The legend originated in Richard Halliburton's 1938 book *Second Book of Marvels*. However, this myth is simply not true. Richard Halliburton's claim was contradicted by astronauts Neil Armstrong by and Yang Liwei. A more plausible assumption would be to say that the Great Wall can be visible from a low orbit of the earth which is not unique in this regard as many other artificial constructions can be n from that height.
