• June 3rd Demonstrator, 6 PM: Trent Bosch, Hollow Forms for Everyone



Trent Bosch has been woodturning for

more than 25 years. He began exploring the art of woodturning while pursuing a Fine Arts Degree from Colorado State University. After graduating, he fully devoted his efforts into creating a one of a kind

sculptural woodturnings. Over the years, he has also enjoyed demonstrating and teaching hands on classes, sharing the knowledge and techniques he has developed, freely with others. More recently, he has devoted more time to developing, designing and manufacturing unique tools for woodturners. His work is displayed in numerous fine arts galleries, permanent collections of museums and craft centers as well as in many private collections worldwide. Trent has taught and demonstrated his techniques for turning and sculpting wood throughout the United States and abroad. He is a lifetime member of our RMWT.

Hollow Forms for Everyone This is a great demo for people that are interested in hollowing, whether you are just getting started or have been hollowing for many years. Trent will share valuable techniques that he has learned throughout the years using just his basic hollowing tools, you will learn about form, steps of hollowing, how to check wall thickness with simple tools, and much more.

Officer Reports:

Board of Directors Meeting May 25th on Zoom

<u>President</u>-Allen Jensen joined us for a discussion on the club budget and how the symposium funds are managed separately to allow tracking of event specific charges. Bob has been in close conversation with Woodcraft to understand how the club can pursue getting an internet connection into the back of the building to facilitate broadcasting in person demonstrations to club members wanting to attend remotely from their homes. Bob will contact Comcast to understand the monthly fees.

We are targeting resuming in person meetings at Woodcraft in September and will advise the membership once this becomes a reality. <u>Vice President</u>- We currently have 97 members and at our peak last year we had 127. We will be reaching out to with a special email communication to those folks who forgot to re-new their memberships. Barring any negative changes in the COVID status, Chris offered to host the annual summer picnic again at his residence as a pizza making party in August. More details in the upcoming newsletter.

<u>Secretary-</u>Published pre-requisites and sign up details for Wood Bank event. Circulated draft budget to BOD members in advance of the meeting to review the clubs comprehensive financial position. We discussed expenses that needed to be included on an annual basis and income sources, beyond membership dues.

<u>Treasurer</u>- Checking \$4848.44; Savings \$4,848.23. We are continuing identifying the line items and expenses in the budget. Dave was granted signature privileges as the BOD representative on the symposium account-this will enable easier end of the year financial reporting.

<u>EOG Chairman-</u>Conducted preliminary review to revise and update critical portions_of existing application and guidelines documents. Discussed 2021 budget.

We had terrific participation in the "show and tell" segment of the Zoom meeting. Next month's turners challenge is an embellished turning. The technical discussion lead by Raleigh Lockhart was on alternatives to chucking and using double sided woodturners tape and it was stressed this tape is pressure sensitive so it needs time to adhere and how to remove it when the project is completed.

Chris Van Woerkom showed how to use a Dremel tool to sharpen chain saw teeth and band saw blades. This blossomed into a conversation on other techniques to sharpen chain saws.

Additionally, we got two shop tours from Margret Stiles and Jim Bessette that gave everyone ideas and insights on shop layouts, tool storage and dust management.

Next up, will be shop tours by Chris Van Woerkom and Clarence Sitzman.

If you have been stumped by a turning problem or need advice on finishes or tools and techniques-please feel free to join us in the next social hour on June 17th at 6PM. A Zoom meeting invite will be sent out prior to the gathering. Just a reminder that our time together has no firm agenda and the conversation flows around the topics the participants bring up. 
Wood Bank Information

On May 22, club members gathered at the Wood Bank to receive personalized hands on, safe chain saw operation mentoring and to understand the different approach for cutting firewood vs. cutting blanks with an objective of using it for turning. Dave Landers and John Giem both provided multiple morning and afternoon, 90 minute, 1-1 sessions. Dave showed how to examine the wood characteristics such as pith location and the balance (or lack thereof) in the annual growth rings to understand how to make the best cuts and the wonders that can be found when cutting crotches.

We also rented a wood splitter and did some major splitting & stacking of firewood-folks loaded up to take it home. John also offered his shop for tool and technique conversations and mentored on various topics.

John's family cooked us up a grilled feast of burgers and hot dogs and the fixings for lunch. Everyone who participated enjoyed the gathering and left with plenty of new knowledge and wood and stated they had a great time!
