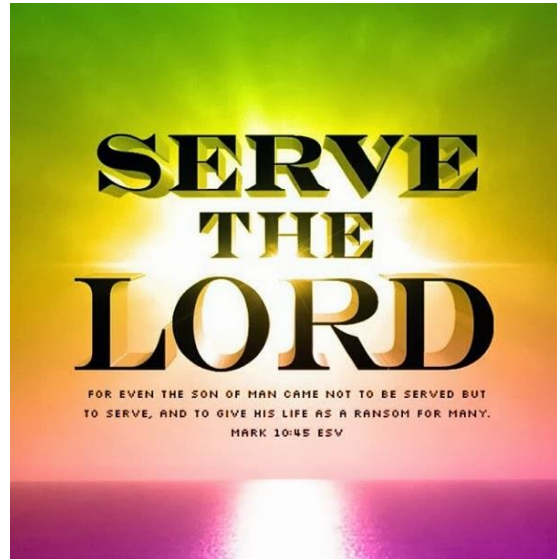

Lord, let me see your glory today!

Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left. (Mark 10:37)

James and John didn't quite get it, but then again neither did the other apostles! To their credit, James and John did believe that Jesus would reign in glory. They had heard him predict his passion (Mark 10:32-34), and seemed to believe that some kind of glory would follow whatever suffering Jesus had foretold. And they wanted to be part of it. They wanted to have seats of honor right next to Jesus' throne.

Maybe these two saw Jesus' passion and death as just one step in the process—a sad but necessary step toward their own glory. They seemed to miss the fact that giving himself up for us defined the mission of Jesus, and it characterized his kingdom. Jesus came to serve, not to be served (Mark 10:45). He wanted James and John—and all his followers—to understand that his glory was at its height when he emptied

himself. His followers would be counted as great to the extent that they imitated his attitude, humbling themselves and becoming the servants of all (10:43-44).

So what will it look like when Jesus comes in glory? The Book of Revelation describes a heavenly throne room with Jesus looking like a lamb that had been slain (5:6). In heaven, he still bears the marks of his sacrifice, and the angels and saints praise him for the beauty of his humble self-gift. The lofty throne James and John were imagining was actually more like an altar of sacrifice than a seat of government.

As you come to Mass today, know that the glorious Lord, the Lamb of God, is offering himself to you once again in the sacrifice of the Eucharist. There is glory in this sacrifice, in his life poured out for you. Let it inspire you to go and pour yourself out for others.

Eternal God, help us to see clearly the truly important things in our day-to-day lives and to find you in the midst of them. Amen.



Concédelo que en tu gloria podamos sentarnos uno a tu derecha y el otro a tu izquierda. (Marcos 10:37)

Santiago y Juan no lo entendieron del todo, ¡pero tampoco lo entendieron los otros apóstoles! Para su crédito, Santiago y Juan creían que Jesús reinaría en gloria. Lo habían escuchado predecir su pasión (Marcos 10:32-34), y parecían creer que algún tipo de gloria seguiría a cualquier sufrimiento que Jesús hubiera predicho. Y querían ser parte de ella. Querían tener asientos de honor justo al lado del trono de Jesús.

Tal vez estos dos vieron la pasión y muerte de Jesús como solo un paso en el proceso, un paso triste pero necesario hacia su propia gloria. Parecían pasar por alto el hecho de que entregarse por nosotros definía la misión de Jesús, y caracterizaba su reino. Jesús vino a servir, no a ser servido (Marcos 10:45). Quería que Santiago y Juan, y todos sus seguidores, entendieran que su gloria estaba en su apogeo cuando se vació a sí mismo. Sus seguidores serían contados

como grandes en la medida en que imitaran su actitud, humillándose y convirtiéndose en los siervos de todos (10:43-44).

Entonces, ¿cómo será cuando Jesús venga en gloria? El libro de Apocalipsis describe una sala del trono celestial con Jesús pareciendo un cordero que había sido inmolado (5:6). En el cielo, todavía lleva las marcas de su sacrificio, y los ángeles y santos lo alaban por la belleza de su humilde don de sí mismo. El elevado trono que Santiago y Juan estaban imaginando era en realidad más como un altar de sacrificio que una sede de gobierno.

Al venir a la Misa hoy, sepan que el glorioso Señor, el Cordero de Dios, se está ofreciendo a sí mismo una vez más en el sacrificio de la Eucaristía. Hay gloria en este sacrificio, en su vida derramada por ti. Deja que te inspire a ir y derramarte por los demás.

“¡Señor, déjame ver tu gloria hoy!”

Dios eterno, ayúdanos a ver claramente las cosas verdaderamente importantes en nuestra vida cotidiana y a encontrarte en medio de ellas. Amén.

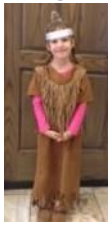

Preparation for Confirmation

Bishop Joe Vasquez states in a letter to priests regarding the Sacrament of Confirmation: *Baptized adolescents (eighth grade or beyond) who have celebrated First Communion are prepared over a 2-yr period.* Attendance at mass and at faith formation classes is especially important during this time. Students attend Religious Education classes in the parish where they are registered or attend mass. St. Ferdinand students who have attended Religious Education classes in 8th grade and Youth Ministry in 9th grade will usually receive confirmation early in the 10th grade.

St. Ferdinand 8th grade religious education classes currently meet from 6:30 to 7:45 on Wednesday evenings, or 9:30 to 10:40 on Sunday mornings. If your child is not yet registered, or has difficulty attending at one of these times, please call the Director of Religious Education at 833-0444. Ninth Grade is a part of the Youth Ministry program for St Ferdinand and Good Shepherd. Margie Vasquez is our Youth Minister. If your high school aged child has not yet registered for Youth Ministry, please contact Margie at 512-924-8558.

Bishop Vasquez will celebrate the next Rite of Confirmation at St Ferdinand on Saturday, November 13th at 5:00 mass. If your child is in 8th or 9th grade this year, they are encouraged to attend mass that day to see the rite celebrated and to have an idea of what to expect.

High School RICH Youth Ministry: Classes for October will be on **Oct. 10th & 24th from 5:30 pm – 7:30 pm.** Classes will be held every other Sunday at St. Ferdinand in Blanco. (see *Youth Ministry Bulletin Information*)

RCIA Classes: The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults and Adapted for Children is offered at Good Shepherd. Please schedule an appointment with Margie Vasquez to discuss the process and class times. Classes are offered in Spanish or English.

Life Teen is an environment in which high school youth can come into a deeper relationship with God through spiritual, educational, emotional, and social experiences. Our Youth Ministry follows the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) guidelines for comprehensive youth ministry programs.

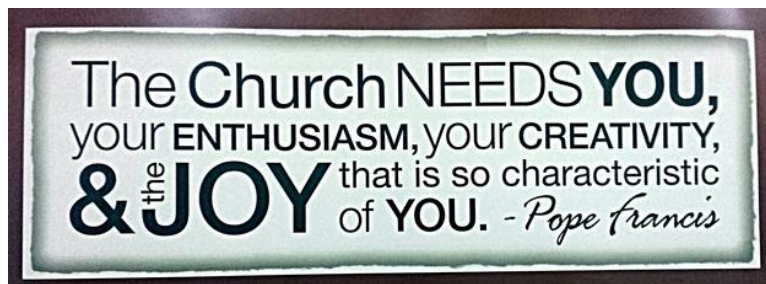
