



 - o New swings to replace broken soon.


b. UMM Removal

All current railings will be replaced due to disrepair, and new railings will be added next to all new sidewalks/stairways.



Even our leaders love it!


Every lesson in this 3-year program, studying the Bible in order from Old to New Testaments, relates back to Jesus.




