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#### A BRIEF INTRODUCTION TO THE SEVEN CANDIDATES RUNNING FOR THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

With no seats being contested (would need at least eight people for a contested election), at the Corporate Meeting Monday, January 19, 2015, the slate of candidates will be approved. It is important to attend this meeting, even though there will not be a ballot vote, there still needs to be a quorum to conduct business. Immediately following the approval, the seven new members will elect their own officers to the Board. Below is a brief introduction to each of the prospective Board members.

Christine Frasca is a snowbird from Milford Connecticut who has been wintering in Deerfield Lake for the past twelve years. Chris retired from Nash Engineering as a Corporate Officer. She has held a previous position as a Director on our HOA and is the current Secretary. Chris also is a member of the Policy and Procedures and By-Laws Committee. Chris feels that she has the necessary skill set to be an asset to the Board, making it easier for the members to maintain the rules and regulations.

Anthony Lananna has resided in Deerfield Lake, as a full-time resident, for the past ten years. He is originally from Brooklyn, NY where he worked for the NYC Transit Authority.
