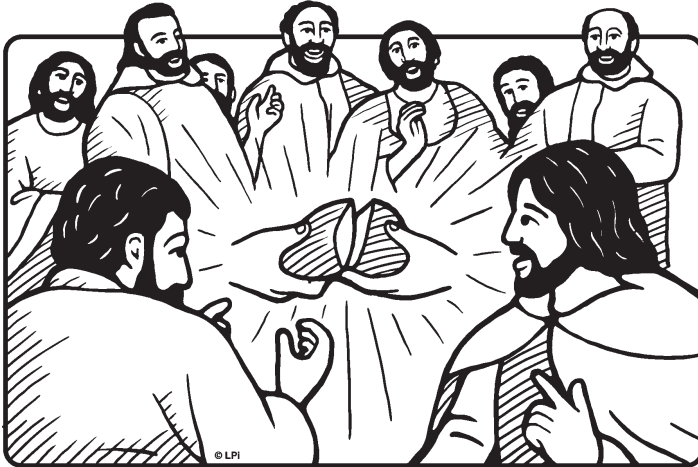

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The learned cultural critic and writer **Henry Adams**, a descendant of the famous family that gave our nation two of its earliest presidents, was a man of ironic and skeptical inclinations who deeply distrusted the gross materialism he saw so strongly present in American life at the close of the 19th Century. Contrasting its mighty industrial machinery with the power of the spiritual order, Adams concluded that

All the steam in the world could not, like the Virgin, build Chartres.

Mary is our foremost example of how the grace of her Son can so captivatingly transform life. While she is the pinnacle of Christian sainthood, she also belongs to all of humanity.

Rhonda Chervin, a professor of philosophy and one of America's most talented Catholic authors, became a Consecrated Widow of the Society of Our Lady of the Most Holy Trinity after the death of her husband. Marveling at the influence Mary has had even beyond our religion, she has written that



Even non-Catholics are stunned by you. The famous psychologist Carl Jung responded to the proclamation of the dogma of your assumption by insisting this was the most important event of the 20th Century! In terms of his own symbolic categories, he thought that you were the archetype of the truly feminine: motherly, valiant, and soaring above the evils of our benighted era of masculine power gone berserk. You bring, instead, beauty, comfort, hope.

Ever since the awesome moment when Jesus, from the cross of his saving death, commended Mary to the care of St. John and proclaimed her as John's mother, and, implicitly, ours as well, Catholics have confidently approached her through prayer and have humbly sought to imitate her goodness. In Rhonda Chervin's words:

In personal rather than in cosmic terms, we chant your mysteries on the rosary in humble supplication that our own lives might be redeemed: the knots of our being untangled; our loved ones brought to the feet of their savior; our dead hidden in the heart of your Son.

May is traditionally a time for Catholics to savor and renew their supplication of the Mother of God. For us, this is no mere sentimental reverie, but a devotion that springs from the heart of what is all-important to us.

TAKING CARE OF SAINT JOSEPH CHURCH

OUR SACRISTAN

Saint Joseph Parish has been blessed to have someone who has dedicated more than 20 years of his life to helping Saint Joseph Church and School. You've certainly seen him around campus, but how much do you know about this very special individual?

John Brereton moved from NYC to Oradell, New Jersey and enrolled in Saint Joseph School when he was in fourth grade. A proud alumnus of SJS, he moved on to St. Joseph Regional High School and then spent one year at Fordham University before enlisting in the Marines.

John was enrolled in the Naval Enlisted Scientific Education Program, earning a B.S. in Computer Science, and was commissioned in December of 1976. He was a Data Systems Officer for most of his 20 year career serving in Hawaii; at Purdue University in Indiana; in Okinawa, Japan; Quantico, Virginia; and Albany, Georgia.

A highlight of John's military career was being the Marine Corps Color Bearer at the welcome of returning POWs when Operation Homecoming in 1973 arranged the release of American prisoners of war from Viet Nam, some of whom had spent as many as eight years in captivity.

While stationed in Japan, John was part of the honor guard when President Richard Nixon visited that country. In 1990, after retiring and returning to his hometown of Oradell, John worked as a security guard at the Bear's Nest Community in Park Ridge (which coincidentally included the townhouse where former President Nixon resided until his death in 1994).

It was at about that time that John began his career at Saint Joseph Parish. He worked for nine years doing both parish and school maintenance and has served as our church sacristan for over ten years. In his role as sacristan, John sets up for funerals and weddings, straightens pews, works with our wonderful parish liturgical ministers and closes the Church on Sundays—to name only a few of his current responsibilities.

Blessed with a rich baritone speaking voice, John has been a lector at Mass for 24 years. In addition, he spent a number of years announcing both New Milford and River Dell junior football games. A huge fan of Saint Joseph Athletic Association basketball for over 25 years, John runs the scoreboard at games—a job he also performs at Saint Joseph School's annual Catholic Schools Week student/faculty volleyball game.

John is a talented, mostly self-taught musician who plays both the piano and organ. If you have been lucky enough to hear him play "O Holy Night" at Christmas time, you will not have forgotten the experience.

One thing you may not know about John, and can not tell from looking at him, is that he is a double lung transplant recipient. Both he and his doctors are extremely proud that in March he celebrated five years since his operation at Columbia University Medical Center of New York-Presbyterian Hospital.

John Brereton considers the many years he has spent as a member of Saint Joseph Parish to be a great blessing for him; we know that having John here has been a true blessing for the parish as well.

SPRING CLEANING AND REPAIR PROJECTS

The winter of 2013-14 was one for the record books. And when you think of how it came just a little more than a year after Superstorm Sandy, you can easily imagine how much the bad weather has impacted our beloved church. Add that to the fact that the building itself is 63 years old (it was built in 1951) and you can understand that repairs are needed now.

After successfully completing (with assistance from some generous parishioners) a number of large repairs and improvements to our school buildings, including installation of a new boiler in the upper school, repair of doors, fascia and brickwork in both schools, repair of the roof and patching of the cafeteria ceiling in the lower school, and installation of a security camera system there, **Tom Meli**, our facilities director, with the help of our **Facilities Committee**, has a plan to make much needed repairs to our church.



In addition to changing the radiator cover on the back wall of the altar so soot from candles and incense is redirected away from the wall (a project that has already been started), there are plans to repaint the walls and ceiling of the sanctuary, replace the stained carpeting on the altar (which was installed in 1996), update the sound system, and refinish the front doors of the church and the terrazzo floors which have sustained a great deal of salt damage due to the inclement weather. If left untreated, the floor risks becoming permanently pitted.

The leak in the church roof has now been repaired, but the ceiling of the sacristy needs to be fixed. And ideally, the metal window frames that have been rusting for the last sixty years will need to be refinished. Continued rusting will eventually cause the metal to contract and the beautiful stained glass windows to crack.

Your generosity in our Easter collection and in our weekly collections will help us to make these much needed repairs and to keep Saint Joseph Church in fine condition for generations to come.

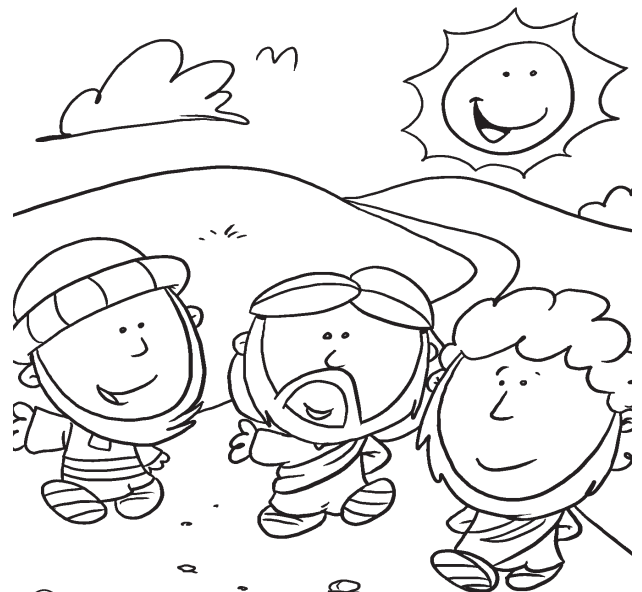
