## From the Principal

Dear members of the Sacred Heart College community,

### Feast of St Marcellin Champagnat

Happy Feast Day (for June 6)!

This year's message from superior general Brother Emili Turú for the feast of Saint Marcellin Champagnat on 6 June relates to the Institute's Bicentenary celebration and the 22nd General Chapter.

*"I invite you to celebrate the 6th of June, in union with Marists throughout the world, in the same spirit with which we celebrated the 2nd of January earlier this year: giving thanks to the Lord for the gift of the charism of Champagnat to the Church and to the world; asking forgiveness for our lack of faithfulness to God's Spirit; renewing our commitment to Marist life and mission."*

*"The motto of the Chapter: "A New La Valla" invites us to return to La Valla, the house of our origins, our "Lighthouse", to reconnect to what is essential in our charism, and to offer us an opportunity for "a New Beginning", here and now."*

Brother Emili recalls the words of Brother Basilio Rueda, who during the General Chapter of 1993 underscored *"the need to turn around our lives, our communities and our works."*

He concludes by inviting all Marist Brothers of Champagnat to open themselves up to the action of the Spirit:

*"God willing, we may all be as courageous as Mary was, and allow ourselves to be led by the emerging newness of the Spirit, rather than be held captive by our achievements, or by simply managing what is already in existence!"*

This invitation has been integral to our Marist theme for 2017 - *Awaken!* We take up the invitation of Pope Francis to *'Wake up the world! Be witnesses of a different way of doing things, of acting, of living!'*



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## **Parent Amalgamation Forum**

On Tuesday evening we had a gathering of over 150 people at the *Amalgamation Forum* with a focus on the Champagnat Campus, which will commence in 2019. For those unable to attend, we covered a range of key issues. Shana Bennett (Head of Marymount) outlined our intended focus on Visible Learning (John Hattie) as the underpinning pedagogy of the amalgamated campus. She also outlined the Positive Education/Positive Psychology approach we will be comprehensively adopting as our wellbeing program.

A brief insight was provided into our Marian spirituality and relationship-based ethos, which has been integral to both Sacred Heart and Marymount over the decades. During the Professional Learning Week (Week 1, Term 3) staff from both Colleges will participate in a program based on these three pillars of Champagnat Campus.

Following the presentation, a 'Q & A' session was conducted and a wide array of topics were raised. ## Celebrating the Feast of St Marcellin Champagnat (6 June 2017)



When Marcellin was just 16 years old he spent most of his day working on the family farm and looking after his sheep. He lived in a small village far from any large city. He only attended school briefly, learning mostly from his parents and uncle. There was adventure in Marcellin's life when he accepted an offer to leave home and study to become a priest. Although not knowing what the future would bring, Marcellin had a deep trust in God.

Marcellin's dream was to educate young people living in country areas about God's presence and love. He used Mary, our Good Mother, as his inspiration to make Jesus known. When Marcellin arrived at the town of La Valla, he started to make his dream a reality. He invited two young men to become teachers and join him in starting a school in the town. Thus the first Marist school was established and they became the first two Marist Brothers.

Marcellin dreamed to help and educate young people in need no matter where they were. Before too long, many schools and other missions were established and the Marists went to other parts of the world, including Australia. And now, 200 years later, there is a Marist presence in over 80 countries.

In his Easter Sunday message this year, Pope Francis said that helping those in need is "the foundation of our existence" as a Catholic Church. He said that Jesus comes to meet those in need through the actions of people who treat them with respect and kindness.

As we celebrate the Feast of St Marcellin Champagnat, we are reminded of his dream to educate in a spirit of audacity and hope, loving each and every student equally, and instilling the characteristics of; Presence, Family Spirit, Love of Work, Simplicity and In the Way of Mary in all of our students.

As a College community, we celebrated the Feast Day through our annual Marist Mission March where we walked in solidarity with our global Marist community, raising awareness and funds for Marist projects in Fiji, India and the Philippines... This is our mission!

### **Our Marist Mission in action**

## St Vinnies Winter Sleepout and Winter Appeal

As part of our Marist Mission, on Friday 2 June in the midst of one of the coldest starts to winter on record, more than 30 Senior School students and staff members gave up their beds to 'sleep rough' and learn what it would be like for those experiencing homelessness for the St Vinnies Winter Sleepout. As part of the sleepout, the students and staff used only blankets, sleeping bags and cardboard boxes that had been donated.

We were privileged to have the CEO of the St Vincent de Paul Society in SA, David Wark, present to us about how homelessness is not a choice, and that Vinnies plays a significant role in supported those on the margins in our local community. Following this, we heard Old Scholar, Ben Ellul's, personal experience of community with homelessness on the streets of Melbourne. Charley Hiller and Rose Doherty created an activity to show the stark difference between some people's lives and the choices they do not have. To finish the night, we too gathered as a community and shared our musical talents, as well as playing some competitive four-square before turning in for a rough night's sleep.

The donations we have collected from the students and the wider school community will be delivered to our local Brighton Vinnies to support people in need this winter. A big thank you to all who donated. A special thanks to the Young Marist post-school volunteers who served dinner, and to James Gill, Annicka Adolphi and Majo Bogatec who accompanied the students to help make the night an eye-opening experience.

In solidarity of this mission, the Middle School students wore as many warm layers as they could on Friday 2 June, and then donated items to the St Vincent De Paul Society, who will distribute these to the homeless this winter. Well done to all students, with some managing to wear 33 items! Donations of warm winter clothing and blankets will continue until this Friday (9 June)!

Once again, the generosity, compassion and mission of our community was on display! Please support Vinnies SA this winter in caring for those on the margins in our community!

## Meningococcal B Vaccine Herd Immunity Study

The first round of the vaccinations under the Meningococcal B Vaccine Herd Immunity Study was successfully administered on Wednesday 10 May to all students who had registered for the study. In order to accommodate the large number of students taking part in the study, the vaccines will be administered in year level groups over a number of days throughout the year, which started with Year 11 students on Wednesday. Please see below for the dates when the vaccines will be administered:

### Round 1 Vaccinations

**Year 10:** Wednesday 14 June 2017 (Week 7, Term 2)

### Round 2 Vaccinations

**Year 11:** Wednesday 5 July 2017 (Week 10, Term 2)

**Year 12:** Tuesday 22 August 2017 (Week 5, Term 3)

**Year 10:** Wednesday 23 August 2017 (Week 5, Term 3).

The Meningococcal B Vaccine Herd Immunity Study will only involve those students who have returned a completed and signed consent form.

The dates of the administration of the vaccine have been chosen to minimise disruption to lessons and the learning of students, however the complexity of administering the vaccine to all students throughout the day may result in some lessons being affected.

## Supporting your child's safety online

Following a visit in May from Sonya Ryan of the Carly Ryan Foundation, who spoke to our Year 10 students and parents about the practical steps they can take to protect their privacy and safety online, I will include a fact sheet in each newsletter over the coming weeks. Last fortnight's newsletter included a fact sheet on Facebook.

These fact sheets have been developed by the Australian Federal Police and each are relevant to a number of popular apps and social media platforms that young people are using.

Sonya's sessions were very powerful as they explored her personal journey of losing her daughter, Carly, to an online predator and then the work she has done since to educate and protect young people from suffering a similar fate. Sonya explained the risks of some of the most popular apps and social media platforms and provided step by step guides for how parents can support their children (and themselves) to ensure that they have safe privacy and security settings.

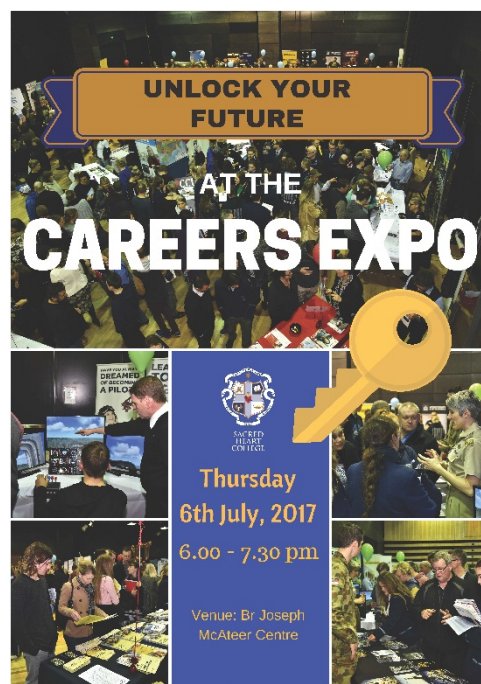
