- Four Commodore student-athletes hail from Indiana: redshirt sophomore OL Bryce Bailey (Newburgh/Castle), freshman TE Joel DeCoursey (Zionsville/Zionsville Community), graduate quarterback Riley Neal (Yorktown/Yorktown) and redshirt junior DL Cameron Tidd (Greenwood/Center Grove). Bailey, Neal and Tidd were in the Vanderbilt starting lineup versus Georgia.
- Four Commodores have experience playing with Big Ten teams prior to joining the Vanderbilt roster: redshirt sophomore linebacker Leshawn Paulino-Bell (Michigan State), redshirt senior running back Ke'Shawn Vaughn (Illinois), graduate cornerback Cam Watkins (Illinois) and junior cornerback DC Williams (Wisconsin).
- Six Vanderbilt student-athletes earned their first collegiate starts versus Georgia: Dan Dawkins (R-Fr., OG), Kenny Hebert (R-Jr., OLB), Dashaun Jerkins (R-Fr., safety), Grant Miller (R-So., C), Harrison Smith (R-Fr., punter) and Tyler Steen (R-Fr., OT). Three others were first-time starters in a Vanderbilt uniform: Riley Neal (Gr., QB), Cam Watkins (Gr., CB) and DC Williams, (Jr., CB).
- Fifteen players saw their first action as Commodores against Georgia: Neal, Watkins, Williams, Ben Bresnahan (R-Fr., TE), Dae'vion Davis (Fr., DT), Tre Douglas (R-Fr., CB), Rowan Godwin (Gr., OL), Brandon Maddox (Jr., DT), Jaylen Mahoney (Fr., CB), Salua Masina (R-Fr., LB), Elijah McAlister (R-Fr., OLB), Scott Meyer (Gr., LS) Mitchell Pryor (So., RB), Leshawn Paulino Bell (R-So., OLB) and Justice Shelton-Mosley (Gr., WR/PR).
- Vanderbilt is looking for a second victory in its last three road appearances when facing Purdue. The Commodores' last road win was a 45-31 triumph at Arkansas on Oct. 27, 2018.
- The Commodores are playing in Indiana for a second straight year. In 2018, Vanderbilt journeyed to South Bend to face Notre Dame, dropping a close 22-17 decision to the Irish in September.
- Derek Mason is one of just two Vanderbilt head coaches to lead the Commodores to multiple postseason bowl appearances. With 24 wins, Mason is six victories away from joining the program's five winningest coaches.
- Gerry Gdowski moved into the offensive coordinator role for the Commodores this year. Gdowski is the longest-tenured Vanderbilt assistant, having been on campus since Derek Mason's first year in 2014. For the last three years, Gdowski served as quarterbacks coach, helping mold three-year starter and current Kansas City Chiefs quarterback Kyle Shurmur into the Commodores' all-time leading passer.
- Four coaches are new to Derek Mason's staff this season: Devin "Fitz" Fitzsimmons, Jovan Haye, Tim Horton and Matt Weikert. Fitzsimmons serves as tight ends coach and special teams coordinator. Haye, a former Commodore All-SEC defensive end, enters his first year as defensive line coach. Horton comes to the staff as running backs coach after extremely successful SEC tenures. Weikert serves as outside linebackers coach, coming from an 12-year tenure at Air Force.
- The Vanderbilt roster includes six graduate transfers: OL Rowan Godwin (South Alabama), LS Scott Meyer (Alabama), QB Riley Neal (Ball State), WR/R Justice Shelton-Mosley (Harvard), CB Cam Watkins (Illinois), DT Eddie Zinn-Turner (Marist).
- Vanderbilt's 2019 roster includes student-athletes from 27 states.
- The 2019 Vanderbilt Athletics Hall of Fame class was introduced during the Georgia game. The 2019 class includes two Commodore football All-Americans: LB Chris Gaines (1984-87) of Old Hickory, Tennessee, and OT Josh Cody (1914-16, 1919). Previous Commodore gridiron greats named to the Hall of Fame are QB Bill Wade (1949-51), head coach Dan McGugin (1904-17, 1919-34), OL John Hall (1951-54), RB Herb Rich (1946-49), P Jim Arnold (1979-82), OL Will Wolford (1982-85), WR Bucky Curtis (1947-50), OL Carl Hinkle (1935-37), LB Jamie Duncan (1994-97), RB Charley Horton (1953-55), QB Jay Cutler (2002-05), QB Don Orr (1954-56) and WR Earl Bennett (2005-07).
- Vanderbilt University hosted the first opening weekend of SEC Nation, the SEC Network's traveling pregame show. The two-hour program, featuring host Laura Rutledge, Tim Tebow, Marcus Spears, Paul Finebaum and Marty Smith, aired Saturday, Aug. 31 from Vanderbilt's Ingram Commons, the residential area for first-year Commodore students. It was SEC Nation's first appearance on campus since September 2017.
- Vanderbilt's season-opening tilt with Georgia was designated as the program's "Set The Expectation" game. Vanderbilt was the first SEC program to host a "Set The Expectation" game. The event started in June, when Brenda Tracy, a registered nurse from Portland, Oregon, shared with the football team her devastating personal story and vital message of preventing sexual violence. Tracy has addressed dozens of college teams and many more on the high school level in the past year. Tracy also serves on the NCAA's Commission to Combat Campus Sexual Violence. Tracy, who calls her campaign "Set The Expectation," will be in attendance and introduced to the crowd during an on-field recognition.
- Vanderbilt is in its 130th season of college football.

- The first game played between Vanderbilt and Purdue came just three months before the United States entered World War II.
- Vanderbilt's 1941 victory in West Lafayette was considered an upset win for the Commodores. Directed by second-year head coach Red Sanders, Vanderbilt went on to finish 8-2 that season, its best record more than a decade.
- Paul "Bear" Bryant was a second-year offensive line coach for the Commodores in 1941 under Sanders. Both Sanders and Bryant are members of the College Football Hall of Fame.
- Vanderbilt is 1-1 all-time against teams directed by Purdue head coach Jeff Brohm. The Commodores defeated Brohm's 2016 Western Kentucky squad in a 31-30 overtime thriller on Sept. 24 in Bowling Green, and dropped a 14-12 home decision to WKU to open the 2015 campaign.

- In its last game against a Big Ten foe, Vanderbilt dropped a 23-13 decision at Northwestern on Sept. 10, 2012.

Offense

- The Commodores were held to 225 total yards by No. 3 Georgia's defense. Ke'Shawn Vaughn (R-Sr., RB) paced the Commodores with 98 total yards (74 rushing, 24 receiving).
- Riley Neal (Gr., QB) was 14-of-25 (56%) in his first start for the Commodores. Neal served as the starting quarterback at Ball State from 2015-18.
- Justice Shelton-Mosley (Gr., WR) had a 23-yard carry on his first Commodore touch.
- The Vanderbilt offense returned 83% of its total scoring from 2018 (228 of 276 points).
- The Commodores' scoring average in 2018 (28.5 points/game) was the program's highest scoring average since 2012 (30.1 points/game). It also marked Vanderbilt's fourth highest scoring offense since World War II.
- Vanderbilt's total offense in 2018 (411.2 yards/game) was the most since the 1974 squad averaged 412.8 yards en route to a Peach Bowl appearance. Vanderbilt's 6.29 yards per play ranked fourth in the SEC and 21st nationally.
- The Commodores return 82.3% of their 2018 rushing offense, with Ke'Shawn Vaughn (1,244 yards) and Jamauri Wakefield (353 yards) leading the way.
- The Vanderbilt offense committed just 14 total turnovers (eight fumbles, six interceptions) in 2018. The Commodores ranked tied for 20th nationally with a plus-8 turnover margin.
- Thirty-five of TE Jared Pinkney's 50 receptions in 2018 resulted in first downs, tops in the SEC. Pinkney's 78.8 grade from a year ago is best among returning SEC tight ends.
- Ke'Shawn Vaughn's 7.9-yard/rush is the highest average by a modern-day Commodore running back.
- Vaughn's breakaway percentage of 60.1% in 2018 topped all SEC backs.
- Vaughn averaged a SEC-best 5.28 yards after contact in 2018. In the Texas Bowl alone, 161 of Vaughn's 243 rushing yards came after contact.
- Vaughn produced 32 rushes of 10+ yards in 2018.
- Vaughn produced 749 rushing yards and seven touchdowns in final five games of 2018, averaging 149.8 yards/game.
- WR Kalija Lipscomb was sensational on third and fourth downs in 2018, catching 74% of his targets. He had an SEC-best 27 receptions, including six touchdowns, on third downs.
- Lipscomb's eight touchdowns in home games were tied for fourth nationally among power conference players.
- In the final five games of 2019, the Commodore offense averaged 37.0 points and 466.8 total yards (209.8 rushing/235.4 passing).
- The Commodores are one of seven FBS teams to score 28 or more points in each of their last five games.
- Five offensive players enter 2019 with double-digit career starts: TE Jared Pinkney (30), OL Devin Cochran (23), WR Kalija Lipscomb (23), OL Cole Clemens (14), OL Saige Young (13.)
- Vanderbilt had five turnover-free games in 2018, tied for the second most in the SEC.
- Over the last five games of 2018, Vanderbilt ranked among the SEC's top five offenses in points (37.0 - 2nd), total yards (466.8 - 3rd), yards per play (6.8 - 3rd), rushing yards (209.8 - 5th), yards per rush (5.8 - 3rd) and passing yards (257.0 - 5th). Over the same stretch, the unit ranked second in the SEC by averaging just 0.4 giveaways per game.
- The Commodores return 84.6% of their receiving yards from a year ago. The team's top returning receivers from 2018 include Kalija Lipscomb (87 receptions, 916 yards, 9 TDs), Jared Pinkney (50-774-7) and C.J. Bolar (34-440-2).

Defense

- The Commodores impressed on third downs in the opener, limiting No. 3 Georgia to one conversion in seven attempts. Vanderbilt also stopped Georgia's only fourth-down attempt.
- Daushan Jerkins (R-Fr., safety) made the most of his first collegiate start. Jerkins posted 14 tackles, including 10 solo stops. It was the highest total tackle by a Commodore defender since linebacker Jordan Griffin registered 18 tackles at Kentucky (Oct. 20, 2018). Jerkins also returned a fumble 12 yards for the unit's only turnover.
- Feleti Afemui (R-Fr., ILB) had a career-high eight tackles in his second career start.
- Kenny Hebert (R-Jr., OLB) had five tackles, his highest total as a Commodore, and one tackle for loss.
- Jerkins, Hebert, Cam Watkins (Gr., CB) and DC Williams (Jr., CB) earned their first starts as Commodores.
- In 2018, Vanderbilt produced the fourth-largest increase nationally in takeaways from the previous year. The '18 defense caused 22 takeaways, 13 more than in 2017. It also marked the most takeaways by a Commodore defense since 2013.
- With 84 tackles in 2018, ILB Dimitri Moore was the SEC's top freshman tackler. Moore earned SEC All-Freshman recognition for his performance.
- The Commodore defense should benefit from added experience after more than a dozen key players realized their first collegiate action in 2018. Thirteen defenders return with a season of experience under their belt: Afemui, B.J. Anderson (R-Fr., CB), Colin Anderson (R-So., LB), Brayden DeVault-Smith (R-So., ILB), Stone Edwards (R-So., DE), Allan George (R-So., CB), Randall Haynie (R-So., CB), Brendon Harris (R-Fr., S), Dimitri Moore (R-So., ILB), Alston Orji (So., ILB), Michael Owusu (R-So., OLB), Rutger Reitmeier (R-So., DT/DE) and Max Worship (So., S).
- Two veteran newcomers at cornerback, graduate transfer Cam Watkins and junior DC Williams, are competing for key roles in the secondary. The Commodores will feature new starters at both cornerback positions after the departures of Donovan Sheffield and current New England Patriot Joejuan Williams.
- The 2018 defense accumulated 13 interceptions in 2018, the highest total of the Mason era.
- The Commodores were stout in the red zone in 2018, ranking fifth in the SEC in 2018 by keeping opponents out of the end zone at a 48% clip. They also held foes without points on 10 of 54 possessions inside the 20-yard line.

Special Teams

- Devin "Fitz" Fitzsimmons has brought energy and plenty of buy-in through the Commodore roster in his first year as special teams coordinator.
- Senior Ryley Guay was 2-of-2 on field goals against Georgia, converting from 26 and 46 yards. The 46-yarder was the second longest of Guay's career.
- Redshirt freshman Harrison Smith made the most of his first start against Georgia. He averaged 47.1 yards on seven punts, with three of 50+ yards.
- Guay converted 13 field goals in 2018, including a 53-yarder against Florida that matched the fifth-longest in team history.
- Redshirt junior Jamauri Wakefield's 22.4 career kickoff return average through two years ranks fifth in program history.
- After returning just 33% of 48 punts last year, the Commodores added graduate transfer Justice Shelton-Mosley from Harvard as a potential replacement for 2018 returner Trey Ellis. Shelton-Mosley was a FCS All-American in 2017 and two-time All-Ivy first team recipient who averaged 14.4 yards/return from 2015-18. He also returned three punts for touchdowns at Harvard. Shelton-Mosley did not have a return against Georgia.

Notes

• In 2018, Derek Mason became the second Vanderbilt head coach to guide multiple Commodore squads to postseason bowls. During his tenure, Mason has led the Commodores to the 2018 Texas Bowl and the 2016 Independence Bowl. Mason joins James Franklin (2011-13) as the only Vanderbilt head coaches to oversee multiple bowl appearances. Mason's tenure also has been highlighted by successes in regional matchups. Under Mason's direction, the Commodores have won their last eight consecutive games against teams located in the state of Tennessee, including three straight versus cross-state rival Tennessee.

• Coming off one of the best seasons ever achieved by a Commodore, WR Kalija Lipscomb has a chance to cap his career as one of the top receivers in league history. Lipscomb experienced a break-through campaign in 2018, hauling in 87 passes for 916 yards and nine touchdowns. Lipscomb's receptions total topped the SEC. His season totals for receiving yardage and touchdown catches also ranked among league leaders.

• After earning second-team All-SEC recognition last year, Lipscomb enters the 2019 season as the league's active leader with 154 catches, 1,853 receiving yards and 19 touchdown receptions.

• Lipscomb, who had a career-high 174 receiving yards and two touchdowns vs. Tennessee State on Sept. 29, 2018, registered at least four catches in 11 of 13 games, including a 11-catch performance at Notre Dame.

• Lipscomb enters the season with needing seven touchdown catches to break the career school record held by Jordan Matthews (2010-13).

• Jared Pinkney, one of the nation's finest tight ends, enters his final season as a top candidate for the Walter Camp Award, John Mackey Award and Biletnikoff Award

• Pinkney, who earned second-team All-SEC recognition from the Associated Press last season, is the SEC's top returning tight end in terms of receptions, receiving yards and touchdown receptions. The three-year starter from Norcross, Georgia, hauled in 50 catches (second-most nationally by a returning tight end) in 2018, good for 774 receiving yards (most nationally by a returning tight end) and seven touchdowns (most by a returning SEC tight end). His 32 receptions on first downs in 2018 topped all returning tight ends.

• Pinkney's 2018 reception and yardage totals were the most by a Vanderbilt tight end since Chuck Scott had 70 catches and 54 catches in 1983 and 1984, respectively.

• Pinkney received John Mackey Award Tight End of the Week twice in 2018. Pinkney's initial recognition came after a five-catch, 111-yard, one-touchdown effort at Notre Dame, where he became just the third SEC tight end in last four years to post 100+ receiving yards vs. a top-10 team. It was also the first 100-yard receiving game by a SEC tight end on the road vs. a top-10 foe since 2014.

• A 30-game career starter, Pinkney has amassed 96 catches, 1,338 receiving yards and 12 touchdowns.

Notes

- Doak Walker Award candidate Ke'Shawn Vaughn enters his final season off one of the best seasons ever produced by a Vanderbilt running back.

- In the opener against Georgia, Vaughn paced the Commodores with 74 rushing yards on 15 carries and matched a team high with three receptions for 24 yards.

- The Commodore offense were backed up for much of the Georgia opener. None of Vanderbilt's 11 possessions started beyond their own 25-yard line.

- The senior put together a tremendous close to the 2018 campaign, amassing 749 yards (149.8 yards/game) and seven touchdowns in his last five appearances. He capped the year even more remarkably, rushing for 243 yards and two touchdowns on just 13 carries in the Texas Bowl. Always saving his best for last, Vaughn averaged an amazing 8.5 yards/rush in fourth-quarter plays.

- Vaughn racked up SEC Newcomer of the Year from the Associated Press, becoming the first Commodore to claim the award. He also earned Big Ten Newcomer of the Year in 2015 at Illinois.

- Vaughn finished the 2018 season with 1,244 rushing yards, second in the SEC behind only Kentucky's Benny Snell. He also posted 12 rushing touchdowns, the third highest total in the league.

- Vaughn displayed remarkable explosiveness, topping the conference with a 7.9-yards/carry average (second-highest average by a 1,000-yard SEC back since 2000). Among Vaughn's SEC-best 10 carries of 40+ yards were scoring rushes of 78 yards against Tennessee State, 69 and 68 yards against Baylor in the Texas Bowl, 65 yards at Missouri and 63 yards at Arkansas. He also led the SEC with six carries of 60 or more yards.

- Vaughn, a product of Pearl-Cohn High School in Nashville, became the sixth Vanderbilt back to reach 1,000 rushing yards in a season. His 1,244-yard rushing is the team's second highest total, trailing only the 1,283-yard total amassed by Ralph Webb in 2016.

- The 2019 Vanderbilt defense will look to continue forcing turnovers under second-year coordinator Jason Tarver. Tarver's 2018 defense produced 22 takeaways, the most by a Commodore squad since 2013 season.

- The 2018 defense produced nine fumble recoveries, seven more than in 2017. The unit also had 13 interceptions, the most of the Derek Mason era. The takeaways have helped Vanderbilt to a positive turnover margin, a statistical category historically important to Vanderbilt team success. The Commodores had one takeaway in the opener against Georgia.

- The defensive unit versus Georgia featured four new starters: Kenny Hebert (R-Jr., OLB), Cam Watkins (Gr., CB), Dashaun Jerkins (R-Fr., safety) and DC Williams (Jr., CB). They combined for 28 tackles (19 solo) and a fumble recovery.

- Moore, a 2018 SEC All-Freshman recipient, was the team's second leading tackler with 47 unassisted tackles and 84 total tackles. Moore also ranked as the leading tackler among all SEC freshmen last year.

- Dare Odeyingbo (Jr., DE) contributed seven tackles for loss, six quarterback hurries and a pair of fumble recoveries in 2018. He ranks as the team's active leader with five sacks. He opened the 2019 season with four stops, including a tackle for loss.

- Birchmeier, who started 11 games at defensive tackle in 2018, posted a pair of forced fumbles along with 31 total tackles.

- Hebert (R-Jr., OLB) ranks as the team's active leader with four quarterback sacks from a year ago. His two fumble recoveries also shares team honors with Odeyingbo.

- Two young cornerbacks, Allan George (R-So.) and Randall Haynie (R-So.), shared the 2018 team lead with five defended passes.

Turner Cockrell

- The Commodores remember Vanderbilt student-athlete Turner Cockrell, who passed away on Nov. 29, 2018, after a long battle with cancer. He was 21.
- Cockrell, a third-year tight end on the Commodores' football team, fought bravely after being diagnosed with melanoma in his lymph nodes in November 2017. Despite surgery and treatment that winter, scans determined that the cancer had spread to Cockrell's lungs last summer.
- Cockrell, a native of Acworth, Georgia, is survived by his parents, Randy and Noelle, and two siblings, brother Parker and sister Katheryn.
- The Commodores also wore helmet stickers with Cockrell's No. 82 during a 38-13 victory over Tennessee in the regular-season finale and at the 2018 Texas Bowl.
- This year, the Commodores will introduce a new custom uniform known as the "Battle Ready" apparel. A matching helmet for the uniform is donned with 82 rivets to honor Cockrell.
- Cody Markel, one of Cockrell's fellow tight ends on the roster and among his close friends, has founded "Turner's Heroes," a non-profit that creates hero capes and related activities for ailing youngsters being treated in children's hospital. Turner's parents are members of the non-profit.
- In July, at Vanderbilt Children's Hospital, Markel saw his vision come to life, a vision that included sights not normally associated with either hospitals or college football: plenty of glitter, stickers and glue guns, and giggling children running around in colorful, personalized superhero capes.
- According to Cockrell's parents, Markel could not have devised a more perfect way to honor their son than through Turner's Heroes, the non-profit created by Markel. Markel, a non-scholarship senior from Middleton, Wisconsin, has been nominated for the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Good Works team and National Football Foundation Campbell Trophy.

Feeding Nashville's Homeless

- Wanting to help feed Nashville's homeless and disadvantaged communities, junior quarterback Mo Hasan turned to the Vanderbilt training table for assistance.
- Through his non-profit Second Spoon effort, Hasan, teammates and other Vanderbilt student-athletes have devised a system to deliver extra food from the athletes' dining hall to the homeless living on Nashville's streets.
- This past summer, Hasan and his Commodore helpers spent Friday afternoons at the Nashville mission distributing up to 150 meals to those in need.

Academic Achievement

- Off the field, 59 student-athletes on the 2018 football team earned a grade-point average of 3.0 or higher, including 18 on the dean's list (3.5 or higher) and four with a perfect 4.0.
- Forty Commodores landed on the SEC Academic Honor roll, and Vanderbilt scored a 991 in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate scores, the highest of any SEC program and fourth-best among Power 5 schools.

Aloha from West End

- The Vanderbilt roster includes three residents of Hawaii: offensive linemen Sean McMoore (Kapolei) and Jonah Buchanan (Honolulu), and inside linebacker Feleti Afemui (Kahului). Afemui is the first player from his high school conference to earn a scholarship in the SEC.
- The Commodores have scheduled a home-and-home series with Hawaii in 2022-23.

Commodores Overseas

- Three members of the football team -- Kenny Hebert (R-Jr., OLB), Braden Kopp (R-Jr., TE) and Andre Mintze (R-Jr., OLB) -- spent last May studying in France.

Horton a Perfect Fit

- Mentoring All-SEC backs like Ke'Shawn Vaughn isn't new to first-year Commodore running backs coach Tim Horton. In previous stints with Auburn and Arkansas, Horton worked with some of the nation's top backs, including Tre Mason, Cameron Artis Payne and Kerryon Johnson at Auburn and Darren McFarren, Felix Jones and Knile Davis at Arkansas.

West End Pipelines

- Four high schools -- St. Thomas Aquinas (Fort Lauderdale, Fla.), Brentwood Academy (Brentwood, Tenn.), Pearl-Cohn (Nashville) and Andalusia (Ala.) -- are well represented on the Vanderbilt roster.
- Six graduates of St. Thomas Aquinas, a perennial power in south Florida, are on the Commodore roster: Frank Coppet (R-Jr., S), Julian Hernandez (Fr., OL), Grant Miller (R-So., OL), Lashawn Paulino-Bell (Jr., OLB), Tyler Steen (R-Fr., OL) and DC Williams (Jr., CB).
- Four players are from Pearl-Cohn: Brayden DeVault-Smith (R-So., ILB), Jayden Harrison (Fr., WR), Ke'Shawn Vaughn (R-Sr., RB) and Cam Watkins (Grad., CB).
- Four players also attended Brentwood Academy: Nate Clifton (Fr., DL), Cam Johnson (R-Fr., WR), Gavin Schoenwald (R-Fr., TE) and Harrison Smith (So., P).
- Andalusia (Ala.) has three graduates with Vanderbilt: BJ Anderson (R-Fr., CB), Will Clark (So., FB) and Allan George (R-So., CB).
- The SEC Network premiered *Homecoming with Willie Geist* on Aug. 30. In the show, Geist, host of NBC's *Sunday Today* program and co-anchor of MSNBC's *Morning Joe*, sat down with Paul Finebaum to discuss his days as a Vanderbilt undergraduate and his continuing support of the Commodores.

Vanderbilt University • Vanderbilt Athletics

- Vanderbilt is ranked 14th among national universities by U.S. News & World Report. It ranks seventh in best value schools by the magazine.
- According to the 2019 Princeton Review, Vanderbilt ranks third for best quality of life, happiest students and most beautiful campuses in the nation.
- The university was founded in 1873 with a \$1 million gift from "Commodore" Cornelius Vanderbilt. Kirkland Hall, which continues as the main administration building on campus, is the only original structure that remains today.
- Vanderbilt teams have captured five NCAA championships, all since 2007. The Commodore baseball team won the most recent national trophy, claiming the 2019 College World Series in June. It was the second NCAA title for head coach Tim Corbin and the Vanderbilt baseball team. Other NCAA titles have been earned by women's bowling (2007, 2018) and women's tennis (2015).
- In 2018-19, Vanderbilt had the smallest undergraduate enrollment (6,861) and total enrollment (12,824) in the Southeastern Conference.
- Vanderbilt is a charter member of the Southeastern Conference.
- Vanderbilt Athletics is the only Power 5 Conference member with an African American in the key roles of athletics director (Malcolm Turner), football head coach (Derek Mason) and men's basketball head coach (Jerry Stackhouse).
- Less than 10% of 34,313 high school applications were accepted for admission to Vanderbilt in 2018-19.
- Sixty-four percent of Vanderbilt's 2018-19 freshman class came from public schools.
- All 50 states are represented by Vanderbilt's diverse undergraduate enrollment.
- The largest college on campus is Arts & Science with 4,036 undergraduates. The Blair School of Music is the smallest college with 217 students.
- Ninety percent of students live on campus, which features 20 residential halls and apartments.
- There are more than 139,000 living alumni of the university.
- The 330-acre Vanderbilt campus, situated in an urban setting just two miles from business and governmental core of Nashville, is designated as an arboretum, and features approximately 190 species of trees and shrubs.
- Sixty-five percent of Vanderbilt undergraduates receive some sort of financial aid.
- The Jean and Alexander Heard Library system contains over eight million items across 10 libraries on campus and stands as one of the nation's top research libraries.
- Notable Vanderbilt alumni include PGA Tour FedEx Cup winner Brandt Snedeker, LPGA golfer and 2019 Solheim Cup USA team member Marina Alex, NBA champions Will Perdue, Festus Ezeli and Damian Jones, numerous Major League Baseball standouts such as David Price, Sonny Gray, Dansby Swanson and Walker Buehler, and more than 20 players active in the NFL such as cornerbacks Casey Hayward and Joejuan Williams, wide receiver Jordan Matthews, linebackers Zach Cunningham and Oren Burks, lineman Stephen Weatherly and receiver Trent Sheffield.
- Off the field, other prominent alumni include NBC Sunday Morning Show host and MSNBC's Morning Joe co-host Willie Geist, country music star Dierks Bentley, best-selling author James Patterson, FOX Sports commentator Skip Bayless and ESPN baseball expert Buster Olney.

Vanderbilt Drops Opener

NASHVILLE, Tenn. - Vanderbilt could not slow down Georgia's ground game in the Commodores' season opener, as the third-ranked Bulldogs opened the season Saturday night with a 30-6 win.

Vanderbilt debuted a new starting quarterback in Riley Neal along with new offensive coordinator Gerry Gdowski. The Commodores also had Ke'Shawn Vaughn, the SEC's top returning rusher who ran for 1,244 yards last season, and the league's top returning receiver in Kalija Lipscomb.

But the Commodores were without three starters, including two on the offensive line with both left tackle Devin Cochran and left guard Saige Young out with injuries. That left Neal with little time to throw against a Georgia defense that returned seven starters on a unit that was 15th nationally giving up just 19.2 points a game last season.

Neal finished 15 of 25 for 85 yards before being replaced by Deuce Wallace for the final possession. Vaughn was held to 74 yards on 15 carries.

Vanderbilt managed a pair of field goals by Ryley Guay of 26 and 46 yards.

D'Andre Swift ran 16 times for 149 yards, and Brian Herrien added 65 and a touchdown run as the Bulldogs rolled up 326 yards rushing. Georgia finished with a 481-225 edge in total offense, and the Bulldogs also had two sacks and recovered a fumble.
