

### A WORD FROM FR. JOHN...

Hopefully, you enjoyed the celebration of the Paschal Triduum culminating with the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday. I am grateful to all who helped to make our parish celebrations so wonderful, from the cleaners and decorators, to the various liturgical ministers - Greeters, Ushers, Altar Servers, Music Ministers, Lectors, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Sacristans, Mass Coordinators - to all who participated in the liturgies, whether parishioners or visitors, to our hardworking and dedicated parish staff and volunteers. By the time we get to the end on Sunday afternoon, many of us are worn out and exhausted, but I hope have a sense of peace and joy.

As we continue our celebrations throughout the fifty days of the Easter season, a number of significant events are coming up. Coming up this Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> in the school at Blessed Sacrament is the actual Next-To-New Sale. While we are not accepting anymore donations at this time (please save them for the next sale in October), two important ways remain to help us make this parish fund and fun raiser a great success. First, we welcome volunteers to help with sorting and pricing with the actual sale, and with clean up. Whether you have a lot of time to offer or just a few hours to spare, please see the bulletin for how to get involved. Second, we encourage you to come to the actual sale, invite and bring along family, friends and neighbors, and buy lots of stuff. If you get it home and decide at some point that you don't need it, then please donate it back to us and we can sell to the next person. We can even think of it in environmental terms: Reduce (sort and donate stuff), Reuse (Instead of buying new, keep something out of the landfill) and Recycle (When the time is right, donate it back to us to sell again).

Also, next Saturday, May 4th, at 2:00PM at St. Mary's, we will be offering a Tour of Our Stained Glass Windows and History. This is a great opportunity to admire the beauty and artistry and to learn more about one of the oldest Catholic churches in the city. If you are thinking of volunteering to help with our Open House celebrating St. Mary's 185th anniversary on the first weekend of the Jazz Fest, June 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup>, then you might consider coming on the tour in preparation. In gearing up for this Open House, we will be holding planning and organizational meetings after both Masses at St. Mary's on Saturday and Sunday, May 4th & 5th. As the bulletin articles have indicated, we need a wide range of folks with a variety of talents and skills to create a successful event. As has been the case with the Open Houses that we have held at St. Boniface as part of the large craft show and sale in December, a large number of volunteers from all three churches made for a relatively easy and enjoyable experience for all those involved. If you can't make either meeting, then please be sure to contact Kathy Marfione in our parish office to let her know of your interest in possibly volunteering to help. Thanks.

Easter is also the season to celebrate the Sacraments of Initiation. In addition to a number of baptisms at our weekend Masses, we will be celebrating the **Confirmation** of our parish candidates at Sacred Heart Cathedral on Tuesday

evening, **May 7th**. Then the following weekend, our candidates for **First Communion** with their families will celebrate receiving the Body and Blood of Christ for the first time at the 9:00AM Mass at St. Boniface, on Sunday, **May 12th**, which is also Mother's Day. Please pray for our candidates and their families.

Invitations went out earlier this week to our Liturgical Ministers Appreciation Brunch on Saturday, May 11th. Along with a scrumptious meal and opportunity for fellowship, Fr. Ed Palumbos, who expects to rejoin us in late June after his temporary assignment covering St. Christopher's in North Chili is complete, will be our featured speaker. On that same day, we will be offering our customary praying of the Outdoor Rosary at St. Boniface at 4:00PM, before the evening Mass. Please join us as we offer prayers to our Lord through his Blessed Mother Mary during the month of May.

Following up on our parish "Town Hall" style meetings, we are offering you access to the summaries that I generated based on input from the actual meetings and other communication that I received via phone, email, mail and conversations. I shared these summaries with members of our Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) and parish staff prior to the PPC meeting on April 15th. I would ask those with access to our website to review the summaries online. Hardcopies have been placed in our churches for those who require them. If additional hardcopies are needed, please contact the parish office. I apologize if I missed or misunderstood anything that was shared. I relied on the notes taken at each meeting along with my memory, which is not always as sharp as I would like to imagine. If you notice anything amiss, please bring it to my attention. After reviewing the summaries, the next step in the process will be an all parish gathering in conjunction with our next PPC meeting, on Monday, May 20th at 7:00pm at Blessed Sacrament school. Members from all three churches in our parish are invited and encouraged to participate. My hope is that we can identify several positive and constructive initiatives based on, but not limited to, the input from the "Town Hall" meetings. My sense is that the initiatives that generate the most energy and support, especially in terms of volunteers who are willing to help drive them forward, will be the easiest and most effective for us to pursue. If you are unable to attend, please feel free to share your suggestions for next steps with fellow parishioners who will attend, and members of our Parish Pastoral Council, parish staff or myself. Thank you for your prayers and support of these efforts aimed at sustaining and growing our parish.
