THREE VALLEYS DRUG POSITIVE

Prince Khalid Abdullah's homebred Three Vallevs (Diesis {GB}), an eight-length winner of the G3 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot in June, has tested positive for the prohibited sustance clenbuterol after his success in the G1 Middle Park S. at Newmarket Oct. 3. The highly rated juvenile is almost certain to be stripped of the latter victory if the second ('B') sample is confirmed positive. "Three Valleys has tested positive for clenbuterol following his win in the Middle Park S. on October 3," trainer Roger Charlton told Racing Post. "The second, or B, sample has not yet been sent off for confirmation. The colt has had well-documented treatment for mucus in the lungs. He was withdrawn from veterinary treatment nine days before the [veterinary and Jockey Club] guidelines, which suggest that six and a half days should be a safe period for clenbuterol. Until the second sample is tested and the Jockey Club completes its enquiries, it would be premature to speculate as to the outcome at this stage." Tillerman (GB) (In the Wings {GB}), in the same ownership, tested positive for the same substance after finishing second to Dubai Destination in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot in June. Three Valleys' possible disqualification will not affect his owner's claim to the British owners' title, but it will benefit the retiring Pat Eddery, who finished second aboard Balmont (Stravinsky) in the Group 1 contest.

GRADE I WINNER MISS LINDA RETIRED Miss Linda (Arg) (Southern Halo--Miss Peggy {Arg}, by Fitzcarraldo {Arg}), named Mare of the Year in her native Argentina and a Grade I winner in the U.S., has been retired to stud and will be bred to Unbridled's Song. The dark bay won a pair of Group 1 races in Argentina as a sophomore in 2000 and garnered champion three-year-old filly and Mare of the Year honors. Brought to the States the following year, she capped off a successful campaign with a victory in the GI Spinster S. at Keeneland. Twice placed in Grade I company this term, the six-year-old was third in her most recent, the GIII Turnback the Alarm H. at Aqueduct Nov. 1. "We were blessed to race such a classy filly," said coowner Leland Ackerley. "We bought her sight unseen based on the recommendations of John Fulton and John Kimmel. She gave us a lot of thrills, but her win in the Spinster was probably the greatest. Now she will join our broodmare band in Kentucky, and we look forward to someday racing her sons and daughters." Miss Linda concludes her career with eight wins in 21 starts, with earnings in excess of \$870,000.

MELBOURNE CUP UPDATE Godolphin's Mamool (Ire) (In the Wings {Ire}), who finished last as the 11-2 favorite in the G1 Melbourne Cup Nov. 4, was found to have fractured a right hind fetlock and will be returned to Dubai today for further examination, reports the Racing Post. "That happens in racing and it is very disappointing and it was just one of those freak accidents that can occur," Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford told Racing Post. "He was lame straight after the race, so tests and X-rays were carried out and the results are currently being analyzed. He will come back to Dubai [today] and we will take it from there." In related news, jockey Danny Nikolic has been cleared of a charge of failing to ensure his mount Mummify (Aus) (Jeune {GB}) was given full opportunity to win in the Mackinnon S. at Flemington Nov. 1.

Many aspects of the bloodstock industry must be bewildering to the uninitiated, such as why one winner of a major race can be much more valuable than another winner of the same race.

The answer, of course, comes down partly to fashion. A Kentucky Derby winner by Mr. Prospector is bound to be much more sought after than a Kentucky Derby winner by, say, At The Threshold. Plenty of other factors are also involved in determining a horse's value, though, such as whether a potential stallion comes from a family with a reputation for producing successful stallions.

These thoughts were prompted by the recent success of Voix du Nord in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. This excellent prospect is a son of Valanour, who was listed in the 2003 edition of Etalons as commanding a fee of only 1,400 euros for Thoroughbred mares or 1,000 euros for non-thoroughbreds. These inexpensive fees reflect the fact that Valanour is now one of the many stallions which the French National Stud makes available to breeders throughout France for modest sums--he is based down in the Pyrenean region north of the Spanish border, well away from France's main breeding areas in the north.

Even when he began his career at Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu, Valanour's fee was only 35,000 francs, or less than 6,000 dollars--a modest sum for a horse of his achievements. *Cont. p4*

Valanour had defeated Singspiel (who will stand the 2004 season at a fee £50,000) in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris and then added another Group 1 victory at four, when he took the Prix Ganay against opponents of the calibre of the multiple Group 1 winners Luso, Swain and Spectrum. Unfortunately, the Aga Khan's homebred failed to reproduce his best French form when he tried his luck in Ireland, England and the USA, effectively limiting his options to France.

Even then, breeders must have had some doubts about Valanour's ability to translate his racecourse successes into a rewarding stallion career. His retirement in 1997 came a few years after his sire Lomond had been packed off to Italy in relative disgrace.

To describe Lomond's stallion career as anti-climatic is something of an understatement. This son of the all-conquering Northern Dancer appeared to have a great deal to offer when he retired to Coolmore at a fee of 65,000 Irish guineas. In addition to being by the world's most fashionable stallion, he was a half-brother to the magnificent Seattle Slew, who was already establishing himself as a very good stallion. Like Seattle Slew, Lomond had also become a classic winner, in the 1983 2.000 Guineas.

For a while, Lomond promised to follow in Seattle Slew's famous footsteps. His first crop produced no fewer than six group winners, including Ashayer (G1 Prix Marcel Boussac), Flutter Away (G1 Moyglare Stud S.) and Dark Lomond (G1 Irish St Leger).

However, none of his subsequent Irish crops compared to this spectacular collection (although they did produce another 11 group winners) and the decision to switch Lomond to Kentucky at the end of 1990 seemed to make matters worse. Valanour was the only group winner sired during Lomond's American sojourn.

Normally, you would have considered it a distinct plus that Valanour's dam, the Mill Reef mare Vearia, is a half-sister to four group winners. Unfortunately the bad news was that three of them--Vayrann, Valiyar and Yashgan--had disappointed badly as stallions and, to cap it all, Vearia is also a half-sister to the dam of Natroun, a French Derby winner who achieved little before being despatched to Japan.

I suspect that Valanour has been found guilty by association. This could be unfair, because his record this year suggests that he offered value at his original fee. He has seven black-type performers to his credit, with Voix du Nord heading a team with also includes the Listed winners Wedding Night and Valdoura and the group-placed colts Valentino and Vasywait.

Voix du Nord's trainer David Smaga said that he "had known for a long time that the further he goes the better he will get." As the colt's big win was gained over a mile and a quarter, Voix du Nord should certainly be suited by the distance of the French Derby, especially as his broodmare sire is the French Derby winner Top Ville and Valanour's broodmare sire is the Derby-winning Mill Reef.

Voix du Nord's second dam, Girl of France, was a good-class miler in France, but was quick enough to win the Admirably H. over Santa Anita's six-and-a-half furlongs. She has two stakes-winning sons, including Varxi, an impressive winner of the G3 Prix Thomas Bryon at two in 1996.

Another good recent winner from this family is Westerner, whose dam is a half-sister to Voix du Nord's third dam, Water Girl. Westerner has established himself as France's best long-distance horse this year despite being by the sprinter Danehill.



November 15, 1995... Jockey **Julie Krone** rode her 3,000th career winner, taking the fourth race at Aqueduct with Dustin's Dreamer.
