

A Letter from Father Sheldon

My Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

I hope you are all well.

Summer is here. We are now back in ordinary time. Let me share with you what Ordinary means in the Catholic Liturgical calendar. Below is a "cut and paste" from a Christian website.

Why Is Ordinary Time Called Ordinary?

Ordinary Time is called "ordinary" not because it is common but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. The Latin word ordinalis, which refers to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word ordo, from which we get the English word order. Thus, the numbered weeks of Ordinary Time, in fact, represent the ordered life of the Church—the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in more severe penance (as in Advent and Lent), but in watchfulness and expectation of the Second Coming of Christ.

It's appropriate, therefore, that the Gospel for the Second Sunday of Ordinary Time (which is actually the first Sunday celebrated in Ordinary Time) always features either John the Baptist's acknowledgment of Christ as the Lamb of God or Christ's first miracle—the transformation of water into wine at the wedding at Cana.

Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God, walks among us and transforms our lives. There's nothing "ordinary" about that!

Last Sunday we celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Our Lord. This week we celebrate the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Let me connect these two Feasts by saying that The Eucharist nourishes us so that we will have the courage and strength to imitate His Sacred Heart. So that even when we think ordinary time is ordinary, our deeds, imitating the Sacred Heart will make every day sacred.

"Would that I could persuade all men to foster devotion to this glorious saint [Joseph] because of the singular proof that I have of the many favors he obtains for us of God." (St. Teresa of Avila, p.27)

"Make him [St. Joseph] the patron of your family and you will soon have tangible proof of his protecting hand." (St. Peter Julian, Eymard, p.66)

"If anyone cannot find a master to teach him how to pray, let him take this glorious saint [Joseph] as his master, and he will not go astray." (St. Bernadette Soubirous, p. 71)

"Jesus granted to him [St. Joseph] the special privilege of safeguarding the dying against the snares of Lucifer, just as he had also saved him from the schemes of Herod." (St. Alphonsus Liguori, p. 135)
