

STEP ONE: On your Macintosh, open the **Mac Apple Store**. It will be an icon on your dock.





STEP TWO: On your Macintosh, open the **Mac Apple Store**. It will be an icon on your dock In the **Mac Apple Store**, look for the **Search box** on the top right. In the Search box, type in **Microsoft Remote Desktop**. Press Return or Enter





STEP THREE: The first search result will be the application **Microsoft Remote Desktop**. Click the **Free** button, which will convert into a Download button, which you will need to press as well.





STEP FOUR: You may be prompted for your **Apple ID** or your **iCloud** credentials. Type these credentials in the window provided. **Click Sign In** when complete.






STEP FIVE: The application will begin to install on your computer. Once installed, you will be able to locate the Microsoft Remote Desktop icon in your Applications folder or in the Launchpad interface. Click on the red Microsoft Remote Desktop icon to open the application.






STEP SIX: The Microsoft Remote Desktop interface will open. With the interface open, click on the Remote Resources icon on the top of the window.






STEP SEVEN: The Remote Resources window will pop up. Type in the following in each corresponding window:

URL: https://vm-###.cloud9realtime.com (replace ### with your virtual server number)





STEP EIGHT: If all information is type in correct, you will see a message saying Successfully loaded Remote Resources. Click the red X on the top left to close the window.





STEP NINE: Back in the main Microsoft Remote Desktop window, under Remote Resources, you will be able to see several of your application icons. Double-click on the application you wish to launch.





STEP TEN: A Remote Desktop window will pop up, noting the login progress





STEP ELEVEN: Once fully logged, you will see the application pop up on your screen. It may look like it's running on your local computer, but in reality, you're logged in your virtual server.
