Executive Summary

With the current state of development for the market for ISO 14001:2015 management systems building upon the development of the International Standard and its recent publication, now, is a good opportunity to reflect on the body of information and guidance that is available a wide range of organisations.

Whether you are trying to make sense of the variety of views on the revised International Standard, prepare for your transition or to keep up with the latest developments in Environmental Management Systems (EMS), there is a lot of information out there on the Internet but with no clear coordinated, source for the content.

This report has been prepared on the basis of initial internet searches for available resources, such as Whitepapers, PowerPoint presentations and downloadable documents, with my starting point (and challenge), to review the readily available resources to gauge the extent of ISO 14001:2015 information and to record location of any downloadable papers within my review, so that you will not have to trawl across the Internet.

Before reading the review, there are a few caveats to the use of this document:


1. The main focus has been on information presented in a downloadable format, such as an Adobe Acrobat (pdf), Microsoft PowerPoint presentation or similar document.
2. My research has been aimed at the available resources that are published in English and readily accessed through search engines, such as Google and Bing.
3. Knowledge leaders, such as national standards bodies, accreditation bodies, certification bodies, professional institutes and a selection of large and small environmental consultancies have been cited to provide a well-rounded review of the development and transition to ISO 14001:2015.
4. Individual web blogs and posts are not listed as there are too many such resources to be able to catalogue in one clear and concise document.

Finally, my research, whilst extensive, may not have covered every ISO 14001:2015 resource on the Internet, so if you know of a White Paper, Fact Sheet or article that provides clearly, presented information & that is not overtly marketing material, then I welcome an e-mail to update the review.



 <p>ISO 14001:2015 Status and Transition Planning</p> <p>As has been widely communicated, ISO 14001 is currently under revision and is expected to be published in September of this year. The time also to be aware that the International Accreditation Forum (IAF) has allocated a 3 year transition period from date of publication of the standard for certification bodies to transfer their clients from the 2004 version to the 2015 version of the standard. Following the transition period ISO 14001:2004 will cease to be valid.</p> <p>UKAS, along with other accreditation bodies, has been preparing its approach to managing the transition. One of UKAS' main aims is to ensure that accredited certification bodies can plan a transition period to ensure ISO 14001:2015 accreditation for the delivery of ISO 14001 certification to the 2015 version of the standard in a timely and effective manner.</p> <p>In planning the transition UKAS has taken due consideration of 'IAF ID 10:2015 - Transition Planning Guidance for ISO 14001:2015'.</p> <p>The guidance document was published on the 27th February 2015 and provides useful information to all parties affected by the transition from ISO 14001:2004 to ISO 14001:2015. The document also strongly encourages the need for work to be done in a small number of groups. As a consequence of this, and where requested by the certification body, UKAS will consider conducting assessments against the First Stage International Standard (FSIS), although additional work may be required if there are any identified differences between the FSIS and the published version. 


