Who are Mawingu?

- For as little as \$0.10 a month our users in rural Kenya get access to life changing connectivity
- Our customers include individuals on public Wi-Fi hotspots, homes on fixed wireless, and businesses on hybrid solutions
- Since 2012, we have refined a technology and commercial model to sustainably provide connectivity to the under-served





COVID can accelerate SDGs

- Universal connectivity is a direct enabler for eight SDGs -#3, #4, #5, #8, #9, #10, #11, #16
- Universal connectivity is an indirect enabler for all SDGs
- COVID is a perishable opportunity for acceleration of plans for universal connectivity: it will expire!





- 1. Focused public officers on the urgent need for connectivity
- 2. Unlocked resources for deployment of infrastructure in more equitable ways
- 3. Caused users to prioritise broadband amongst competing needs for limited resources

1. COVID has focused political will

- Problem: public projects present the best opportunity for impact at scale but take a long time
- Progressive Laikipia County Government identified universal connectivity as critical to acceleration of plans for universal health coverage
- TV White Spaces project will bring telemedicine to rural Kenyans



2. COVID has unlocked resources

- Problem: people in rural areas have the same needs for data but nowhere near the same enabling infrastructure
- COVID has unlocked access to non-commercial resources to enable providers reach more unserved areas
- Less of a burden on those left behind to meet the costs of infrastructure deployment

3. COVID has made broadband vital

- Problem: connectivity has often lost the battle for limited resources with users in our markets
- COVID has forced people to stay at home and they have needed home connections
- Mawingu's business case for deployment of infrastructure to previously unreached areas has become positive

DENMARK: Organization for large scale global deployment in place.

CALIFORNIA: Project with University of California. Research on how Internet access can improve agriculture across the world.

GHANA: Multiple projects underway in partnership with local universal access fund and Microsoft. National ISP & TVWS licenses obtained.

MOZAMBIQUE: Working with INCM connecting Communities funded by Universal Service Fund of Mozambique

INDIA: Tenders in India won – securing right to establish 15,500 Wi-Fi installations in villages in 4 states in India – in a partnership with the biggest telco in India, BSNL.

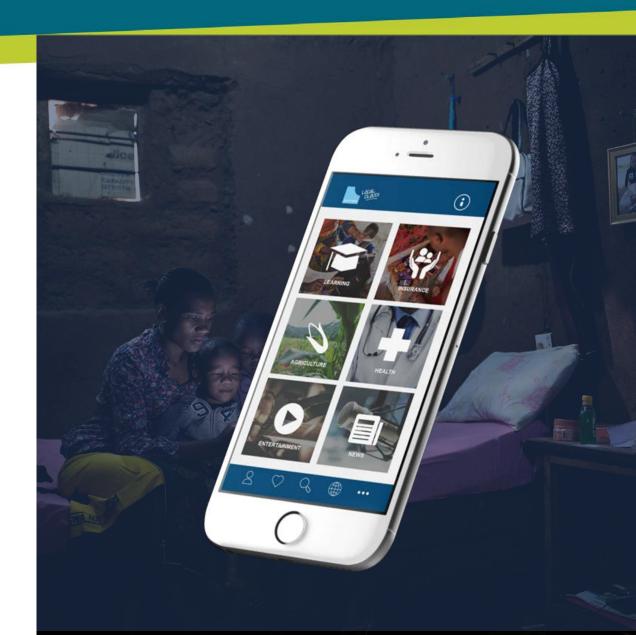
BANGLADESH: MoU signed for first pilot project. In concrete talks over large scale roll-out.

TANZANIA: First systems established in Africa in 2014 currently connecting rural villages in the Dodoma region.

- Access to vital content free of charge for end-user.
- Readily accessible content for people with low digital literacy.
- High resolution video with little use of expensive backhaul

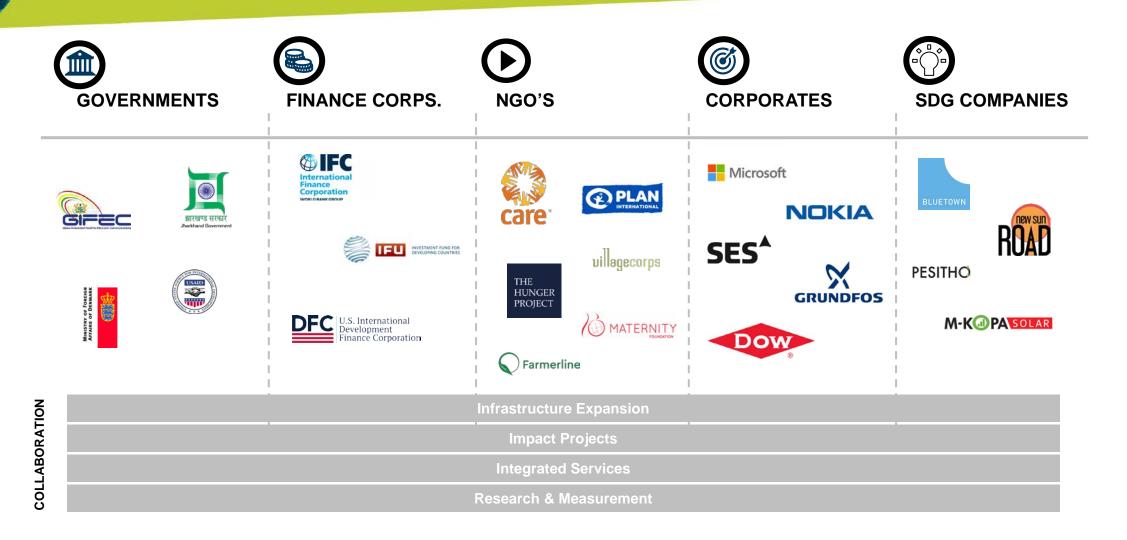

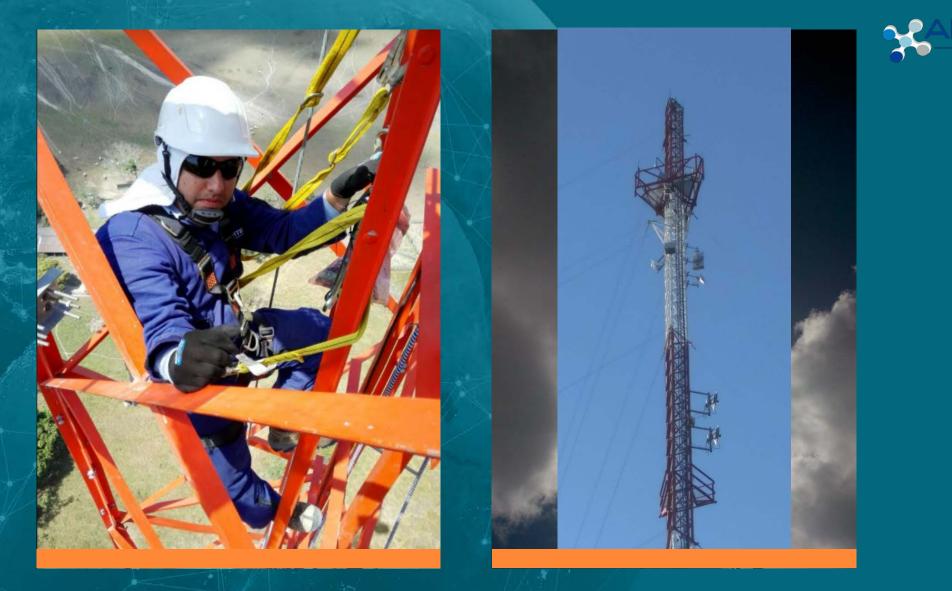

Our Objective is to implement High Impact Connectivity projects specially designed to Close the Digital Gap in rural Colombia and Transform peoples lives through technology

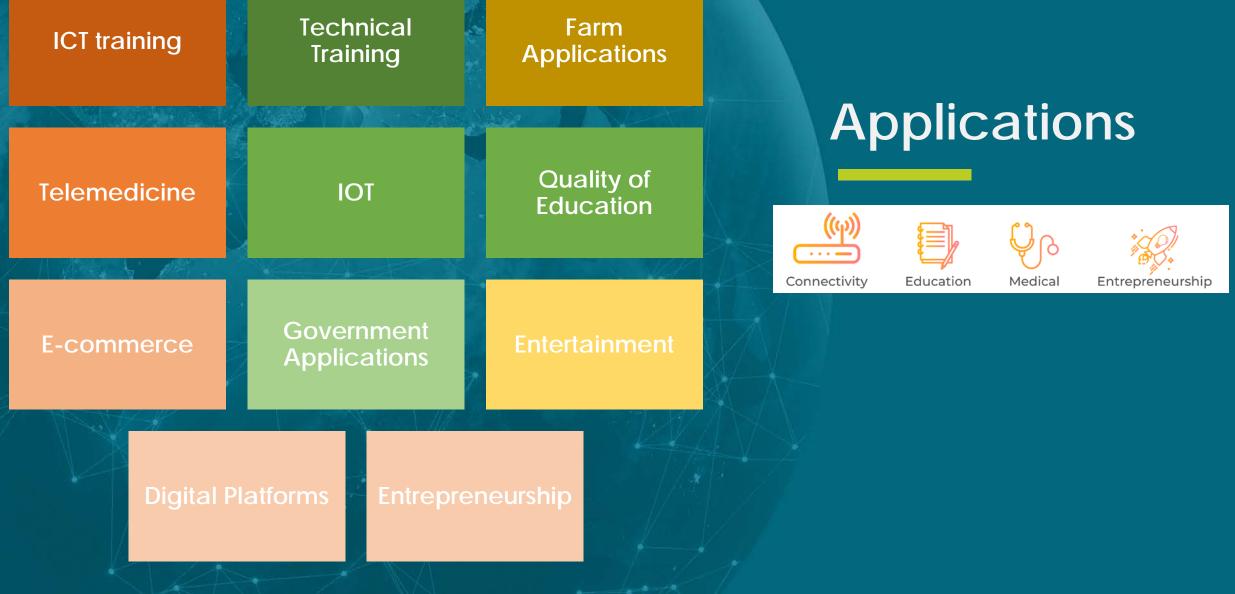

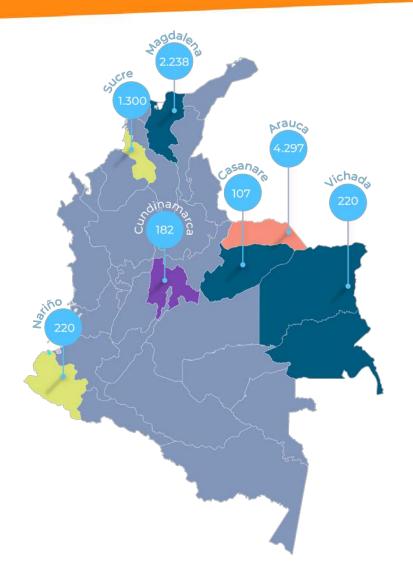
