Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in Christ:

The Pastoral Staff has been looking for a resource for quite some time for our parishioners to use at home and for us to use in the course of our ministry in the school, in religious education, and other adult education programs. **WE FOUND IT!**



It gives me great joy to share with you that our parish now has a subscription to FORMED, a premier online platform filled with over 4,000 Catholic studies, movies, audio dramas, talks, e-books, and even cartoons for our children. FORMED has content from over 60 apostolates, including Augustine Institute, Ignatius Press, and the Knights of Columbus, with material that is professionally produced, engaging, and solid in its catechism. **BEST OF ALL, THIS MATERIAL IS FREE TO YOU!** With the support of the Parish Finance Council, the Parish purchased a subscription to FORMED that provides any family in our parish FREE access to it as well.

Our parish Pastoral Staff will be using the material on FORMED to support our ministries and provide continuing education for staff members and parishioners, as well as outreach for our sick and homebound members. On FORMED you will find children’s programming, audio talks, e-books and more!

When you sign-up you will have easy access to all of the material on FORMED to support your own faith journey and that of your family members, for example:

- Are you hesitant to return to the Sacrament of Reconciliation after a long absence? Watch *Forgiven: The Transforming Power of Confession*.
- Would you like to be more confident in answering your teenagers’ questions about the validity of the Gospels? Watch *Lectio: The Case for Jesus*.
- Do you search for a reliable source of Catholic teaching on current issues? Tune in each week to *The Augustine Institute Show with Dr. Tim Gray*.
- Have you despaired of finding good movies that your family can enjoy together on a Friday night? Start with *Mother Teresa*, the story of the selfless saint who brought hope and love to the poorest of the poor.
- Have you struggled to find a movie you are comfortable leaving on the television for your children while you were running to do the dishes in the kitchen? Check out the Kids Movies section of FORMED and you won’t need to worry about content or inappropriate language.

You can enjoy FORMED on your computer or on your television with an inexpensive Roku device or Apple TV. You can even listen on your phone as you commute to work or do chores.

My hope and prayer is that the content on FORMED will enrich, deepen, and inspire your faith.

To gain access to all of FORMED’s content, follow these simple steps:

- Enter our parish’s zip code or name to select our parish
- Enter your name and your email address

That’s it! You’re in. Now you can get the free FORMED app for your phone by searching FORMED Catholic in your app store.

I cannot wait to hear from our parishioners how you are using FORMED in your homes and from our catechists and teachers how it is being used in the education of our young people!

Smart Boards...as I announced last weekend in preparing for the upcoming year of Religious Education classes in our parish family and NOW with FORMED as a resource our catechists can utilize, we need additional Smart Boards. We have all new Smart Boards in our school but for those classes held in the Education Wing at Saint Thomas Becket Campus we only have one Smart Board, which was donated in memory of Doreen Festa, who you may remember worked in our religious education department before her death. We are grateful to her family for donating this Smart Board, which is a real gift to the many programs and events that are held at this Campus, which utilize the technology available.



We are looking for five families—who we have one already from last weekend so we need four more—who might be willing to donate a Smart Board (\$5,000 for Board and Cart) in memory of a loved one for each of the classrooms in the Education Wing. These Smart Boards would enable our catechists the ability to use more technology in teaching our young people the faith. I know our catechists are hopeful for this possibility. 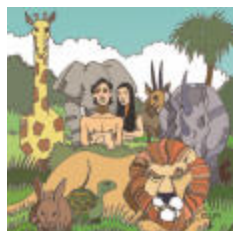

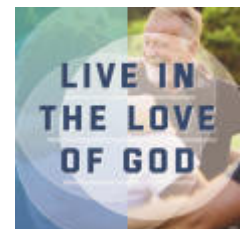

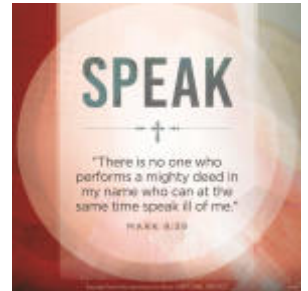


Today is the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today we continue to read from the Gospel of Mark. Recall that last week we heard Jesus chastise his disciples for their argument about who among them was the greatest. Jesus taught them that the greatest among them will be those who serve the least ones. In today's Gospel, the disciple John questions Jesus about an unknown exorcist who was driving out demons in Jesus' name. John's question might have been motivated by jealousy. Previously in Mark's Gospel, Jesus healed a boy whom the disciples had been unable to heal. John's question is further evidence that the disciples have not yet grasped Jesus' words to them. They continue to compare themselves to others who seem to have greater healing powers, and they do not want to share the power of Jesus' name with others.



Today the demon possession described in the Gospels might be seen as a form of mental illness, but the need for healing these syndromes was as real then as it is now. Exorcism was a common practice in first-century Palestine. Some people had the power to heal the symptoms of possession. One of the strategies used was to invoke the name of a person or figure who was believed to have the power to heal.

The disciples observed that the unknown exorcist invoked Jesus' name and was successful in his healing efforts. This unknown healer recognized the power of Jesus' name, yet he was not a follower of Jesus. In his reply to his disciples, Jesus acknowledges that deeds of faith can precede the words of faith. He also teaches that the disciples should not be reluctant to share Jesus' healing powers with others.

Later in this Gospel, Jesus teaches us not to create obstacles for those who are just beginning to have faith but to encourage even the smallest signs of faith. The Greek word used here for sin also connotes "stumbling" or "causing scandal." In vivid terms Jesus teaches his disciples the consequences to those who would put obstacles before people who are on the road to faith.

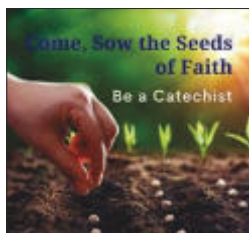

Cheshire K of C KNIGHTS KORNER

INTO THE BREACH—Starts Saturday

As we mentioned last week, our Council begins its presentation of the K of C's Into The Breach, a twelve part series on, well, let's just do a **Q & A**:

Q. *What is the Into the Breach video series?*

A. Into the Breach is a 12-episode video series produced by the Knights of Columbus. This video series seeks to answer the question of what it means to be a man and how to live as a man in today's world. It is inspired by the Apostolic Exhortation for Catholic men written by Bishop Thomas Olmsted of the Diocese of Phoenix.

Q. *What does each episode consist of?*

A. Each episode focuses on a different aspect of authentic Catholic masculinity and features interviews with well-known Catholic commentators, as well as the personal story of a man who has deeply experienced the episode's topic in his own life. Each episode runs approximately 12 minutes.

Q. *What is "authentic Catholic masculinity?"*

A. Much of our modern culture is beset by misunderstanding and contention about what it means to be a man. Many men receive mixed messages concerning who they are and what their role is. Into the Breach contends that men are made for greatness and the true expression of that greatness is to be heroically virtuous—and that Catholic masculinity means to have character marked by goodness and truth, strength and courage, in imitation of Christ.

Saint of the Week:

Saint Jerome

Feast Day: September 30th

Bio: St. Jerome was born in 345 and is often remembered for his fiery temper. He is famed for his writings, many of which were biting rebukes of those who taught heresy or spoke against the teachings of the Church. One of his greatest contributions is the translation of most of the Old Testament from Hebrew. Saint Augustine once said, "What Jerome is ignorant of, no mortal has ever known." High praise indeed! Jerome's translation of the Bible became known as the Vulgate, and the Council of Trent declared it the authentic text to be used by the Church. Jerome spoke four languages: Latin, Greek, Hebrew, and Chaldaic. His tireless devotion and quick wit led him to a variety of roles within the Church, including private secretary to Pope Damasus. His travels eventually led him to Bethlehem, where he took up residence in the cave believed to have been the birthplace of Christ. He died there in 420, and his remains are buried in Rome. Saint Jerome, pray for us!

Apologetics: Spiritual Buffness

- If we want to get healthy and get in shape, we have to make changes in our lives. We clear out all the junk food from our cabinets; we resolve to eat better; we start going to the gym.
- At the gym, we push ourselves to exercise even though we don't necessarily want to and even though it doesn't necessarily feel good.
- We have to do the same thing if we want to get in shape in our spiritual lives.
- We have to exercise our faith just like any other muscle.
 - Clearing out all the junk food = going to Confession
 - Resolve to eat healthier = start pursuing holiness, filling our minds with spiritual things
 - Working out at the gym or on the exercise bike = taking on spiritual disciplines and living the Catholic faith whether it feels good or not
- **Going to Mass occasionally, only praying when we need something and living a life of casual sins is like lifting two pound weights and eating garbage and expecting to get into great shape!**
- *We need to exercise spiritual discipline! We go to Mass to receive Jesus in the Eucharist every week; we pray every day; we go to Confession monthly; we resolve to change our ways; we come to Adoration; we fill our minds with spiritual books and Catholic media; we commit to participating in the life of the parish!*
- This process will take time. Just like we can't go from out of shape to looking buff overnight, we have to practice consistency over time!
- Start with baby steps and stick with it! The results will be incredible!

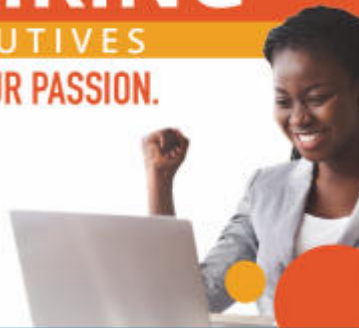
