ACADEMIC YEAR 2018-19

"Well begun is half done." The academic year began well on May 2nd for classes X and XII for other classes on June 4th, with special assembly and prayers, seeking God's blessing in all our endeavors and motivating the students to "Perceive, Persevere and Be Productive"- the keyword for the year.

Classes for Plus one began late on June 18th as the locality was affected by the heavy rains and contagious diseases like Nippa.

STUDENTS AND STAFF

This year we have more than <u>3500</u> students on roll in Chavara Public School and Kindergarten together. Working incessantly for their welfare, we have 131 professionally competent and dedicated teaching faculty. We also have 51 members as part of the supporting staff. The dedication, commitment, and generosity of the teaching and non-teaching staff are important factors in the incredible growth of the school in the scholastic and co-scholastic areas.

VALUE BASED EDUCATION:

Apart from regular subjects, we at Chavara, impart value-based and life-oriented education, which help students stand the test of time. We have various programmes for this purpose.

1. Moral and Religious Instruction

In addition to the weekly value education class, retreats and spiritual renewal programmes by renowned preachers were conducted for students and teachers.

2. Chavara Social Service League and Outreach Programmes:

- **a.** Chavara Social Service League was started with an aim of serving the needy in our society. The aim was to inculcate in children values such as empathy and social commitment. Every Wednesday, students take a special class wise collection, and the 'My Mite' money thus collected is used for charitable purposes under the project 'We Treasure You'. The money thus collected is distributed to the various charitable institutions
- **b. Relief Camp Visit.** The Principal and staff visited the flood relief camps at the following places and ascertained the urgent requirement of help from the school.

c. Visit to a psychosocial rehabilitation center

Available hostel students from Classes 10,11 ad 12 spent a day in a psycho-social rehabilitation centre at like Maria Sadhanam Pala, Navajeevan Trust, Kottayam, Serenity Home Elikkulam, Pala, Akashaparavakalude Koottukar, Ponkunnam, Vikas Vidyalayam etc and cleaned up the premises and the rooms.

d. Service by staff and parents

School formed a group called 'Chavara Task Force' consisting of teaching and non-teaching staff and parents to clean up the flood-ravaged houses and premises of victims at Marangattupally in conjunction with the respective Local Self Government Bodies.

e. Material Distribution

- Collected more than 2000 lunch packs from students and teachers and distributed them to the flood victims at Alappuzha.
- Collected groceries and clothes and other necessary items from students & staff and distributed to Thiruvarppu Panchayath, Kattappana and Changanassery
- Collected notebooks from the students and distributed to the affected students in Camps.
- Distributed materials like food grains, mats, dress, cleaning materials etc to Thiruvarppu Panchayath, Kottayam
- **f.** As part of UPAVI(Reaching out to the needy)- our Vicennial theme, we conducted a variety of charitable acts to help the flood-affected victims in and around our area.
 - i. The Chavara family collected around 4000 lunch packets on July 24th and distributed them among the flood-affected people.
 - ii. Notebooks, clothes groceries, and food items were collected and distributed
 - iii. A group of students, staff, and parents visited the relief camps and helped them in various ways.
 - iv. A team of staff and parents undertook cleaning tasks at Brahmanalayam
 - v. Money that was donated by students was distributed to different relief work agencies in the area.
- **3. Jesus Youth** The Jesus Youth group of the school is very active. They conduct regular prayer service during lunch breaks and organize outreach programmes.

TRAINING PROGRAMMES FOR STUDENTS:

1. Leadership Training and Personality Development:

Chavara School is committed to groom the leaders of tomorrow, who will champion the cause of humanity. The development of personality and skills, especially leadership skills, has become a necessary factor in today's competitive world. Taking this into consideration, the school offers leadership training camps and personality development workshops, conducted by eminent trainers.

2.English Language Training:

Today, the importance of English cannot be denied nor ignored. In order to help students and teachers improve their standard of English, expert trainers are available on campus throughout the day. Activities like debate, quiz, spelling bee, and many more are used in training the students. The special coaching in anchoring and public speaking develops confidence and fluency of language in children.

3. Skills Training:

a. The class magazine: Apart from promoting the creative and literary skills of the students, the class magazine paves way for improving interpersonal and leadership skills, competitive mind and team spirit among the students.

- **b. Assembly:** The routine assemblies every day and the section-wise assemblies once a week provide a platform for children to improve their public speaking skills and to showcase their talents.
- **c. Theme Based Notice Boards** Each class and house is provided with a notice board, to display their knowledge and skills. Articles on the theme of the week and personalities for the month, as per their school handbook and as instructed by CBSE were put up. Creating such articles motivated them to draw inspiration from these themes and personalities on how to succeed and live a value-based life.
- **d. Remedial classes-** Special care is given to the low achievers in order to improve their academic quality.

4. Counseling:

Counseling by our trained counselors Rev. Fr. Thomas Mathilakath CMI, Mrs. Anitha Joji and Mrs. Smaji Tony on a regular basis help our students to counter their anxieties and face life courageously. Students with learning disabilities and ADHD are identified and measures are taken to improve the situation.

TRAINING AND IN-SERVICE PROGRAMMES FOR STAFF:
