

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

History



- n Settled by Jewish Detroiters and Immigrants beginning in 1917
- Part of historic and continuing trend of Jewish community moving northwest from downtown
- n Tried Stone is a formerJewish synagogue & school- Beth Tefilo Emmanuel &Taylor Shul
- New St. Peter's on Pingree is a former Jewish synagogue Beth Yehuda



African American Community

- n As community conditions change, the financial classes of the African American Community changed in neighborhood
- n By 1967 population density is 2x city average
- n Black unemployment 2x that of whites
- n Political & financial sectors unresponsive
- n "The Strip" or "Sin Street"

Detroit Race Riots-July 23, 1967, 3:45 AM at 12th & Clairmount

- n The name "Race Riots" controversy
- n Blind pig raided with violent police response
- n Rage explodes over ongoing conditions and police treatment
- n 9 days of rioting across city
- n 43 dead, over 700 injured, over \$50 million in property damage
- n One of most significant events in SE Michigan history
- n Neighborhood and regional psyche and land use still affected today

















- Now: Northwestern High School– 2 miles away






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Recreation and Green Space Strengths

Recreation and Green Space Weaknesses

- n Current Condition-Open Space
 - Poorly maintained landscape
 - n High grass and weeds
 - n No grass
 - Neighborhood looks unfriendly
 - n Homes not maintained
 - Area appearsabandoned and unsafe



Recreation and Green Space Weaknesses

- n Conditions- Parks and Recreation Facilities
 - Gordon Playground
 - n Benches and equipment need repair
 - Joseph WalkerWilliams Center
 - n Entrance of building is unclear to new visitors
 - n Building appears unused
 - n Exterior of building needs improvement

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Target Vacant Parcels for New Construction



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- n Create a landlord association
 - Obtains a stake in the neighborhood
 - Invests and manages difficult tenants

n Build Social Capital

- Non-profit company
 - n Employs residents for housing repair & maintenance services
 - n Directs homeowners to Tredco/Patch approved contractors & landlords
 - oversee rental rates & reputation
 - n A Guarantor of home equity loans

Partner with existing CDCs / Programs / Stakeholders

- n Virginia Park CDC
 - Custodian of Virginia Park Urban Renewal Plan
- n Henry Ford Non Profit Corp & Virginia Park CDC
 - New housing planned for Philadelphia
 - n Low to Moderate incomes
- n New Center Council
 - Rosa Parks Streetscape
- n West Grand Boulevard Collaborative
 - Business corridor on WGB
- n LISC
 - Central Woodward Strategic Investment Area
 - Assist CDCs in revitalization efforts and improve quality of life

Direct Homeowners to Gov't backed lending

- n City of Detroit Planning & Development
 - **Housing Services Division**
 - n Senior Emergency Repair Program:
 - ·· Ages 65 +
 - Ages 55 + & Disabled
 - Very Low Income
 - No prior acceptance of grants
 - n Minor Home Repair Program:
 - Single Family Dwellings
 - Within Boundaries of Sponsoring Organization
 - Structure must be feasible for repair(s)

Prevent Further School Closures

- n Form strong, supportive relationship with Thirkell Elementary School
- n Incorporate family friendly housing into neighborhood housing strategy

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School Recommendations- Organizational





Carefully Consider Charter Schools

- n If DPS trends continue to the detriment of the neighborhood and declining enrollment causes Thirkell Elementary to close
- n <u>Don't</u> initiate if it will be to the detriment of Thirkell Elementary

- n Utilize the Available Green Space for Neighborhood Beautification

- Establish programs to assist community residents in maintaining property
