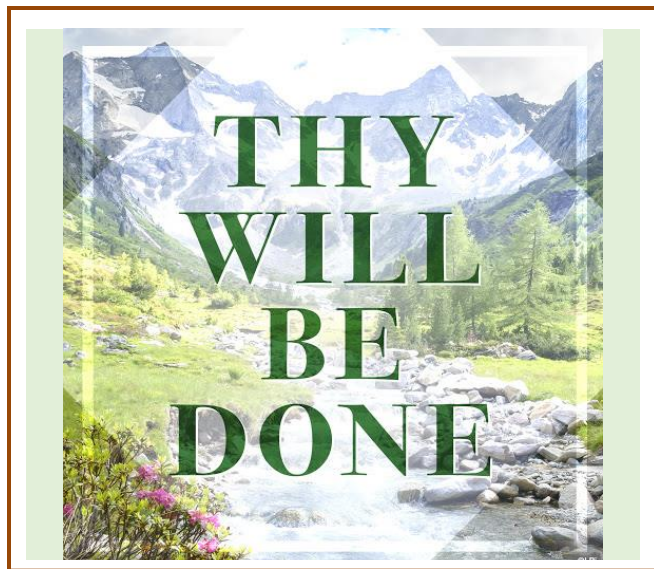

Pastor Column

Dear Brothers & Sisters,

I must admit, I am still in denial at the fact that summer is over! I will miss the heat, the sun, the easier schedule, and the water! In these days, we “officially” change seasons from Summer to Fall, marked by the “Autumn Equinox.”

The Latin word, “*equinox*” come from “*equi*” - meaning equal; and “*nox*” - meaning night. The idea is that at this point there are exactly 12 hours of daylight and twelve hours of darkness. And in a few weeks we’ll even move our clocks back: more darkness. The amount of darkness increases every day and reaches its maximum in December at the Solstice.

I am not the weather man, so why do I mention this? Well, in tradition and in Scripture, “light” and “day” are images of goodness and the presence of God; while “night” and “darkness” are associated with sin and with evil. We have many words derived from “*nox*” and they usually imply something negative: “noxious” fumes; an “obnoxious” person.

So let us remember, even as the days grow shorter and the nights grow longer, that we are people of the light! Not of darkness! In a few short months we will be recalling that a people in darkness has seen a great light: Jesus, Himself! Let us not despair for that is *already* true today!

On another note, next Sunday on October 4, it would normally be the Feast of Saint Francis of Assisi, but it is “superseded” by the Sunday Solemnity.

Still, we will have the blessing of animals for all who would like to bring their pets – at 2:00pm, on the lawn near the gazebo and the Blessed Mother. Social distancing for *all* creatures; masks for humans only!

Finally, a “heads-up”: On Saturday, October 17, I will be installed as Pastor of Saint Andrews by Cardinal Tobin, who will be the celebrant at our 5:00pm Vigil Mass. As we will still be restricted to the number of people who can be in Church, I will *not* invite my family or friends in order to have room for parishioners. Nevertheless, we will need for those who wish to attend to reserve a place in advance. We will provide more information shortly on how to do this (online, or by phone or email).

keeping your faith firm.

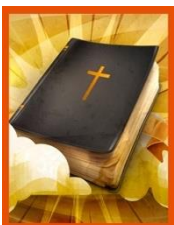
You, Salvation of the People,
