





#### My Hero - Lizzie Byron

To me, a hero is someone who goes against the stereotypes, is not convinced that everyone of a certain nationality is a certain way. My here is someone who is strong in mind, but soft at heart. Pa is my hero, he is my great grandfather.

I have heard many stories of Pa from Dad, Nanna and my extended family. They tell me he was a brave man, and that he stood up for what he believed in.

Pa left to fight for Australia in WWII, He left when my Nanna was still in a stroller. When he was fighting he became a Japanese prisoner of war. I do not remember whether he escaped or waited until the war had ended.

When he returned from war back to his home in Chiltern, Victoria, his own daughter didn't recognise him and she thought he was a salesman.

As a lot of Asians were seeking refuge in Australia, because of the growth of factories and poor living conditions, they needed homes. Pa let them into his home, even the Japanese – the ones who had enslaved him!

My Great Uncle, Barrie Cassidy, who is featured on the ABC on Sunday mornings, wrote a biography of Pa, entitled: "Peace in Love and War." It is everything he has been through; the thick and thin.

Therefore, Pa will always be my hero. From letting people into his home and having a biography written on him, Pa is the most heroic person I know.
