfer to the Mountain Service Zone effective January 1, 2020. Discussion on Social Service vehicles. Motion by LaRocque, seconded by Poitra to transfer titles of two 2018 Chevrolet Tahoe's and 1 2019 Chevrolet Tahoe to the Mountain-Lake Human Service Zone, which were purchased with Social Service Funds. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously. The commission then discussed other expenditures that would shift from direct to indirect cost at the end of the year. Discussion on how to handle Janitorial/Maintenance contract for Social Service Buildings, and if we should look at an employee for janitorial versus contract labor. No action was taken will discuss at the next meeting.

The board then discussed committee reports from Home Rule Charter, Housing Authority, and Public Health.

Motion by LaRocque, seconded by Moors to re-appoint Kurt Lagerquist to a five year term on the Rolette County Water Resource District Board. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously

Motion by Albert, seconded by Moors to approve applications for Abatement of taxes for Jason Delorme on parcel #26148 for residential structure which was removed and to Carolyn Heller for parcel #29724 for Homestead Credit of 60%, both for 2019 tax year. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously

Motion by Albert, seconded by LaRocque to approve sale of portable chain hoist at the Rolette Shop to Gilbert Handeland,. On roll call vote, commissioners Albert, LaRocque, and Poitra voted "AYE". Commissioners Moors and Boucher voted "NAY". Motion carried

unanimously

Motion by Moors, seconded by Poitra, to approve, payment to Mikkelson Aggregates for invoices for crushing in the Evans Pit and Foss Pit and to landowners for royalties. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously

Motion by Moors, seconded by Poitra to approve minutes from the November meetings, with a correction to the motion for approval of the Human Services Zone agreement. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously

On motion and unanimously approved, the board then adjourned to December 27, 2019.

December 27, 2019

The board convened at 9:00 A.M., in special session December 27, 2019 with members LaRocque, Moors, Albert and Poitra present. Member Boucher presiding. Victoria Poitra videotaping. Jon Rosinski, Turtle Mountain Star also present.

The board reviewed 2019 Budgeted over-expenditures. Sarah Bruce, Recorder appeared before the board with over-expenditures on several line items within her budget.

Marlys Delorme, Precinct 3 Election Inspector met with the board at this time to discuss change in Election polling location for Precinct 3 in Rolette County. The polling location has been at the K.C Hall, for Precinct 3 and research has been done to change it to the Turtle Mountain Event Center. Marlys relayed issues the Election Board has had at the current location, which elections are held in conjunction with the District 2 Tribal elections regarding security, long lines, lack of accessibility to bathrooms and handicap accessibility. Commissioner Poitra voiced concern over the relocation of the polling location, and requested coordination with the tribe for the elections. Mike Day, Turtle Mountain Tribe Election Chairman also was present and discussed the change in polling location with the board. Motion by Albert, seconded by LaRocque to approve pay adjustment of \$125/month for Chief Deputy and Field Deputy, \$100/month for Jamie Metcalfe, Chief Correction Officer for Shift supervisor, and \$50 for Myles Brunelle and Ayannah Charette for shift supervisor, and an additional \$300/month for Sheriff Gustafson for assuming Jail Administrator responsibilities, effective 1/1/2020. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously

The board then discussed road administration duties for 2020 and road supervisor. The board again discussed road supervisor for the upcoming year, along with the possibility of hiring a full-time road supervisor. Chairman Boucher and Auditor McCloud will gather information on job descriptions and budget for road supervisor or road superintendent, in the next month. Motion by Poitra, seconded by Albert to continue with road supervisors Eldon R Moors, Sr, and Henry LaRocque, until the board comes up with proposal a different plan for road supervisor. On roll call vote, all commissioners voted "AYE". Motion carried unanimously

The board then discussed compensation for Road Administration duties in the Auditor's Office. Motion by Albert, seconded by Poitra to amend the Road Administration line item in the Auditor's Budget from \$9,000 to \$10,350, for an increase \$1,350 for 2020. On roll call vote, Commissioners LaRocque, Poitra, Albert and Boucher voted "AYE". Commissioner Moors voted "NAY". Motion carried.

On motion and unanimously approved, the board adjourned until January 7, 2020.
