Later the full story was told by eyewitnesses and family members. When the fire started, there were ten occupants in the mansion, the family and some visitors. The facts are quite straightforward. 

To understand today's Gospel, we must remember that Jesus had already declared:

"I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty. But as I told you, you have seen me and still you do not believe. All those the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never drive away. For I have come down from heaven not to do my will but to do the will of him who sent me. And this is the will of him who sent me, that I shall lose none of all those he has given me but raise them up at the last day. For my Father's will is that everyone who looks to the Son and believes in him shall have eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day.' At this the Jews there began to grumble about him because he said, 'I am the bread that came down from heaven.' They said, 'Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I came down from heaven'?"" (Jn 6: 35-42).



Once again, the Jews are blind to who Jesus is, even though He has healed the blind and lame, even though, at the beginning of His ministry while teaching in the Temple, He had told them directly:

"The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. He began by saying to them, "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing" (Lk 4:18-21). Still, in their eyes, He was just the carpenter's son and they wanted a Messiah that would be a powerful king who would make Israel great again as in the time of David. Why did they not hear Him, when He told them that He was fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah (61:1-2)?

Even as "a large crowd followed him, and he healed all who were ill and warned them not to tell others about him." Why did they not see that "This was to fulfill what was spoken through the prophet Isaiah: 'Here is my servant whom I have chosen, the one I love, in whom I delight; I will put my Spirit on him, and he will proclaim justice to the nations. He will not quarrel or cry out; no one will hear his voice in the streets. A bruised reed he will not break, and a smoldering wick he will not snuff out, till he has brought justice through to victory. In His name the nations will put their hope." (Mt 12: 16-21). Why, when Jesus went about doing God's will, fulfilling prophecy after prophecy, why did they not hear? Why did they not see?

As Jesus continued to quietly, but powerfully, heal the sick, to teach the way of Love, to gather more and more followers, many Jews began to believe Jesus could indeed be the Promised One, the One who would save Israel. The same followers who numbered in the thousands and were miraculously fed by a few barley loaves and fish continued to follow Him...until His Bread of Life discourse. When Jesus said: "Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in

me, and I in them. Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so the one who feeds on me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Your ancestors ate manna and died, but whoever feeds on this bread will live forever." When Jesus began with "very truly I tell you," all his listeners would pay close attention. But when they listened, it seemed Jesus was telling them to "eat His flesh," and "drink His blood," and thereby encouraging his followers to cannibalism. Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This is a hard saying, who can accept this?"

Jesus responds with a challenge: "What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before?" Would they believe what their eyes told them or continue to doubt what they heard and saw, just as they were not doing? Jesus knew there would be some who would not accept "the spirit that gives life," and so He was not surprised when "many of his disciples turned back and no longer followed him." And so he turns to the Twelve that have been with Him since the beginning of His ministry and asks them if they want to leave Him, too. It is Simon Peter, who becomes the rock of His followers when he answered: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and to know that you are the Holy One of God."

In today's Church, there are many who receive the "Bread of Life," as if it were only bread, a symbol of the Life and Love of Jesus, a sign of their faith in Him, but do they, like many disciples in Jesus' time, believe that what they receive is the Real Presence of Jesus alive in our world today? Like those in Jesus' time, there are some who find the Bread of Life too difficult to accept and they stay away from Mass. Even more, statistics say only a third of those who attend Mass and receive the bread and wine believe Jesus' words: "This is My Body... This is My Blood" for the life of the world. Sadly, we see this unbelief at Mass whenever we see people who do not genuflect to the Presence of Jesus in the Tabernacle, or people who turn their back on Jesus to speak with a neighbor, or who treat His Temple, His Church, as merely another house where people gather to socialize and be filled, not to give the adoration due the Real Presence of the Lord in their midst. Many Catholic Christians today forget that Jesus, the Bread of Life, has said: "My house shall be a house of prayer" (Mt 21:13).

Celebrating Mass on the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (June 6, 2021), Pope Francis noted the Upper Room, where Jesus celebrated the First Eucharist, was "a large room for a tiny piece of Bread," symbolizing how "God makes Himself tiny, like a morsel of bread", and why we "need a great heart to be able to recognize, adore and receive Him." The Pope went on to say that we need to open up the spaces of our hearts to break out of ourselves and enter the large space of the Upper Room to experience "the vast expanse of wonder and adoration" of God's humble, boundless, loving presence. That is why adoration represents "the attitude we need in the presence of the Eucharist," he said." (Vatican News)

From the moment a Catholic Christian enters the Church, a deep sense of reverence should permeate their whole being. Their hearts should cry out: "My Lord and My God!" We cannot decide to believe some of Jesus' words, but not all of them. And so we must believe-and act like we believe—that the Eucharist IS His Body and His Blood. Our behavior at His table will testify to our belief so that all who witness our adoration and reception of Him will also come to believe that He IS the Bread of Life for our world.





We give thanks to God and to you that we will always be able to respond to those among us who need the support of our food pantry, because you have responded to Jesus, fulfilling His Word.

We are so grateful for your response to God's call to be ever ready to assist "the least of these." It seems whenever we have a need, you have fulfilled it. As times have changed for all of us, our needs, too, have changed as new families come to us for support. For example, there is a need for gas cards for a person who must drive herself to Boston each week for treatment for her cancer, your gas cards make this possible. Your gift cards to Stop and Shop, which can also be used for gas, was a great gift to her. Another person, who is looking for employment asked for clothes and shoes so that he would look better in his interviews. Fortunately, your donations of gift cards to Walmart and Target allowed us to respond to his need. As our supply for toiletries and cleaning supplies and paper products rise with the rise in the number of families seeking our assistance, and we all know we have been able to supply those in need with CVS and supermarket gift cards in lieu of these necessary items. In the meantime, our needs remain relatively the same each week, with the exception of peanut butter, jelly, cereal and pasta, all of which we have an ample supply every week. In the following weeks we anticipate a greater need for: paper products, sauce, canned vegetables, yellow rice, cooking oil, fruit juices, coffee, SPAM and low sodium SPAM, snacks and cookies, crackers and cleaning and laundry supplies.

Dear Friends:

This past Saturday, August 14th, an earthquake struck Haiti causing enormous damage and resulting in a significant loss of life.

Catholic Relief Services (CRS) announced that it "is sending teams to provide clean water, sanitation, shelter and emergency supplies in response to a major earthquake that struck southern Haiti early Saturday morning. While the severity of the damage is still being determined, with communications down in parts of the country, hundreds of deaths have already been reported as well as extensive damage to buildings and homes."

Recognizing the suffering of the Haitian people and growing need for assistance, Cardinal Seán has asked that a special collection for Catholic Relief Services and the Church in Haiti be taken the weekends of August 21-22 or August 28-29 in all parishes in the Archdiocese of Boston. We will take up our second collection the weekend of August 28-29 as a second collection. Feel free to also support on-line or drop off during the week anytime through our secure drop-box at the office.

The parishes of the Archdiocese of Boston have consistently stepped forward during times of natural disasters to assist our brothers and sisters in other parts of the world. Following the 2010 earthquake in Haiti, where CRS reports "more than 300,000 people were killed and another 1.3 million left without homes", the parishioners of the Archdiocese generously raised more than \$2 million for relief efforts.

To process this collection, please ask parishioners to address their checks to your parish, with "Haiti Earthquake Relief" in the memo. On behalf of the Cardinal, thank you for your attentiveness to this important collection and expression of our solidarity with those who are suffering.




