


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- NOTE: (Steps 1, 14-16 are for 2010 models only. All other model years skip to step 2)
- Remove air dam and plastic grill panel by removing (7) plastic fasteners, (3) bolts, and (6) clips. If vehicle is equipped with factory installed tow hooks skip to step 3 (no hole enlargement required). If no tow hooks are present and hole enlargement is preferred skip to step 10.



2. Remove air dam by removing (5) plastic fasteners. If optional trimming is selected this will occur in step 18.





- NOTE: (Steps 3-9 are for models equipped with factory installed tow hooks and no hole enlargement is required. If hole enlargement is preferred on vehicles without tow hooks skip to step 10)
- 3. Take off vehicle grill by removing (6) plastic fasteners.





 Begin the removal of front bumper cover by first removing the (3) lower screws from the bottom of bumper cover. Then remove the (5) plastic fasteners from top of bumper cover.

5. Continue bumper cover removal by removing (2) plastic fasteners and (1) socket screw in each wheel well.





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  - 6. Carefully pull bumper away from frame. Twist and remove head light lamps from their housing units. Place bumper off to the side.






7. Remove factory tow hooks and lock nuts. These will not be reinstalled, return to vehicle owner.



8. Remove the front frame end caps to allow removal of factory installed tow hook hardware.



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9. Fishwire (2) carriage bolts and spacers through the front of each frame rail, as shown below and in the illustration on sheet 2.





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NOTE: (Steps 10-12 are for the hole enlargement option)

10. Enlarge the square mounting hole on each frame rail so that the included 1/2" hardware can pass through.





11. Fishwire 1/2" carriage bolt and CM-SP17 spacer into front mounting hole on each side.

(See FISHWIRE TECHNIQUE on sheet 2)





12. Reverse fishwire 1/2" carriage bolt and CM-SP17 spacer into rear mounting hole on each side.

(See REVERSE PULL FISHWIRE TECHNIQUE on sheet 2)



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 Using the fishwires on the carriage bolts as a guide raise hitch into position. (Rubber guards will need to be temporarily flipped out of the way on 2010 models) Remove the fishwires and secure with flange nuts.


Torque all 1/2" hardware to 110 ft-lbs.





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- 14. On 2010 models, trim fascia so it is able to be fastened back onto vehicle cross member. (See TRIM DIAGRAM below) Trim dimensions are approximate. Check fit prior trimming.






15. If removed in step 1, reinstall plastic grill panel.



16. If removed in step 1, raise air dam into position and mark location to trim for receiver tube. After hole is trimmed for the receiver tube, raise air dam back into position and mark trim locations for the hitch chain loops (See below). Trim dimensions are approximate. Check fit prior to trimming. Reinstall air dam.

17. Reinstall frame endcaps, headlights, bumper cover and grill, if removed in steps 3-9.



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NOTE: (Air dam trimming option for 2005-2009 models)

18. Trim an approximate 2 5/8" square from the center bottom portion of air dam. Trim dimensions are approximate. Check fit prior to trimming. Reinstall air dam.





## **INSTALLATION STEPS**

NOTE: (Steps 1 & 16-18 are for 2010 models only. All other model years skip to step 2)

- 1. Remove air dam and plastic grill panel by removing (7) plastic fasteners, (3) bolts, and (6) clips. If vehicle is equipped with factory installed tow hooks skip to step 3 (no hole enlargement required). If no tow hooks are present and hole enlargement is preferred skip to step 11.
- 2. Remove air dam by removing (5) plastic fasteners. If optional trimming is selected this will occur in step 21.

NOTE: (Steps 3-10 & 16-17 are for models equipped with factory installed tow hooks and no hole enlargement is required. If hole enlargement is preferred on vehicles without tow hooks skip to step 11)

- 3. Take off vehicle grill by removing (6) plastic fasteners.
- 4. Begin the removal of front bumper cover by first removing the (3) lower screws from the bottom of bumper.
- 5. Remove the (5) plastic fasteners from top of bumper cover.
- 6. Continue bumper cover removal by removing (2) plastic fasteners and (1) socket screw in each wheel well.
- 7. Carefully pull bumper cover away from frame. Twist and remove head light lamps from their housing units. Place bumper cover off to the side.
- 8. Remove factory tow hooks and lock nuts. These will not be reinstalled, return to vehicle owner.
- 9. Remove the front frame end caps to allow removal of factory installed tow hook hardware.
- 10. Fishwire (2) carriage bolts and spacers through the front of each frame rail, as shown on page 1.
- NOTE: (Steps 11-13 are for the hole enlargement option)
- 11. Enlarge the square mounting holes on each frame rail so the included 1/2" hardware can pass through.
- 12. Fishwire 1/2" carriage bolt and CM-SP17 spacer into front mounting hole on each side. (See FISHWIRE TECHNIQUE on page 1)
- 13. Reverse fishwire 1/2" carriage bolt and CM-SP17 spacer into rear mounting hole on each side. (See REVERSE PULL FISHWIRE TECHNIQUE on page 1)
- 14. Using the fishwires on the carriage bolts as a guide raise hitch into position. (Rubber guards will need to be temporarily flipped out of the way on 2010 models) Remove the fishwires and secure with flange nuts.
- 15. Torque all 1/2" hardware to 110 ft-lbs.
- 16. On 2010 models, trim fascia so it is able to be fastened back onto vehicle cross member. (See FASCIA in TRIM DIAGRAM (2010 MODELS ONLY) on page 1) Trim dimensions are approximate.
- 17. If removed in step 1, reinstall plastic grill panel.
- 18. If removed in step 1, raise air dam into position and mark location to trim for receiver tube. After hole is trimmed for the receiver tube raise air dam back into position and mark trim locations for the hitch chain loops (See AIR DAM in TRIM DIAGRAM (2010 MODELS ONLY) on page 1) Trim dimensions are approximate. Check fit prior to trimming. Reinstall air dam.
- 19. If removed in step 9, reinstall frame end caps.
- 20. If removed in steps 3-7, reinstall head lights, bumper cover and grill.
- NOTE: (Air dam trimming option for 2005-2009 models)
- Trim an approximate 2 5/8" square from the center bottom portion of air dam. (See TRIM DIAGRAM (2005-2009 MODELS ONLY) on page 1) Trim dimensions are approximate. Check fit prior to trimming. Reinstall air dam.

#### FRONT MOUNTED ACCESSORIES

1) Do not exceed front axle Gross Weight Rating (GAWR). Consult owners manual or specification plate located on driver's door frame. Measure gross front axle weight by placing front wheels of loaded vehicle on a scale.

WARNING: Exceeding GAWR may overload the front axle and/or suspension. This could result in accident, property damage and personal injury.

2) Reposition front mounted license plate if obstructed.

3) Do not obstruct vehicle lights.

4) Allow free air flow into grille opening.

5) Rear wheel traction may be reduced. This could effect handling. Reduce speed and drive with caution.

6) Accessories extend front of vehicle. This may reduce approach angle. Use caution when parking and maneuvering.

7) Do not obstruct driver view.

#### VEHICLE RECOVERY AND WINCHING TIPS


1) Use OEM tow hooks, recovery eyes or a clevis mount for attachment of a tow strap or winch cable.

WARNING: NEVER use a ball and/or ball mount as an anchor point for tow strap or winch cable. Severe personal injury or death could result.

2) Observe winch manufacturer's recommendations, cautions and warnings.

3) Attach return cable to tow hook or recovery eye when using a snatch block (See figure 1).


CAUTION: Do not attach return cable to winch mount. This may overload winch mount and/or front mounted receiver.




For Maximum line pull rating, winch cable must not exceed:

- 15 degree angle up or down from horizontal (See Figure 2).
- 45 degree angle left or right from straight ahead (See Figure 3).

CAUTION: Exceeding the maximum line pull rating may over load winch, winch mount, and/or front mounted receiver.





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
