THE ITINERARY

Day 1 Arrive in Denver, Colorado

Today arrive in the Mile High City of Denver, which really is a mile above sea level (5,280 feet/1609 meters). Make your own way to your centrally located downtown hotel accommodation. The Denver Airport Rail is located just outside baggage claim at Denver International Airport, and tickets to Union Station in downtown Denver can be purchased on the rail platform at ticket vending machines. The ride is 40 minutes and will take you to within 4 blocks of your hotel. The rail cars have space for luggage. Enjoy the remainder of the day at leisure.

Overnight: Hilton Garden Inn Denver Union Station, Denver Meals included: None

Day 2 Denver at leisure

Today is free at leisure to explore this amazing city.

Enjoy the walkable city centre and the 16th Street Mall, a mile-long pedestrian promenade lined with dozens of outdoor cafes and pubs. Stroll through LoDo (Lower Downtown), the 26-square-block historic area that has transformed Victorian buildings to create a hip neighbourhood filled with breweries, rooftop bars, acclaimed restaurants and music clubs. Shop downtown at the Denver Pavilions, explore the boutiques of Larimer Square or get western shirts and boots at Rockmount Ranch Wear. Take a photo or two with an Only-In-Denver icon, I See What You Mean-"The Big Blue Bear", a 12-meter sculpture that peers curiously into the Colorado Convention Center. He looks good from all angles.

With 300 days of sunshine, Denver's outdoor patios are always ready to welcome you! Sample creative cuisine at chef-owned restaurants in historic Larimer Square, Denver Union Station and throughout the city's neighbourhoods. Let the Denver Beer Trail be your guide to some of The Mile High

City's 150 unique craft breweries, many of which are located in the walkable city center. Or, learn from the experts on a guided beer tour!

For more urban adventures, explore art and history in the Golden Triangle Creative District at History Colorado Center, Clyfford Still Museum, Kirkland Museum of Fine & Decorative Art or the Denver Art Museum, famous for its Western & Indigenous art collections. Discover upscale shopping in Cherry Creek and get close to nature at the Denver Zoo and Denver Museum of Nature & Science, located in City Park, 15 minutes from the city centre. Red Rocks Park & Amphitheatre, just 30 minutes from Denver, is famous for its one-of-a-kind outdoor concert venue that is surrounded by giant, ancient rock formations. During the day, Red Rocks is a free city park with easy hiking trails and a visitor centre that includes a Performers' Hall of Fame.

Overnight: Hilton Garden Inn Denver Union Station, Denver Meals included: Breakfast

Day 3 Denver - Rocky Mountaineer Train Journey - Glenwood Springs

Make your own way to Union Station for your train adventure into the heart of the American Southwest on Rocky Mountaineer's newest route, Rockies to the Red Rocks. Get comfortable, meet your hosts and enjoy breakfast and a beverage while taking in the scenic views of the Gross Reservoir dam. Celebrate crossing the Continental Divide with a sparkling wine toast, while cutting through the 6.3 miles of a mountain in Moffatt Tunnel.

Dine on a regionally inspired lunch as hosts captivate you with stories of the region. Tour along the Colorado River through the equally picturesque Byers Canyon and Gore Canyon. Sip on Rocky Mountaineers signature cocktail as you approach

your overnight destination of Glenwood Springs. Disembark and reminisce about your day in the comfort of your cosy hotel room.

Colorado's Land of Water, Glenwood Springs, sits at the confluence of the Colorado and Roaring Fork rivers and is known the world over for its famous hot-springs amenities. You'll find plenty of things to do in this historic town.

Overnight: Hotel Colorado or similar, Glenwood Springs Meals included: Breakfast;Lunch

Day 4 Glenwood Springs - Rocky Mountaineer - Moab, Utah

Leave beautiful Glenwood Springs rested and relaxed as you continue heading south-west for another day of extraordinary views, venturing toward the colourful archways and amazing rock formations. Enjoy a two-course hot breakfast while watching the morning light bounce off the magnificent Parachute Creek and Mount Logan. Take in the stunning red rock formations lining the cliffs in Ruby Canyon, roam past Mount Garfield and savour a signature mocktail while crossing the state line into Utah.

It's always a stunning welcome in Moab with its red sandstone backdrop. Upon disembarkation, you will be met by your tour manager and travel to the nearby Arches National Park which is known as the site of more than 2,000 natural sandstone arches. Here you will admire the grand, orange sandstone formations with viewings of the aptly named Park Avenue, Courthouse Towers, Balanced Rock and Double Arch. Finish the day at your accommodation in Moab for an evening at leisure.

Overnight: Element Moab, Moab Meals included: Breakfast;Lunch

Day 5 Moab - Canyonlands National Park - Bryce Canyon National Park

This morning depart Moab and visit Canyonlands National Park which is known for its dramatic desert landscape carved by the Colorado River, with stunning vistas of the surrounding canyons, mountains and river lands. After visiting Canyonlands enjoy views of Grand Staircase-Escalante National Monument along Highway 12, a national scenic byway and one of the most picturesque drives in America on your way to Bryce Canyon City where you will check into your accommodation for an evening at leisure.

Overnight: Ruby's Inn, Bryce Canyon City

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 6 Bryce Canyon National Park

Today venture through the forests of Ponderosa pines towards Bryce Canyon National Park. The park's main road leads past the expansive Bryce Amphitheater, a depression lying below the Rim Trail hiking path. It has overlooks at Sunrise Point, Sunset Point, Inspiration Point and Bryce Point. As you head toward the highly elevated rim, the views will open up to reveal vertical pillars of orange sandstone, affectionately referee to as "hoodoos." Here you can stroll along the rim or you might venture into the canyon for a short hike. Finish the day back in Bryce Canyon City for an evening at leisure.

Overnight: Ruby's Inn, Bryce Canyon City

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 7 Bryce Canyon National Park - Grand Canyon National Park North Rim - Kanab

Today depart Bryce Canyon heading to Kanab, also known as Utah's 'Little Hollywood' due to the high number of western

movies filmed in the area. On the way discover the quiet grandeur of the North Rim of the Grand Canyon, less visited than the South Rim, but just as breathtaking. Here you can stroll along the rim for ever-changing views and admire the picture perfect scenery. Finish the day in Kanab where you will enjoy the remainder of the evening at leisure.

Overnight: Hampton Inn, Kanab

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 8 Kanab - Zion National Park - Las Vegas

Today take a day trip to Zion National Park and see the park from top to bottom as you descend from the high country to the bottom of towering Zion Canyon. Zion is often described as having hanging gardens, with plant life often growing straight out of the canyon walls. White, red and orange sandstone soar above you, and you'll have time to go for a scenic walk or take the free tram up Zion Canyon and back. Afterwards, drive through the Mojave Desert to Las Vegas where you will check into your hotel accommodation for the next 2 nights.

Overnight: Bally's or similar, Las Vegas

Meals included: Breakfast

Day 9 Las Vegas at leisure

Today is free at leisure to explore this vibrant city. Perhaps you can visit many famed hotels and casinos of the Las Vegas Strip or check out downtown or "classic" Las Vegas to experience the Fremont Street Experience, and one of the world's largest light shows. Don't miss the entertaining Fountains of Bellagio by day or night.

Overnight: Bally's or similar, Las Vegas

TOUR GUIDE VS. TOUR LEADER

Tour Guide

Often locals with intimate knowledge of an area, its culture, and history. Their role entails providing commentary, routing the tour, and seeing that people have a good time. They are a licensed, qualified expert who supplies specific information on history, art, architecture and culture of the city/ village/attraction in which he or she is guiding the tour. The guide meets the group at the required place and leaves the group at the end of the tour, they do not travel with the group.

Tour Leader

An experienced person tasked with ensuring the smooth operation of tours, as well as providing practical support to

passengers throughout the whole trip. Their role primarily includes assisting with accommodation, transportation between locations, and communication with tour guides in each stop. A tour leader may provide general guidance around a city or village, and offer information on the place visited on the bus, however, they are not required to have specific knowledge on art, architecture, or history. They are not allowed to provide a guided tour or commentary of a city/village/attraction once there and if caught doing so, can be fined.

Please note: Tour leaders/guides are not a standard inclusion in all travel offers. Tour leaders/guides will only be made available when particularly required to enhance the experience of the destination featured.

CLIMATE & AVERAGE TEMPERATURES

Denver

- The biggest surprise for visitors to Denver is the climate. The arid conditions bring only 8 to 15 inches of annual precipitation and locals wake up to more than 300 days of sunshine a year. That's more annual hours of sun than Miami and San Diego.
- In summer, Denver enjoys low relative humidity, making for beautiful, sun-filled days and cool, comfortable evenings. The average daily high temperature in August is a mild 30 degrees celsius.

Las Vegas

- Located in the Mojave Desert, the Las Vegas climate is a hot desert subtropical climate that is characterised by arid and sunny conditions. In fact, Las Vegas weather is some of the sunniest in the world with an annual average of more than 3,800 hours or 300 days of sunshine, meaning there's almost never a bad time to visit Vegas.
- However the summer months of June, July and August can get extremely hot, with daytime highs typically reaching between 100F (37C) and 110F (43C), sometimes even hotter. Humidity is low which keeps conditions a little more comfortable in such high temperatures and night time lows still remain in the balmy high 80sF (30C).
- Autumn, from September to November and spring from March to May are wonderful times to visit as the days are warm and sunny, cooling in the evenings, making for rather

comfortable conditions when it comes to being out in the desert. This is the perfect time for those wishing to enjoy outdoor activities such as golf or visiting the Grand Canyon.

COACH TOUR

Meals

9 meals are included in the tour, for all other meals; lunches and dinners the tour leader (when available) will offer assistance with reservations, suggestions and directions to local restaurants. It is your responsibility to notify TripADeal of any dietary requests/requirements. Please note; we will do our best to meet your requests/requirements, however, cannot guarantee that we will always be able to.

Luggage

You will be responsible for all your personal belongings whilst on the tour. With regards to luggage, you must carry your own luggage from the coach to the hotel room and back to the coach. The driver will assist with the uploading and off-loading of the luggage from the coach.

United States
