## THE CROSS OF JESUS

The perception of a cross changed dramatically after Jesus' crucifixion. Before that event, death on a cross was not only horrible, it was degrading. It was a penalty reserved only for the most wretched of criminals. The word "glory" would not have found its way into the same sentence containing the word "cross." But all that changed with Jesus. Over time, believers began to venerate and honor the cross. They painted, sculpted, and carved images of it. Many lost their own lives for their association with it. Today our reverence for and relationship with the cross recalls little of the contempt originally associated with it. As it has been through the ages, it is our perception of the cross that determines how we follow Jesus.

Dear Folks,

It is the end of the Summer, and uncharacteristically, my Chicago White Sox are not in last place in their division. In fact a respectable third... for now. There is always room for adjustments. And that said now is the time for the parish adjustments I have been speaking about during the last two months.

\*\*\*\* Starting Saturday September 5th, with the 5pm Mass we are going back to Confessions ½ hour before each of the Sunday Masses. The standard operating procedure is simply to line up along the wall from the holy water font, on the St. Joseph side of the Church, or the stairs to the choir loft, on the Blessed Mother side of the Church proceeding down to the turn off to the new Confessionals. Please, maintain a safe distance from each other, and, please, no hopping pews. As a point of courtesy... please let the senior citizens, pregnant mothers, mothers with hungry newborns have a pass to the front of the line. There is a story in the last group, from my days as a rookie in the box... another time.

\*\*\*\* On September 6th, the first Sunday of September, we will go back to Communion in the front of the Church, at the proper time of the Mass. The two, and only two, distributing Communion will have masks on and will stand in the front aisle. Communion will not be given out at the rail. All are encouraged to wear their masks at every Mass (most especially the 2pm Mass). For those watching from home we will still wait for them to show up in the front church foyer after Mass. For them, nothing changes. Please, let everyone understand, *If there is a spike in the pandemic than we are back to Communion in the front foyer after every Mass.* I am sorry to say it but I truly suspect we will see a spike in late October, going into November.

\*\*\*\* Again, on September 6th, the first Sunday of September, our Sunday evening Mass will change from 5pm to 5:30pm. This is done to allow me to teach the high school CCD class at 4pm, with Confessions to follow at 5pm. Those classes should start at the end of September. The Parish Youth Group will follow after the 5:30pm Mass.

\*\*\*\* And last in the lineup. Starting Wednesday September 9th we will initiate the Weekly Parish Holy Hour. There is plenty to pray for: the shut-ins and sick members of the parish, vocations, the young family members serving in the military, for marriages and families stressed in the pandemic, and for those seeking employment. We will use the Miraculous Medal Novena, which begins with exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the rosary. Benediction will follow at the end of the hour and the weekly Wednesday confessions will continue at 8pm.

The remainder of the Confession Schedule will remain the same: Friday morning at 10:30am; Saturday morning at 8am and Saturday afternoon at 3:30-4:30pm. When Advent starts we will have Confessions each weeknight at 8pm... for everyone, especially those road warrior from the Greenway.

And last of all. In September let the Knights and That Man is You Groups stand ready with their masks. Tally Ho! God bless one and all. Let us pray for one another.

**Collegiate Answer:** The Lion of Munster was a German Archbishop who stood out against the Nazi Regime of Adolph Hitler and was protected by public sentiment in his favor. His name was Clemens August Graf von Galen. The Pope made him a cardinal after the war but they had to sneak him out to Rome because... wait for it, wait for it... the Americans had all the roads blocked so no one could leave Germany. Sadly, he died three weeks after his return to Germany. His was a voice left for a certain people at a certain time. And again, sadly, the German people today could use such a voice for to help them survive their secular reich.

**Collegiate Question:** Von Galen helped to shut down the infamous T-4 program in Germany four months before the Americans entered the War. What was the "Aktion T-4 Program?" And, what nation promoted it to the Germans? This may hit close to home for some of our collegians. Good hunting.

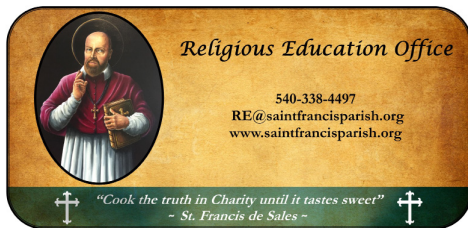

## REGISTRATION FOR 2020-2021

Looking forward to having you back very soon!

We've received registrations from 67 families... 132 children so far. Please, please, please... please check your spam folder to see if your registration form is waiting there. Email is our primary means of communication, so make sure we have a current email address for your family.

Registration forms are also available on the website [saintfrancisparish.org/youth-religious-education/kindergarten-thru-high-school/](http://saintfrancisparish.org/youth-religious-education/kindergarten-thru-high-school/). Hard copies are in the church narthex.

We ask that all families in the parish whose children do not receive a Catholic education, please sign up for either the in-class or homeschool option for religious education this year. Children are required to receive catechesis in 1st and 2nd grade before First Holy Communion; children in the 7th and 8th grade prepare for Confirmation. We will assess all children at the end of each school year before promotion to the next grade level, so catechesis at all grade levels is very important.

There are still openings in all sessions, but the Sunday and Monday sessions are more popular. Class sizes will remain small, so it's important that you register now for your preferred session.

We are blessed with many volunteer catechists who are excited to work with your children. For those of you who choose to homeschool your children, we will support you throughout the year.

**ASSISTANTS ARE STILL NEEDED!!** so please prayerfully consider helping this year. Catechists and assistants receive free tuition.

**HELP WANTED:** Paid position! Part-time/temporary employment for those 17 and over. We are seeking help from individuals to clean the classrooms and public areas in the Education Center after two different religious education sessions on Monday (after 8 pm) and Wednesday (after 6 pm) evenings. Cleaning will take approximately 2 hours on each evening, and must follow CDC guidelines. Training will be provided. Dear Folks,

We are all making adjustments in this age of the pandemic, but I'm impressed by our parishioner's resolve to continue our Lord's good work in your homes and here at the parish.

As we look forward to the fall, local counties have decided to move to all-virtual learning for the first semester, and perhaps for the entire year. Of course, we are no longer surprised when "Plan B" goes into effect; we should always be prepared to make modifications in areas we have already endured during the last four months.

Our goal is to begin the year utilizing our classroom space, offering in-class instruction each week to the children in kindergarten through high school. Classes are scheduled to begin the week of September 27.

We will also offer all parents the option to homeschool their children this year. Diocesan policy states that children in sacrament preparation years (Grades 1 and 2 for First Holy Communion; and, Grades 7 and 8 for Confirmation) who attend non-Catholic schools are required to attend religious education classes at the parish. Due to this year's extenuating circumstances, the requirement for in-class instruction is waived; however, students are required to complete coursework with parents at home. The catechists and Director of Religious Education will monitor progress and assist you throughout the year. All students (in grades 1-8) will be expected to complete this year's work before moving up to the next grade level.

We will register all children in 1st through 8th grades, whether homeschooled or attending classes at the Education Center, for the Faith and Life online textbook series through the My Catholic Faith Delivered Program. (There will not be a formal homeschool program for kindergarten children; however, in-class instruction will be offered during all sessions.)

High school students will be registered for the online Didache series (through My Catholic Faith Delivered) if parents request this option.

We hope to offer some virtual lessons for the families who choose to homeschool, but this will depend on the availability of our volunteer catechists.

For those students in kindergarten through 8th grade, class sessions will be held:  
**Sundays, 10:30-11:45 am;**  
**Mondays, 4:45-6pm; and;**  
**Wednesdays, 4:45-6pm.**

I look forward to working with our teens, and have set aside three time slots:  
**Sunday afternoons, 4-5pm;**  
**Mondays, 5-6pm and 7-8pm.**

Any high school student (9th through 12th grade) is welcome to attend one of my classes. I will offer the same weekly class during each session, to accommodate those teens who need to adjust schedules with sports and school commitments.

Father Heisler will teach 11th and 12th grade students:  
**Mondays, 5 - 6:pm.**

To reduce any undue burden on our families during this difficult time, tuition rates have been simplified. No sacrament fees will be added. Tuition fees begin at \$100 for the first child and \$25 dollars for each additional child in the family. Catechists and assistants receive free tuition. Children who are homeschooled and receive in-class instruction will pay the same fee.

We welcome all children in the parish back to the program, even if you've been away for a while. If your child has missed some of their sacraments or your family is dealing with special circumstances, please direct your questions or concerns to our Director of Religious Education, Mrs. Kim Livaudais, who is very happy to help: [k.livaudais@saintfrancisparish.org](mailto:k.livaudais@saintfrancisparish.org), 540-338-6381, x.115.

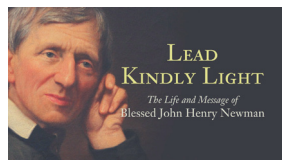
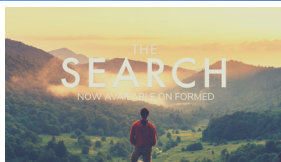
**Women's Prayer Group**
