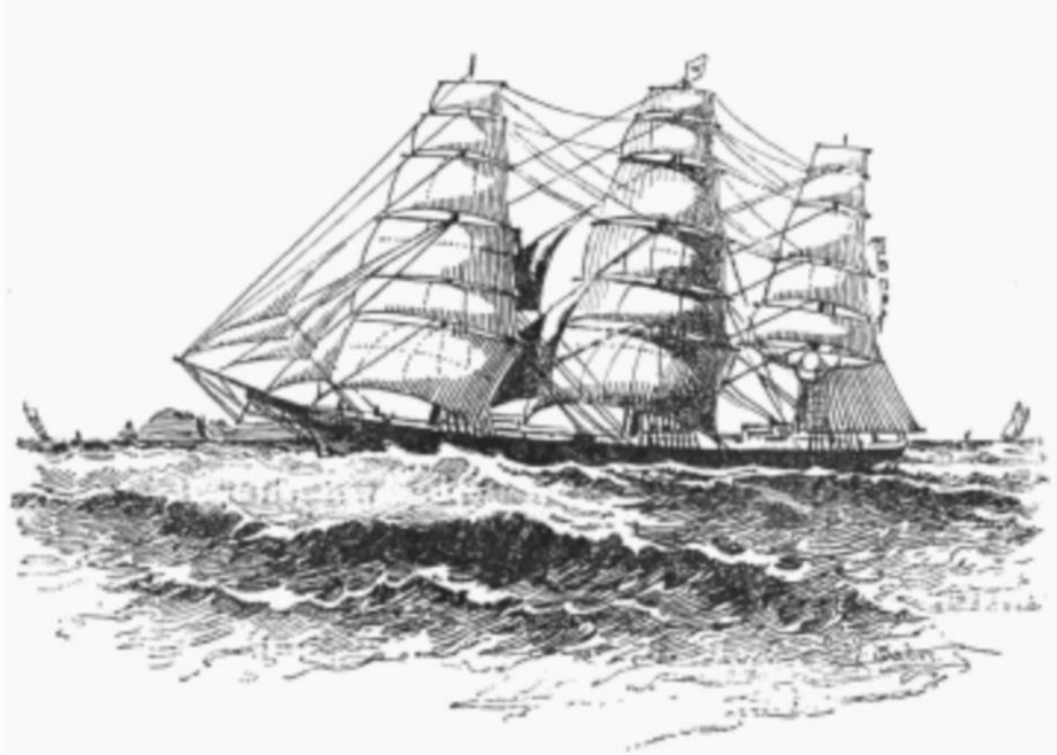

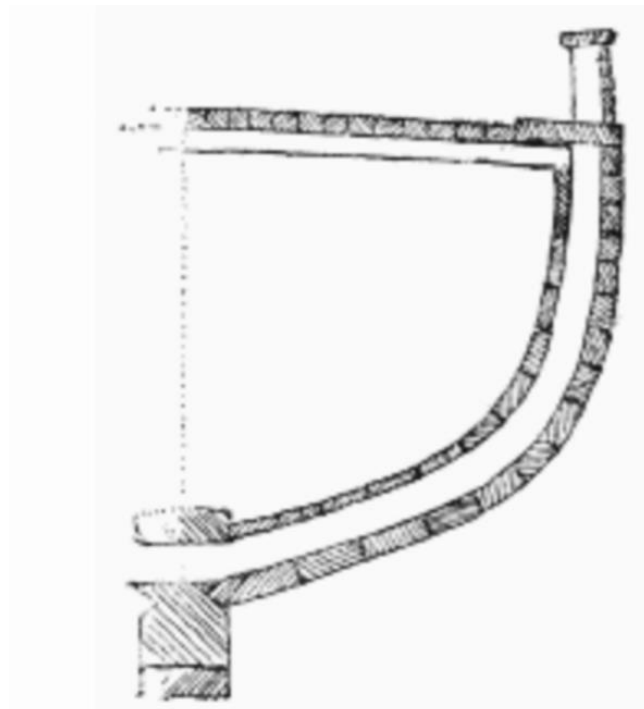


*The "Spray" - From a Photograph Taken in Australian Waters.*



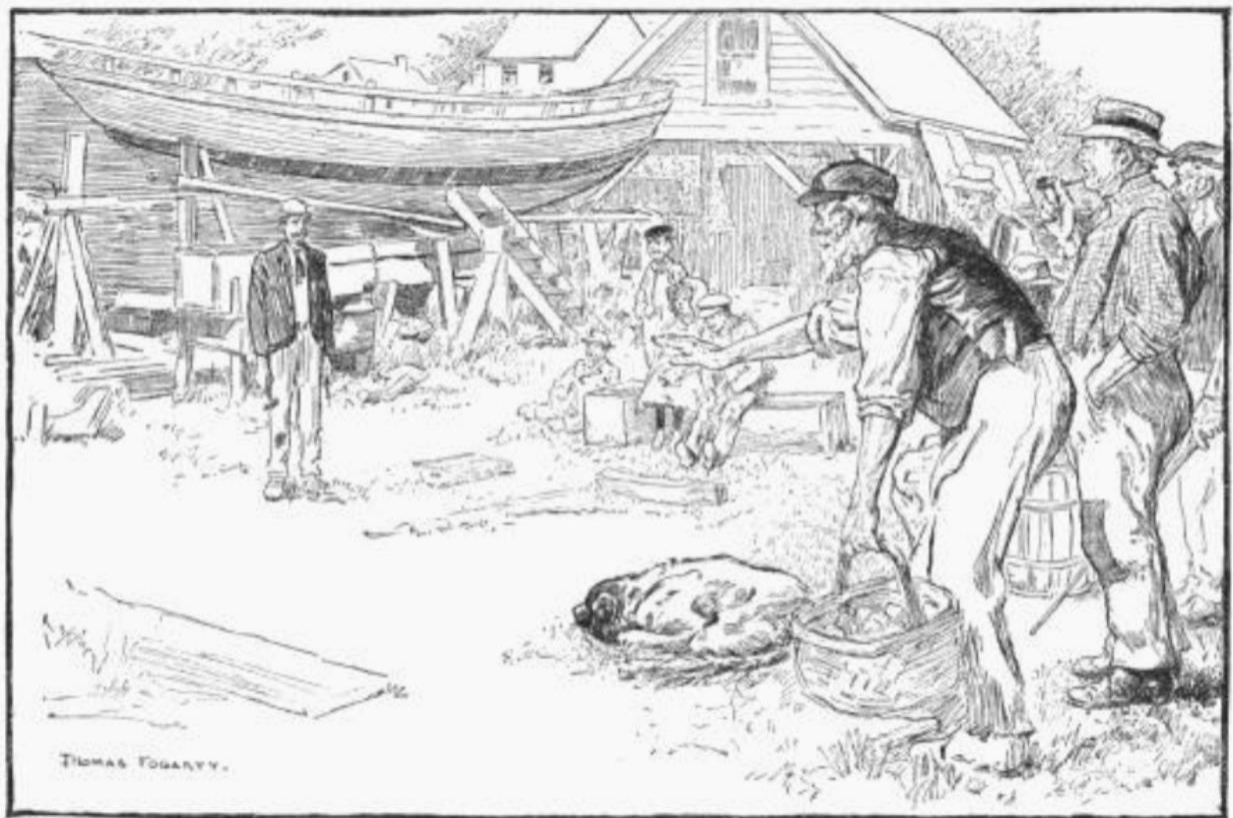


*The "Northern Light," Captain Joshua Slocum, Bound for Liverpool, 1885*

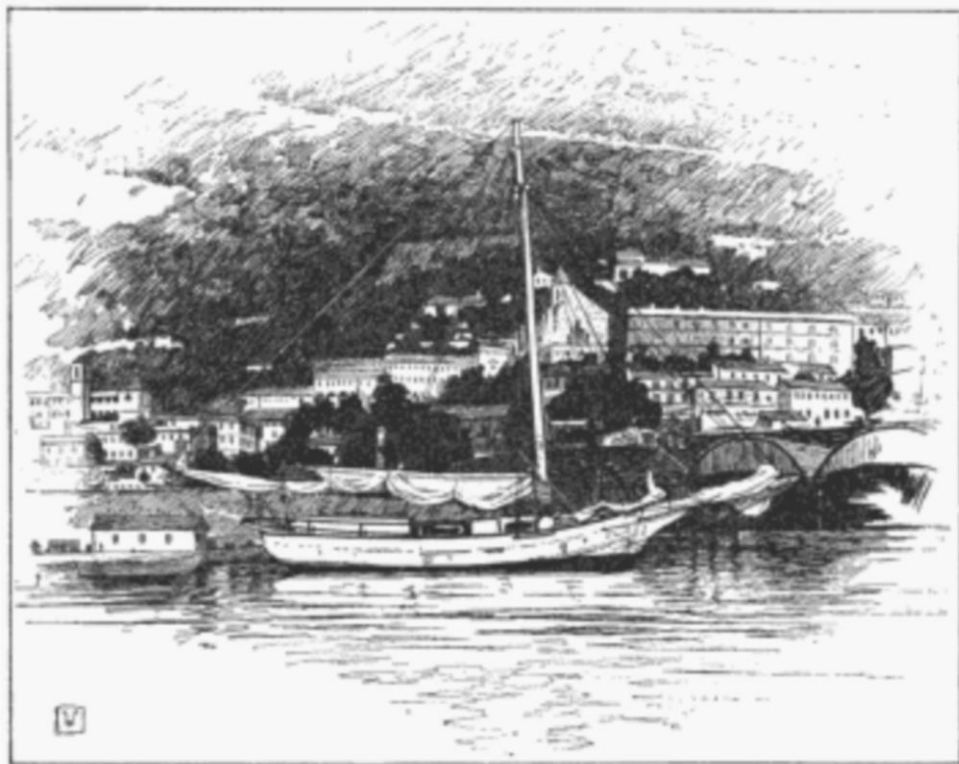

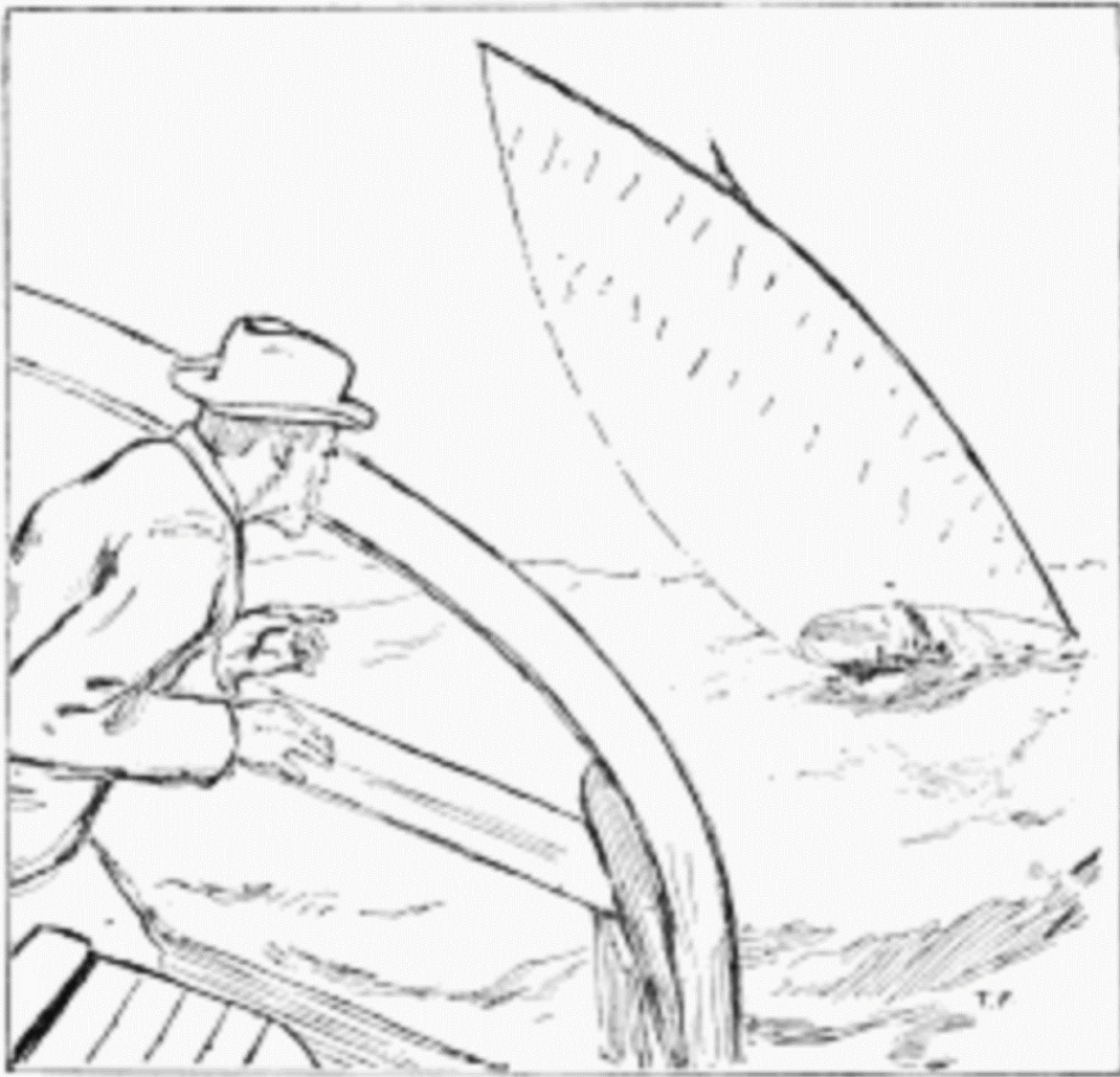

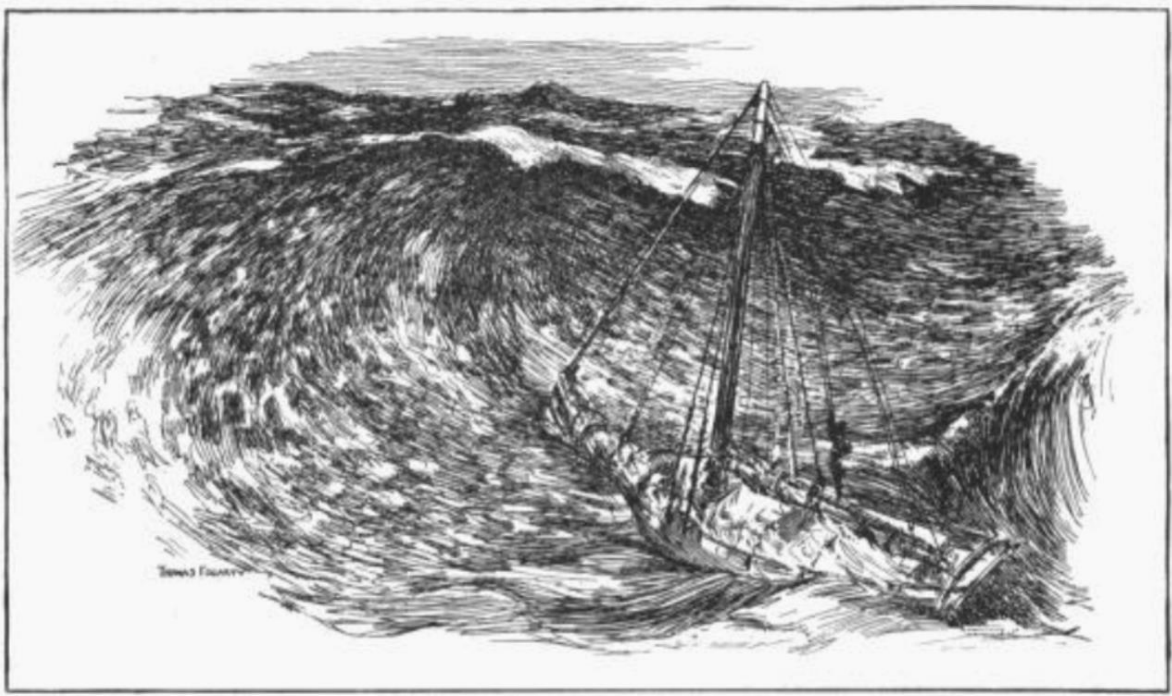

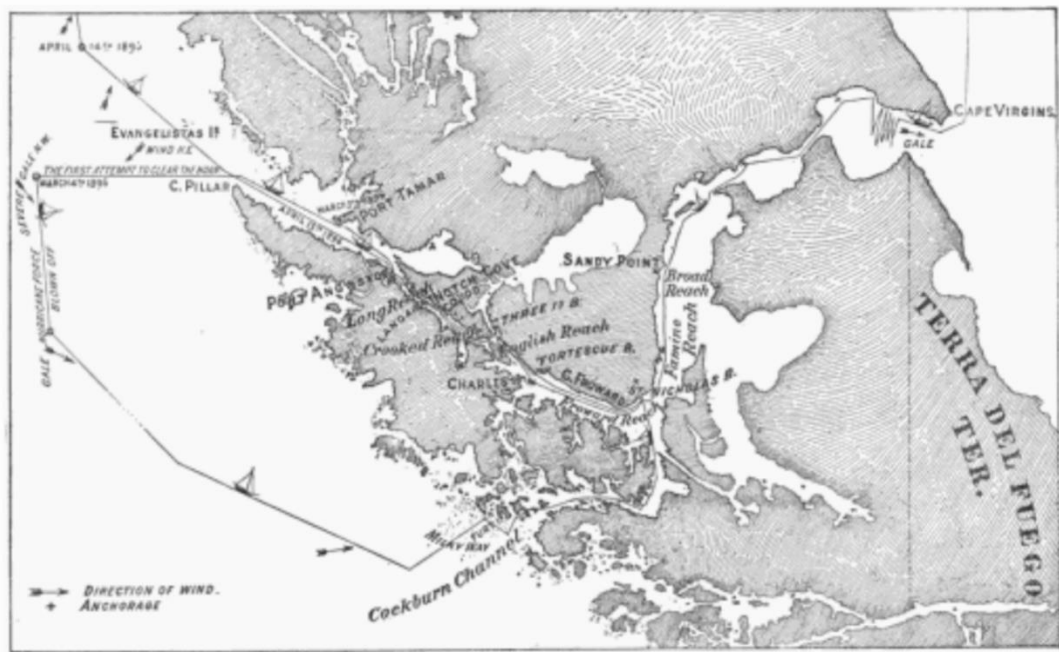

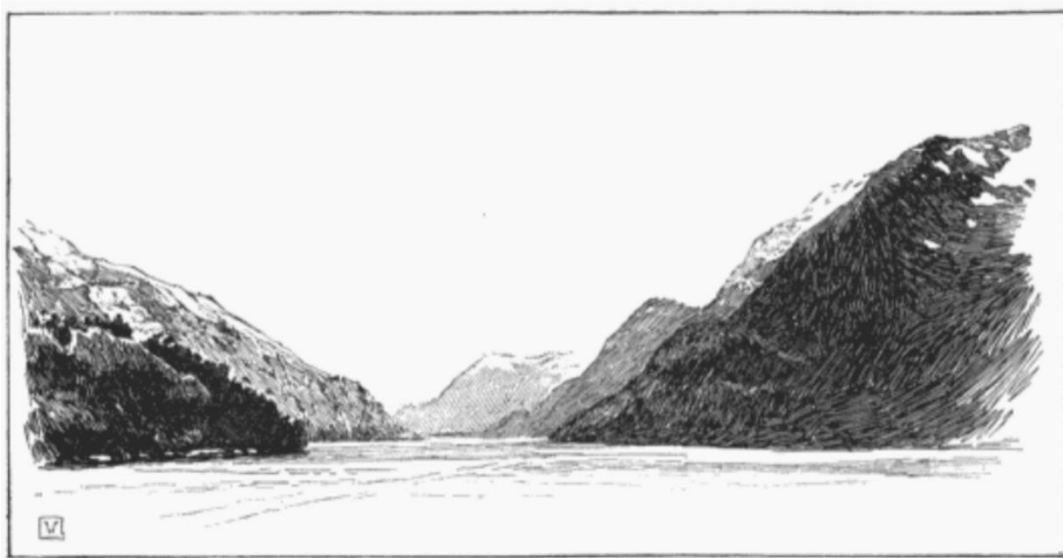

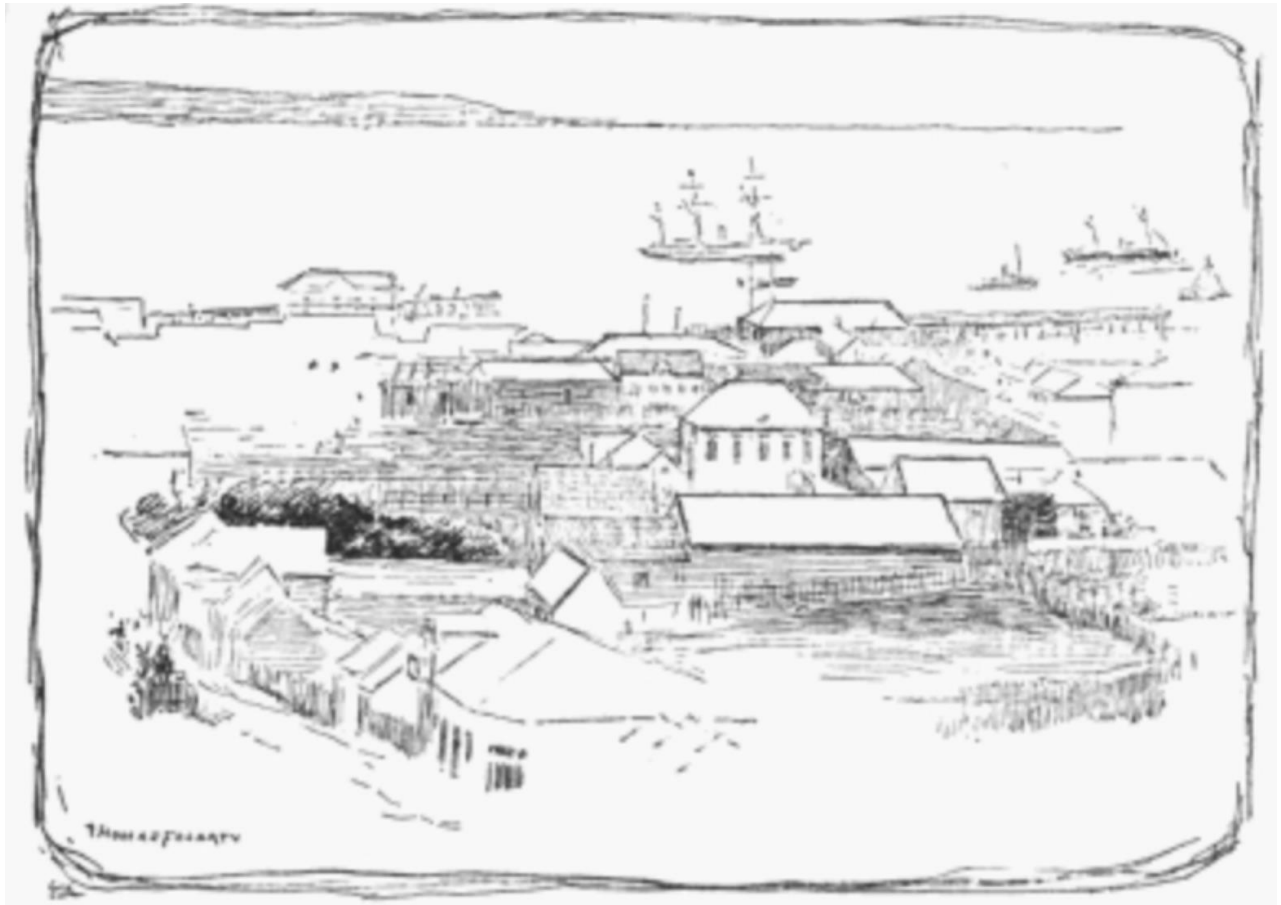

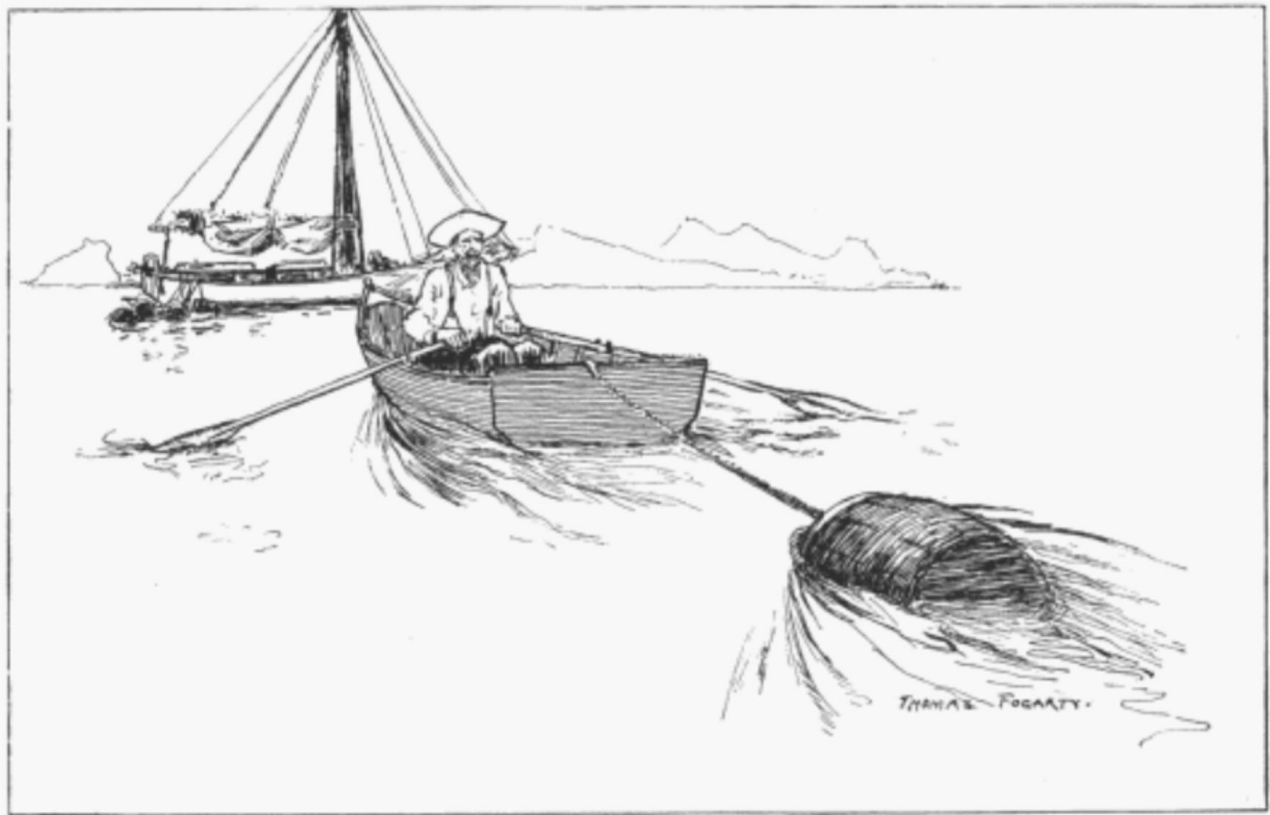

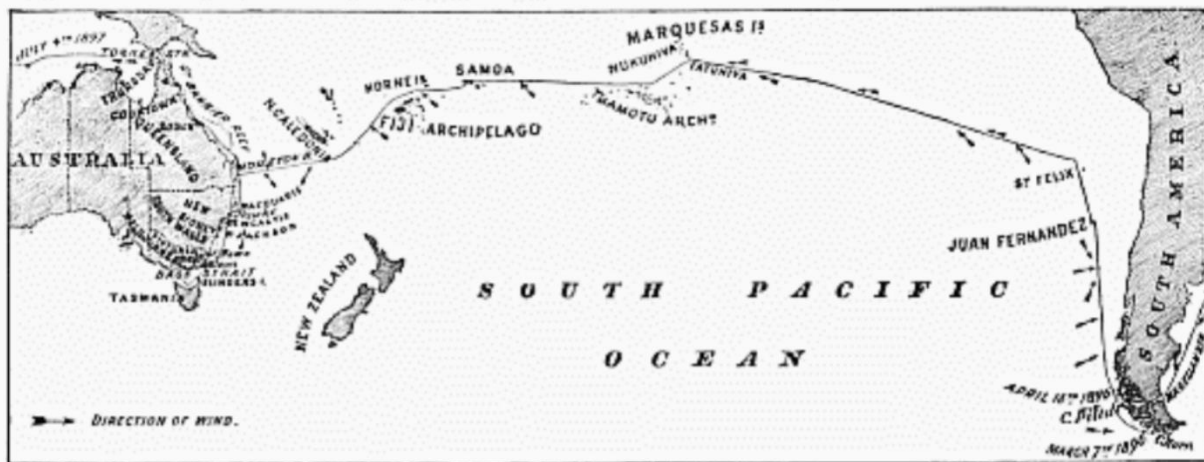

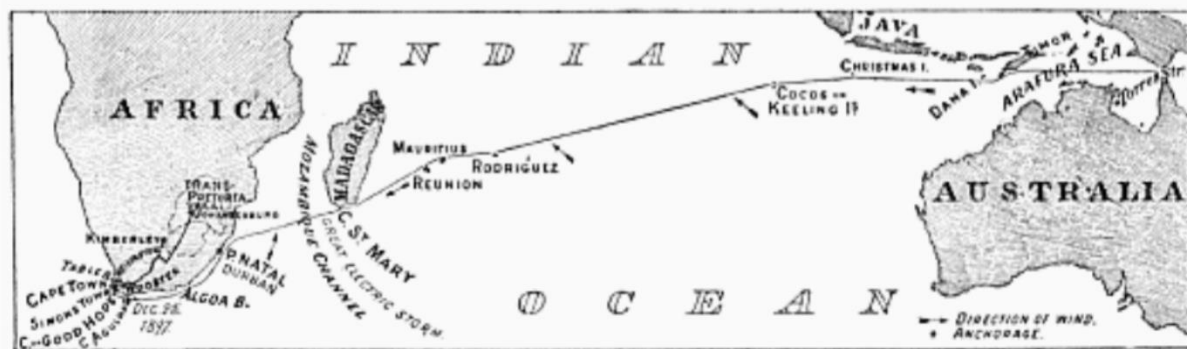

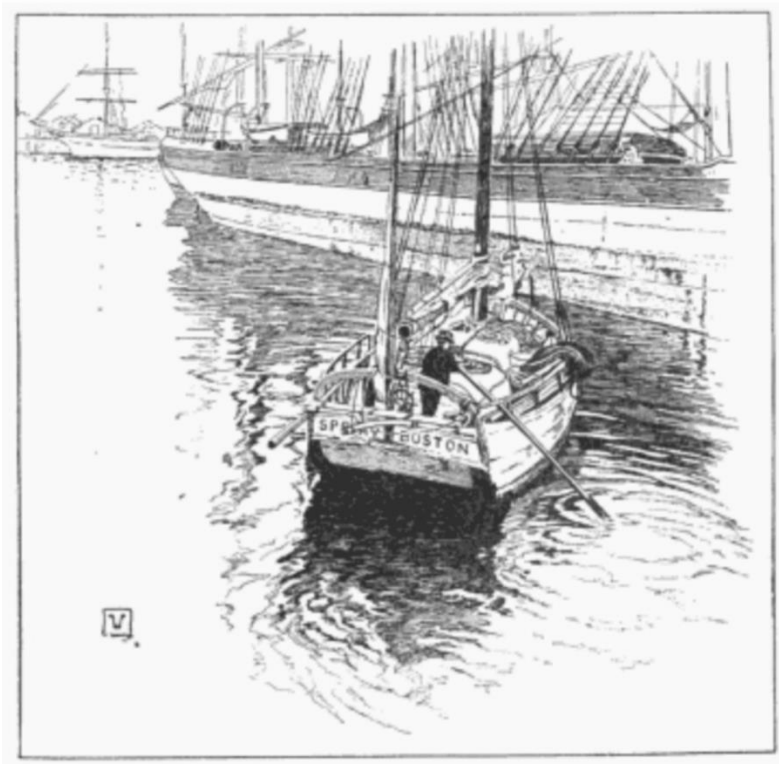

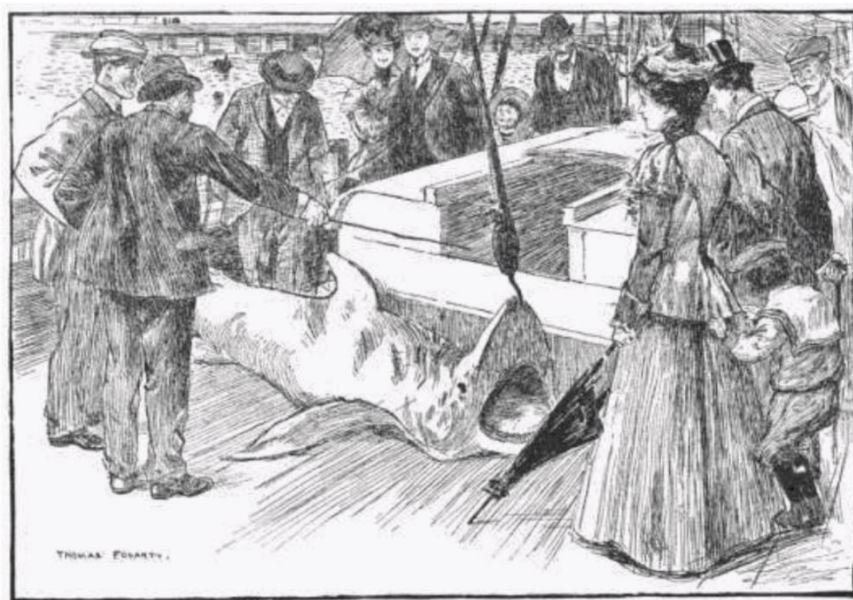

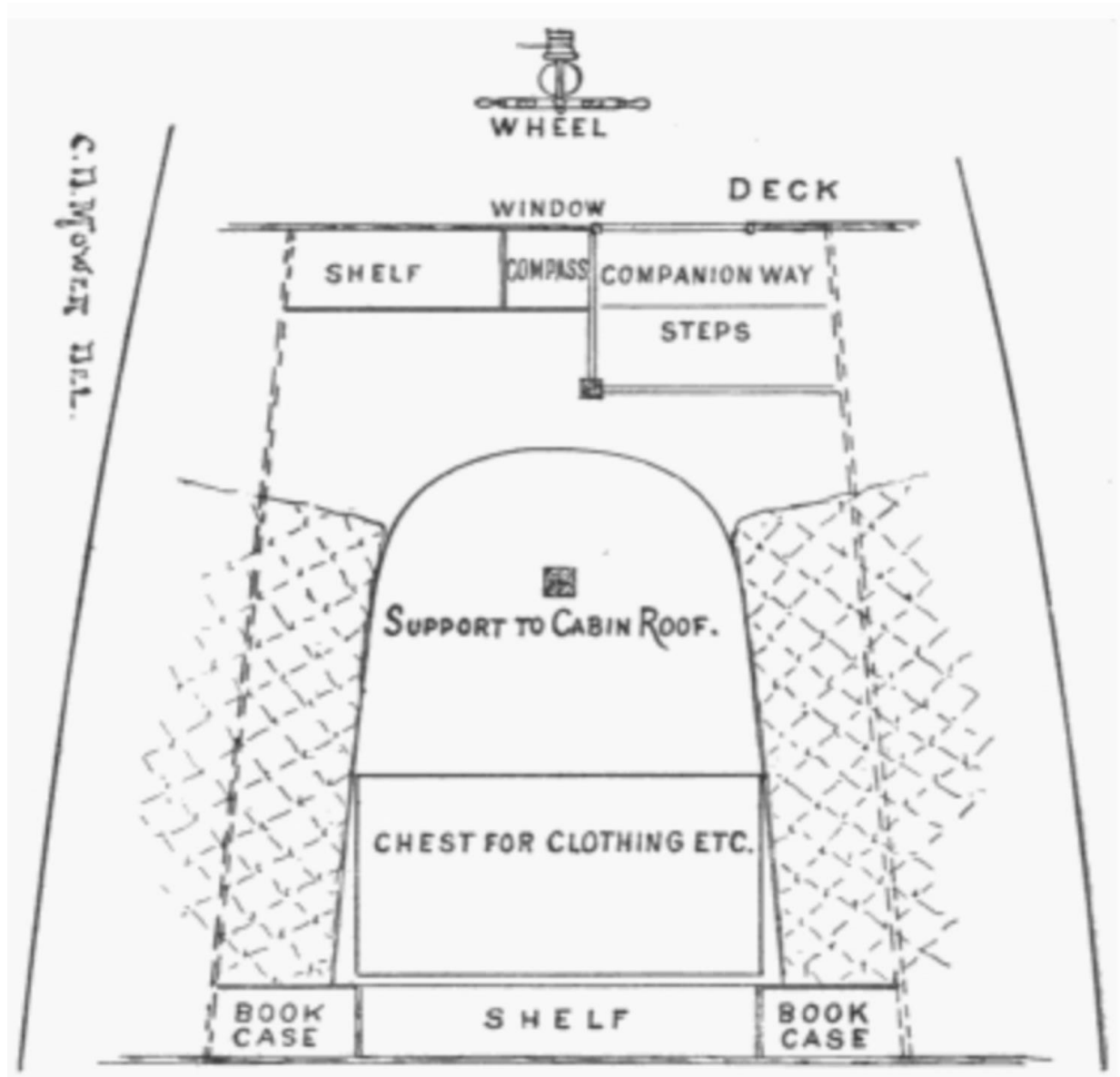

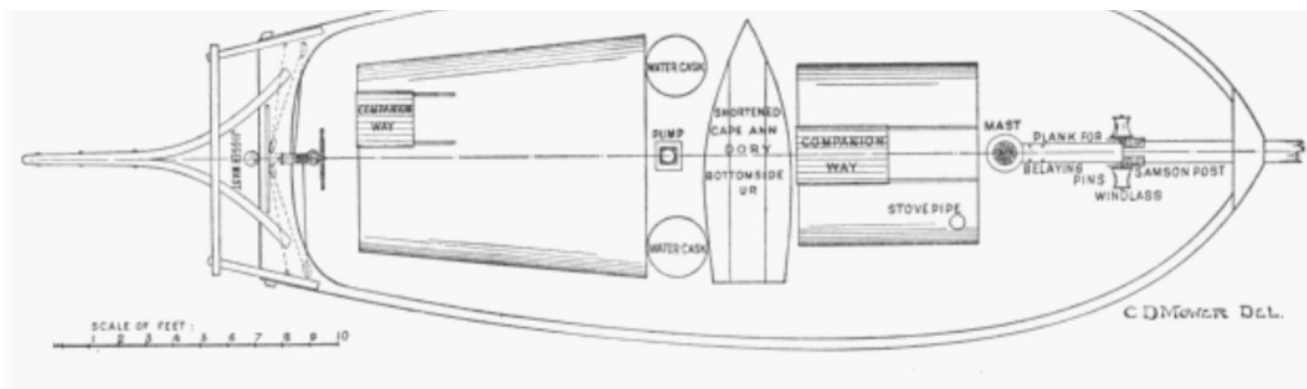

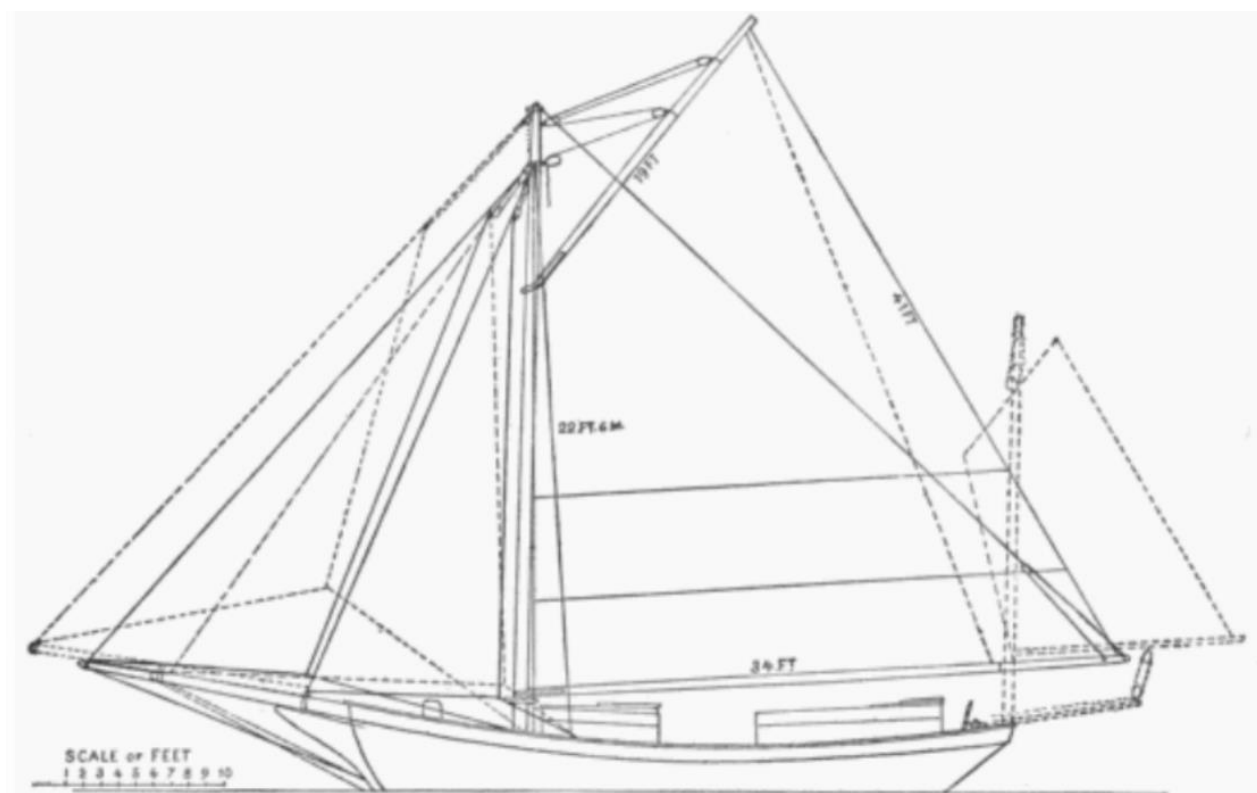

*Plan of the After Cabin of the Spray*

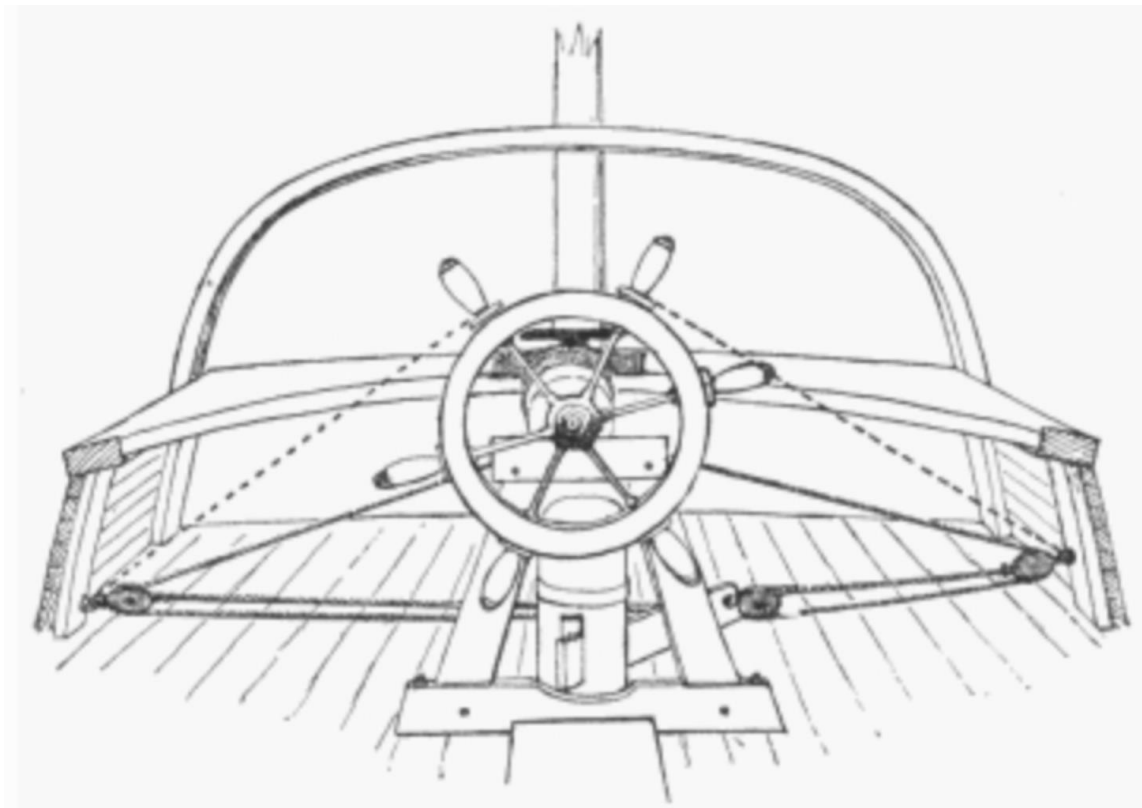


*Deck-plan of the Spray*

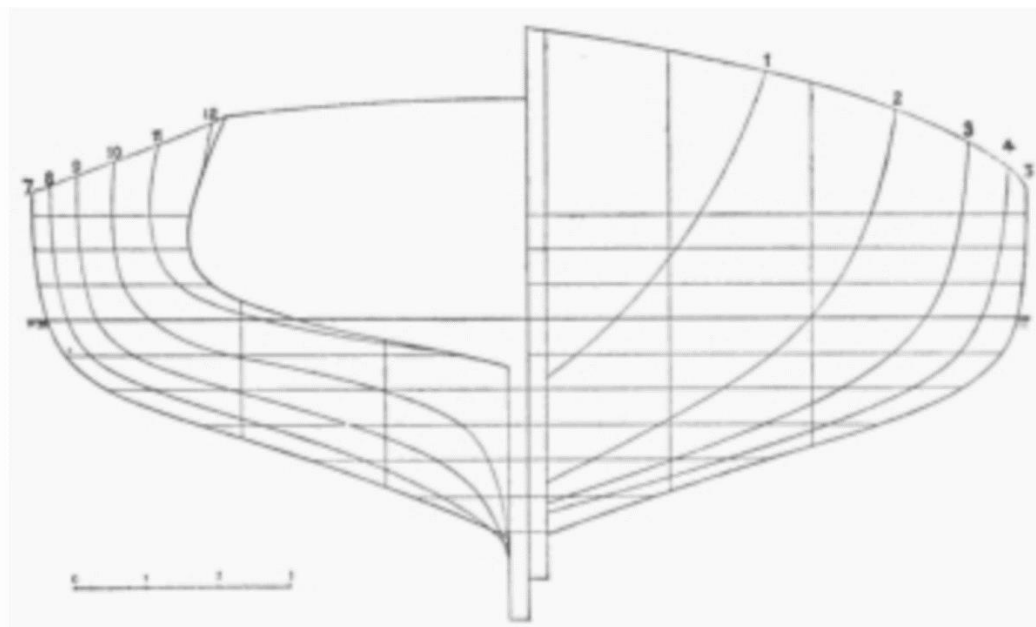


*Sail-Plan of the Spray*

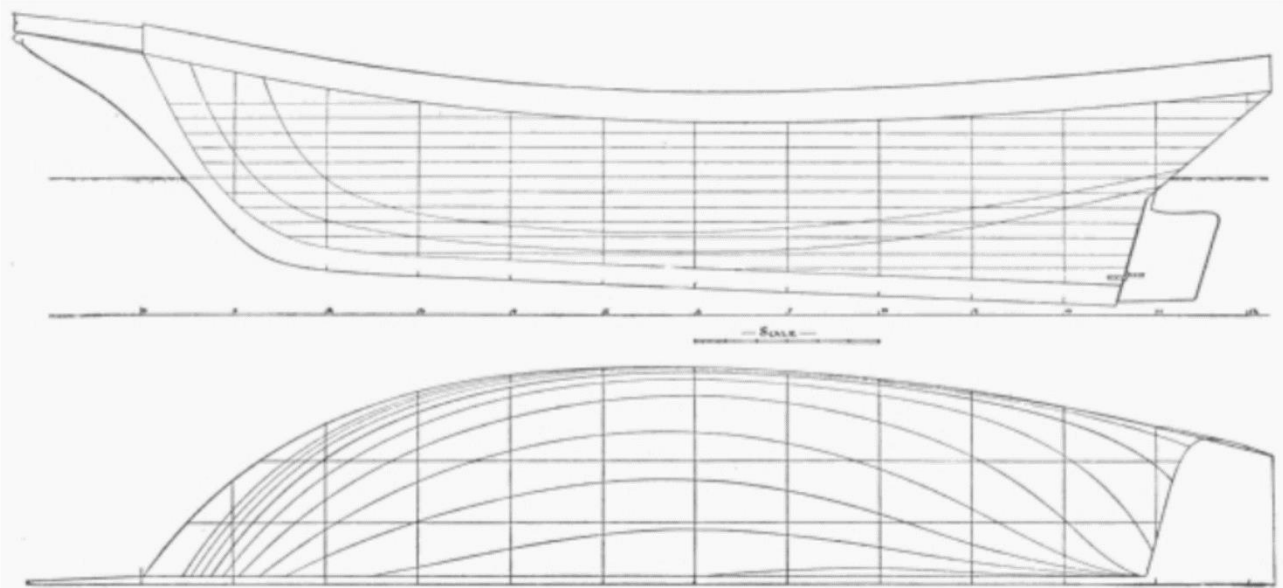




*Steering-gear of the Spray*
