The Bibb County Code of Ethics will be applicable to the members of the SPLOST Advisory Committee.

The City of Macon and Bibb County will each appoint three individuals to serve as members of a SPLOST Advisory Committee. The County will appoint the fourth member who will serve as the Chairman.

ANIMAL WELFARE CENTER

In July of 2012, Bibb County assumed the responsibility for the Animal Welfare Center. The current Animal Welfare Center can best be found by following a garbage truck. The



present building is at the entrance to the Landfill. The 32 year old building has cramped rooms and bare concrete floors. Citizens of Bibb County were anxious to see cats and dogs in their county housed in a new and improved environment. It became apparent to the Commissioners that they must build a facility in a better location.

Bibb County has designated ten acres on Fulton Mill Road which the County had transferred to the Macon-Bibb County Industrial Authority and the Authority agreed to deed back to Bibb County for the shelter. Dunwody and Associates Architects in conjunction with Tevis Architects are presently working on the design of the new building. The construction contract has yet to be awarded but construction should begin in early 2013.

Juvenile Justice Center



The Bibb County Courthouse has long housed the Juvenile Court. Bibb County Commissioners acknowledged that a new building was needed for better coordination of courts, probation, rehabilitation/prevention services for juvenile offenders and children of abuse. The new campus will be located at the corner of Second Street and Oglethorpe.

Cooper Carry Architects in conjunction with Brittian Thompson Bray Brown Architects have designed the new building. Warren and Association was awarded the contract for construction. Demolition of the existing buildings will begin the first week in March; construction is set to begin in the Spring of 2013 and the new Center is scheduled to open in late 2014.

Fire Stations

The SPLOST provides for three new fire stations, two in the County and one in the City. These fire stations aren't just needed to provide better fire and first-responder medical services for county residents, but also to prepare for the next Insurance Services Office inspection, which is scheduled for 2013. The ISO provides ratings for municipal and county fire departments to help insurance companies calculate the cost of premiums. While two of the stations will be located in unincorporated Bibb County, ISO inspectors have indicated that they may evaluate Macon and Bibb County as one entity when they return, posing a potential impact to city residents as well. Macon and Bibb County have been evaluated separately in recent years. Macon holds ISO's top rating of 1. Bibb County's rating is a 3/9, meaning that homes and businesses within 1.5 miles of a fire station with an engine company, within 2.5 miles of a station with an aerial company and within 1,000 feet of a fire hydrant are in class 3 zones. All other areas of the county are rated as class 9. Half of the criteria for an ISO rating is derived from the location of fire stations, what types of trucks are based in certain areas, response times, equipment and training, among other factors. Harmon and Associates Construction is presently building Fire Station #109 on New Forsyth Road. It is scheduled to open in the Spring of 2013. Fire Station #110 will be on Heath Road and is scheduled to open in the Winter of 2014. Brittian Thompson Bray Brown were awarded the architectural contract on January 15, 2013.



The \$6 million allocated to address the encroachment issue in South Bibb County is important for many reasons. For years, people had said that Robins Air Force Base was too big to close. The reality was that in the current fiscal environment just about any base could close or lose missions. It became essential for Bibb County to address this concern. The money allocated in the SPLOST is aimed at solving encroachment, a government word for properties in noisy or crash-prone areas close to the military base. The voluntary deals are mostly aimed at properties in south Bibb County east of Ga. 247. It is important to remember that the base generates \$4.27 billion in economic impact within the region. Robins Air Force Base is the largest industrial complex in the State with more than 26,000 people working on the base or supporting it.





One of the purposes of the SPLOST was to open opportunities for more jobs in Bibb County. One way to accomplish this is to bring more employment opportunities to the area.

In June of 2012, Tractor Supply Company, the largest retail farm and ranch store chain in the United States, announced plans to open a regional distribution center in Macon, Ga.

The new 650,000-plus square-foot distribution center, expected to be in operation by the end of 2013, will serve stores in the southeastern United States. The distribution center is expected to employ approximately 315 employees when fully operational and represents a capital investment of more than \$50 million.

After the press announcement, Lt. Governor Casey Cagle, Chairman Cliffard Whitby of the Macon-Bibb County Industrial Authority, Chairman Samuel F. Hart of the Bibb County Board of Commissioners and Tractor Supply executives broke ground for the new facility, which will be located in the I-75 Business Park at 1115 Frank Amerson Jr. Parkway.

"This decision by Tractor Supply Company to bring their Regional Distribution Center to Bibb County is greatly appreciated," said Chairman Hart. "They could have gone other places, but chose this area because of the available facilities, good workforce and the excellent support provided by our extended economic development team, from local to state level. This is another example of how putting your best foot forward pays off in new jobs, new investments and new opportunities for businesses to be successful here."

Bibb County invested \$3 million dollars of SPLOST funds to encourage Tractor Supply to locate in Bibb County.
