A Message from the Pastor

First Sunday in Lent February 14, 2016

Dear parishioners,

This weekend, (except at 7:30 a.m. Sunday Mass) we welcome Father Gene Squeo to preach at our weekend Masses. Father Squeo is a priest of the Newark Archdiocese with a lifetime of ministry experience helping those in need in many ways. In his preaching among us, he will particularly share with us about his work with the "First Friends" organization. "First Friends of New Jersey & New York" is an organization that ministers to the more than 2,000 immigrants detained in five detention centers or jails in Northern New Jersey. First Friends provides volunteer visitors to those detainees who have no one to visit them. It runs Stamp Out Despair campaigns to provide writing paper, stamps, envelopes and phone cards to help detainees keep in contact with loved ones. First Friends also provides post-release assistance, such as help finding housing and jobs for those who are released. First Friends is looking for volunteers and funds to continue its work. In this Jubilee "Year of Mercy" designated by Pope Francis, and as we begin the Season of Lent, may we open our hearts to consider the people in these difficult circumstances.

Last weekend we launched the 2016 Annual Appeal for the Newark Archdiocese. It is a diocesan-wide annual effort to support essential ministries of our Archdiocese. The theme of this effort is SHARING GOD'S BLESSINGS.

We are taught in Sacred Scripture and reminded by Pope Francis that a sign of loving one another is to generously share the blessings which God has provided to us. For example, in Acts 4:32-33, we see how the members of the early Church shared all possessions with one another so that the Apostles and early Christian communities could fully proclaim "the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great favor was accorded them all. There was no needy person among them."

In that same spirit we are called to share what is granted us by God. In gratitude to God, we want to help assure that our brothers and sisters do not go without: without the gift of faith, without essential human needs, without a relationship with Jesus Christ. We are called to "share God's Blessings" and when we do, we find freedom and joy in proclaiming the Resurrection of the Lord Jesus – just as the Apostles did 2,000 years ago!

The Annual Appeal provides the primary funding for most of the educational and social programs managed by our Archdiocese. The lives of thousands of people are touched, and in many cases profoundly impacted by the outreach ... which is only made possible through your financial support of the annual appeal. In addition, each year about \$1 million is rebated to parishes that surpass their goal. This year, our goal is \$49,110. Several parish families (and me!) have already made our pledge toward the 2016 campaign. If you are among

There are so many ways God is made visible in the world around us. Our Church of Newark, which serves Hudson, Essex, Union and Bergen counties, sees God in the hundreds of thousands of people it takes care of every year by teaching, sheltering and caring for all who come to it for help.

Here are *some* of the areas that the Sharing God's Blessing is able to impact because of YOUR support!

Parishes: The Archdiocese of Newark is compiled of our 219 vibrant parishes throughout our four counties. Many parishes would not be able to keep their doors open if not for the generosity of those who support the Annual Appeal. In addition, those parishes that exceed their Annual Appeal goal receive a rebate that may be used for repairs or assisting those in need at the parish.

Seminarian Education & Formation: The Archdiocese of Newark is blessed with three seminaries in the Archdiocese of Newark that educate and train our future priests. These seminaries are currently educating and forming over 125 men for the priesthood. In several recent years, the Archdiocese of Newark has ordained more men to the priesthood than any diocese in the United States.

Catholic Charities: Each year Catholic Charities of the Archdiocese of Newark helps more than 80,000 individuals with food, clothing, shelter, special education and social programs from sites around the four counties we serve. This includes the 52,000 people served thought in its Emergency Food and Nutrition Food Pantry Network and nearly 6,000 people who were placed in temporary residences while they found jobs and were able to get back on their feet.

Campus Ministry: Campus Ministers are based at 10 different college campuses throughout the Archdiocese and are charged with the task of bringing our Faith to thousands of college aged students. These campus ministers help to engage young people in their Faith and bring others to the Catholic Faith through retreats, special events, and the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Youth Ministry: CYO provides young people with the opportunity to attend retreats, increase their knowledge of the Catholic Faith, and participate in a wide variety of sports and recreation programs in both summer and year-round programs.

VISIT THE IMPRISONED: I'll bet not too many of you have done that. Unless you've been inside a jail, it's hard to imagine the sense of isolation present, even with so many people around. If ever there were an act of mercy needed, it is in the jails. You must arrange your visit beforehand. The person you visit may be allowed only one visitor. Check with his or her family. If you simply wish to assist in prison ministry, contact the Catholic chaplain. If you yourself land in jail, don't hesitate to call me. It wouldn't be my first visit to an incarcerated parishioner!

CATHOLIC CEMETERIES - NEW PLANNING GUIDE

The Archdiocese of Newark has introduced a short video highlighting the significance of the Church's meaningful funeral rituals to guide our Catholic community. The sixminute video, titled "Many Travelers, One Journey," weaves together the stories of multiple individuals describing how family, friends and Church community come together to pray and comfort each other, celebrate the faith and life of their loved one, and share in the three principal parts of the Catholic funeral liturgy - the Vigil, Funeral Mass and Committal Service - known as the Order of Christian Funerals.

Produced by Catholic Cemeteries, a ministry of the Archdiocese of Newark, the video accompanies a comprehensive planning guide, titled Continuing the Journey, Preparing a Catholic Funeral, to assist Catholics during their time of loss or when pre-planning. It includes information on coping with the death of a loved one, ministry resources at a time of loss, Scripture Readings for Funerals, practical preparations, and more.
