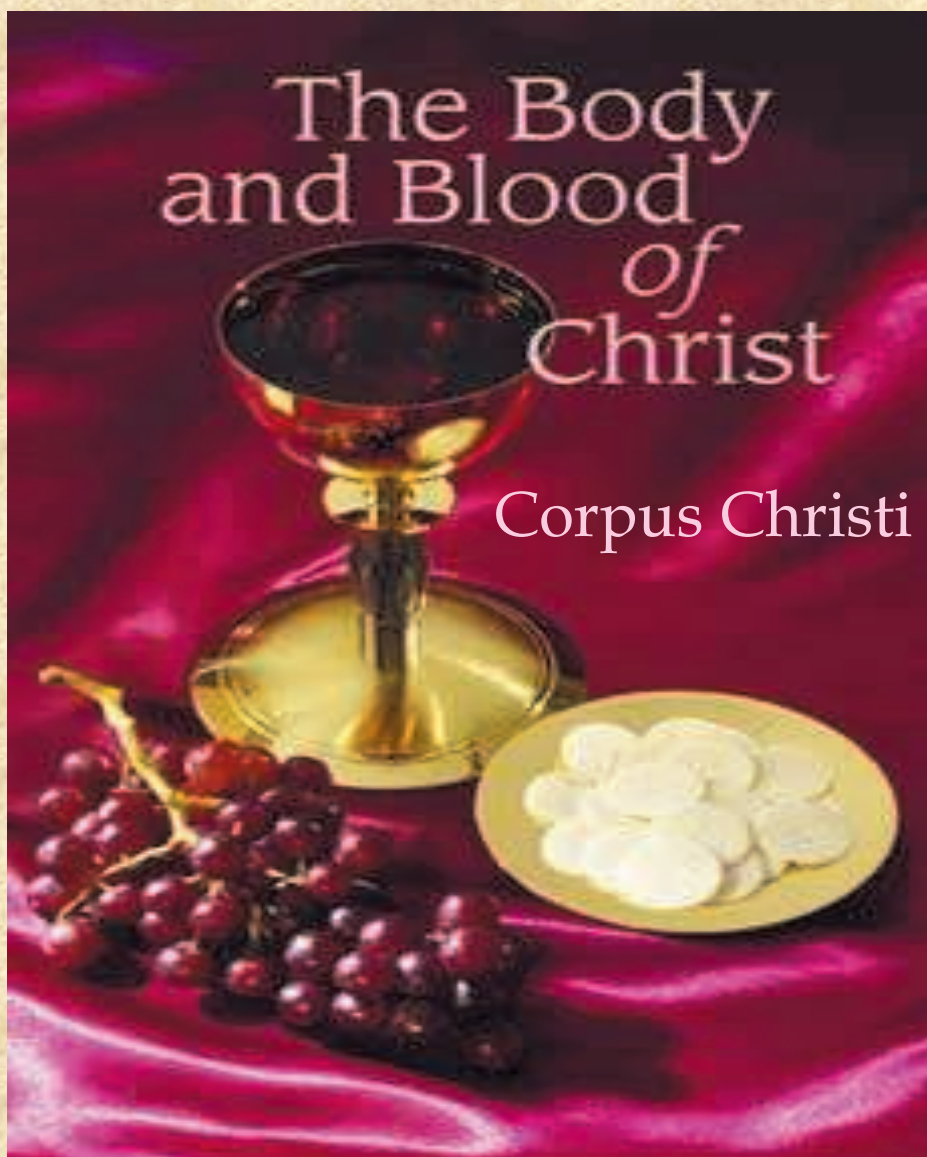

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

The Jordan River plunges as it rushes from the headwaters below Mount Hermon through the Sea of Galilee, 680 feet below sea level. This body is the lowest freshwater lake on earth. It is streaming with life. It was on the Sea of Galilee that Peter, Andrew, James, and John fished. It was there that Jesus calmed the sea and walked on water.

This is in contrast to the Dead Sea, the lowest body of water on earth, a landlocked salt lake about 1400 feet below sea level. The Jordan River empties into this sea. However, there is no flow on the southern side. The Sea of Galilee takes and gives, the Dead Sea only takes. When receiving the Body of Christ in the Eucharist, we can either be like the Sea of Galilee or the Dead Sea.

As Roman Catholics we believe that the person of Christ is fully present in the consecrated bread and wine. When we receive Communion, we receive, the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Himself. This truth and belief in the real Presence takes faith given to us by the Holy Spirit who dwells within us. (If we allow it.) Some ask "It looks and tastes like bread and wine, how can we say that it is really Jesus?" To answer that question one must only seek truth by way of Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture.

At the Last Supper, Matthew says: "Jesus took bread, said the blessing, broke it, and giving it to his disciples" said, "Take and eat: this is my body." Then He took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it to them saying, "Drink from it, all of you, for this is my blood of the covenant..." In the sixth chapter of John's Gospel, Jesus Himself often says over and over that "unless we eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His Blood, we will not have eternal life" The apostles said, "This is a hard saying." Jesus did not soften or say receive me when it's convenient, but instead He repeated it several times. Jesus doesn't lie to anyone.

My friends, Communion is meant to unite us, not only to Jesus' present in the elements of bread and wine, but also to each other. We are the Body of Christ. To welcome Christ without welcoming everyone all in the Body of Christ, is to be like the Dead Sea. We receive, but we do not share.

The multiplication of the loaves and the fish in today's Gospel is a lesson in sharing and giving. Jesus receives the gift of a few fish and five barley loaves (the bread of the poor) and multiples these to feed more than five thousand. Jesus challenges you and me to offer the little we have, either prayer, time, treasure, or talent and trust that God can and will multiply our gift.

As we celebrate today God's supreme gift of Love and this great Feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, may we prayerfully consider, "how can I share the gifts and blessings that I have received? Where is there a need that moves my heart?" Don't worry about the size of your offering. It is God our Father who multiplies. Be like the Sea of Galilee. Be filled with Jesus' life and share it!

May God's choicest blessings remain with you all!

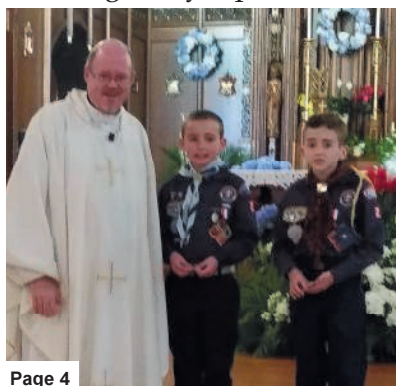


Registration Forms for Religious Education

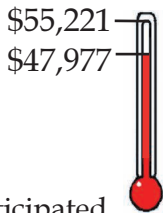

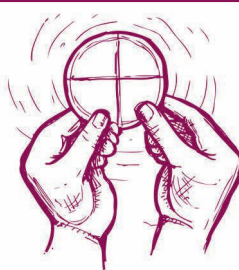

DID YOU KNOW?

Did you know the Catholic Church teaches that when we receive the Eucharist we are receiving the actual **body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ**? While the bread and wine of Communion retain their appearances, we believe that through the priest's words of consecration, Christ becomes truly present for us to receive. This belief is based on Christ's own words at the Last Supper, when we believe He instituted this divine sacrament: "This is my body, which will be given for you..." (Lk. 22:19) and "...for this is my blood of the covenant...>" (Mt. 26:28) Accordingly, the Second Vatican Council in its document *Lumen Gentium* declared the Eucharist to be the "source and summit of the Christian life... For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself...." With worthy reception of Holy Communion we partake of this most wonderful gift Jesus has left with us in order that He may be always present to us.

The following essay was delivered by Class Essayist, Sean Bourque, at the SHS Graduation.



Good evening to all.

A textbook is one of a student's main tools for learning and studying, including all of the facts and information that a student needs to know for class. Throughout our years at Sacred Hearts, textbooks have shown us how to understand and how to measure and quantify the world around us. For example, we can quantify the number of monogrammed white polo shirts that we each have worn since our arrival at Sacred Hearts, or we can count the number of times that we consumed the Friday pizza at lunch.

But there are many important aspects of our experience at Sacred Hearts that cannot be quantified. For example:

How can you measure the value of the friendships that we have created here?

And when teachers inspire their students, like they do every day at Sacred Hearts,
how can that be measured?

How can you quantify, or even describe the lifelong memories created among the students and teachers
and the whole Sacred Hearts community?

What a textbook cannot teach, and what cannot be measured, is what the staff and faculty of Sacred Hearts School share with us on a daily basis. Throughout the eleven years of my attendance of Sacred Hearts, the community of teachers in both the church and school have worked to instill the values of faith, hope, kindness and compassion into every student. We studied history in a text book, but then our teachers brought us to Washington D.C. to visit the actual sites of American history. We stood silently at memorials for fallen soldiers and holocaust victims, we saw the homes of famous political figures, and danced the night away on the Potomac River. No textbook could teach us about history the way our teachers did when they brought us to Washington D.C.

We read about art in class, but then our teachers brought us to gaze upon famous works of art at the Museum of Fine Arts. We all studied from our textbooks in Religion class, but more importantly, our teachers shared their values with us so that we can help our society to become a more welcoming and loving place for all people and so that we can live a life of faith and love for our families, friends, our God, and ourselves.

As we prepare for the coming years of high school, and we go our separate ways, on our separate educational journeys, we will have the tools to succeed in whatever we wish, because of the education and preparation that Sacred Hearts has provided us. We may eventually forget how to multiply polynomials or forget some of the elements on the Periodic Table, but we will never forget the important things that our teachers taught us - all of those things that can't be measured or quantified - that will stay with us throughout our teenage years, and into our adult lives.

Whether we have attended for one or eleven years - with our teachers as our guides, and the Lord at our side, Sacred Hearts is the school we love. Congratulations Class of 2019!

Thank You! My sincere thanks to the Parish staff, Parishioners, Catechists, and Religious Education families for your prayers and support as I focus full-time on my studies at Boston College next year. I have been deeply touched by many who have reached out to me to wish me well on this new chapter of my life. And I am very appreciative of all those who were able to attend my farewell Mass on June 9th. It has been an honor to serve at Sacred Hearts Parish the past four years. Please continue to keep me in your prayers.
