

Dear Parishioners,

The Liturgical Year is slowly drawing to a close. This month signals the end of the Post Pentecost season as well as the Ordinary Time season. However, there are a few “last hurrahs” to consider. We just experienced two great days in the liturgical year, the joyous feast of All Saints and the somber commemoration of All Souls. Both days carry the same class rank and degree of solemnity, yet each is quite different from the other with regard to character. The first was celebrated with exuberant pomp, the second with quiet restraint. Later on this month, we encounter (attention, “buzz word”) the Dedication of the Archbasilica of Our Holy Savior, aka St. John Lateran, the pope’s church, the Dedication of the Basilicas of Ss. Peter and Paul. We also celebrate the feasts of St. Frances Cabrini – who lost out to a drag queen LGBTQ activist in NYC’s First Lady’s choice for “NYC’s Seven Most Important Women.” The Catholic Church gets it again. America’s first canonized saint ignored, and “Sylvia Rivera,” née José, exalted. What a world.

We’ll also have St. Albert the Great, teacher of St. Thomas Aquinas, St. Elizabeth of Hungary, St. Cecilia, the patron saint of music and St. Clement, the fourth pope, actually mentioned in the Canon of the Mass (EF), and Eucharistic Prayer I (OF).

All of these saints, and some notable others, are included in the “home stretch” leading to the “24<sup>th</sup> and Last Sunday after Pentecost” (EF) and the Solemnity of Christ the King (OF). The Extraordinary Form celebrated this last mentioned feast last Sunday, October 27. Pope Pius XI established this feast in 1925 for the last Sunday of October, partly, in opposition to the Protestant celebration of “Reformation Sunday.” It was also established as a signpost in the combat against communism, secularism and modernism, all three of which, unfortunately, are still with us, accompanied by “liberalism” (which definitely ain’t liberal), obsession with sex (of all sorts of “varieties”) and political correctness. God save us from those three, along with the threat to freedom of speech.

Have you ever noticed that is impossible to laugh at ourselves today? Along with the fact that the average individual lacks the intellectual tools to do so, I still miss “Li’l Abner,” Mel Brooks films and Punch Magazine. God bless you, my children and my friends.

## **Catholic Charities Hosts Fundraiser**



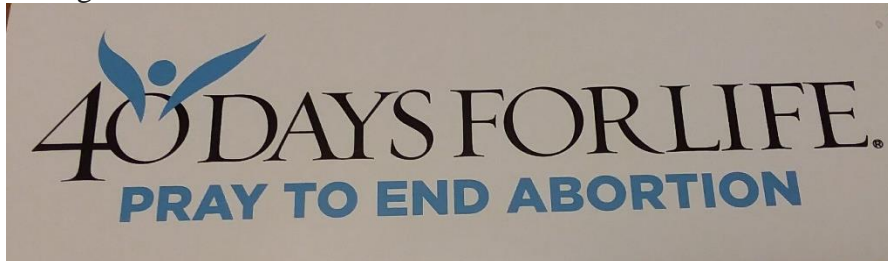

## **40 Days for Life Campaign**

This Sunday, 3 November is the last day in the annual 40 Days for Life Campaign. St. Joseph parish did its part to pray on October 17th from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. outside the Planned Parenthood in Aurora.

There is a global campaign in ending abortion through the 40 days-worldwide-communities that rally to create a non-stop, 40 day prayer vigil outside their local abortion facility. The crisis is over 56 million children are killed in the womb every year-about 150,000 per day. Nearly 1 out of every 5 children in the U.S. are killed in the womb. Planned Parenthood in Aurora Illinois is the largest abortion facility in the Midwest, killing 75-100 pre-born children from our community every week.

The solution is if we want to end abortion, the first thing we must do is pray. People of the faith are also encouraged to fast. Christ said there are some demons that can only be driven out by prayer and fasting.

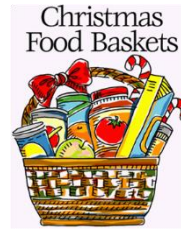
### **Catholic Engaged Encounter**
