Sticks and Stones

The story of the woman caught in adultery is so familiar that it is easy to overlook its significance not only for the woman expecting to be stoned to death, but also for each one of us expecting punishment for the times we have sinned. We may not be waiting for a neighbor to lob a rock at us, but we remain crouched in fear, paralyzed by shame. Sometimes we don't even give God the chance to forgive us. We decide on our own that we are unworthy and deny ourselves the very same mercy that Jesus offers the woman caught in adultery.

I imagine that woman dragged before Jesus, cowering in fear, head down, arms raised against the painful blows she thought would surely come. She waits—silent, afraid. She knows the punishment for her crime/ she does not assume there is a way out. And then, suddenly, mercy, freedom, peace. Jesus' words collapse the angry mob in on itself. "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." And then, "Has no one condemned you? . . . Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin any more."

It was that simple and at the same time that incomprehensible. The woman walks away, stunned by the sheer audacity of such a statement. How can this be? And yet the facts bear it out. It is not an empty promise. The mob is gone; the sin is forgiven; the woman is saved; her life changed forever. Do we understand that Jesus holds out the same promise to us today—and every day?

Are there things in your life of which you are ashamed? Have you laid them before God and asked for forgiveness, or are you clinging to them, afraid to let God see you for who you are? God already knows. There is nothing to hide and nothing to fear. Jesus shows us this in a fantastic display of mercy in today's gospel. Do you believe you are worthy of the same kind of mercy? We only have to wait and trust Jesus at his word.

Jesus, we take shelter in the comfort and peace of your unbounded mercy. We know we are sinners, but you draw us to you all the same, convinced of our worthiness. Thank you for seeing us for who we are and loving us through our sins and failings.

Palos y Piedras

La historia de la mujer sorprendida en adulterio es tan familiar que es fácil pasar por alto su importancia no sólo para la mujer a ser lapidada hasta la muerte, sino también para cada uno de nosotros esperando un castigo por las veces que hemos pecado. Puede que no estemos esperando un vecindario para lanzarnos una piedra. Pero seguimos agachados en miedo, paralizado por la vergüenza. A veces no nos damos cuenta que Dios da la oportunidad para perdonarnos. Decidimos por nosotros que somos indignos y negamos, la misma misericordia que Jesús ofrece a la mujer sorprendida en adulterio.

Me imagino que esa mujer arrastrada delante de Jesús, llena de miedo, cabeza abajo, brazos alzados contra los golpes dolorosos que pensaba seguramente vendría. Ella espera en silencio temiendo el castigo por su crimen / ella no asume que hay una salida. Y entonces, la misericordia, libertad, paz. Las palabras de Jesús colapsan la turba en ella misma. «Que entre vosotros que esté libre de pecado sea el primero en arrojar la piedra contra ella». ¿Y entonces, "ha nadie te ha condenado? . . . Ni yo te condeno. Vete ahora en adelante no peques más."

Es tan simple y al mismo tiempo que incomprendible. La mujer camina lejos, aturdida por la pura audacia de tal declaración. ¿Cómo puede ser esto? Y sin embargo los hechos lo confirman. No era una promesa vacía. La turba se había ido; el pecado es perdonado; la mujer se salva, su vida cambia para siempre. ¿Entendemos que Jesús tiene la misma promesa a nosotros hoy — y todos los días?

¿Hay cosas en tu vida que estás avergonzado? ¿Has presentado delante de Dios y le pides perdón, has puesto el tema ante Dios y has pedido perdón o estas aferrado a ello temerosa que Dios te vea como eres? Dios ya sabe. No hay nada que ocultar y nada que temer. Jesús nos muestran esto en una muestra fantástica de la misericordia en el Evangelio de hoy. ¿Cree usted que es indigno de la misma clase de misericordia? Solo tenemos que esperar y confiar en Jesús en su palabra.

Jesús, tomamos refugio en la comodidad y tranquilidad de su misericordia ilimitada. Sabemos que somos pecadores, pero nos atrae hacia El convencidos de nuestro valor, Gracias por vernos por lo que somos y amarnos a través de nuestros pecados y fracasos.

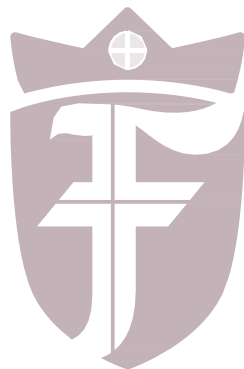
