A Note from Our Pastor ...

- Welcome to all of you! Whether you are worshiping with us in person, reading the bulletin on the internet or watching livestream, please know of my joy at your participation with our parishes during the quarantine. The Wisconsin bishops have reinstated the Sunday obligation as of September 26-27, for all those who are not in at-risk situations, with a continuation of all safety practices, and so many of us are enjoying the grace of gathering as a community in a way that we haven't for many months. May we be diligent in observing all health guidelines, and may the Lord bless us with his presence in our Masses during this new phase! We have tried to announce the return of the Sunday obligation by email, bulletin, and website. Please consider mentioning it to anyone who may not have gotten the message.
- I enjoyed the annual priest gathering September 21-22 in Cross Plains. The purpose of this gathering is for priests to have opportunities to socialize and to learn. We had two presenters on the topic of evangelization, and they were excellent. We followed all safety practices, but I later learned that one of the priests who attended tested positive for corona virus on September 23. Since I didn't go near that person, the Diocese, in consultation with public health officials, directs that I safely celebrate Mass at St. Joseph and St. Mary but not distribute Communion from now to October 4.



- Tuesday, Oct. 6 "It is God who gives life. Let us respect and love human life, especially vulnerable life in a mother's womb."
- Wednesday, Oct. 7 "Every child who, rather than being born, is condemned unjustly to being aborted, bears the face of Jesus Christ"
- Thursday, Oct. 8 "The Church cannot be expected to change her position on this question. ... It is not 'progressive' to try to resolve problems by eliminating a human life."
- Friday, Oct. 9 "Our defense of the innocent unborn ... needs to be clear, firm and passionate, for at stake is the dignity of a human life"
- Saturday, Oct. 10 "Equally sacred ... are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and the underprivileged, the vulnerable infirm and elderly"
- Sunday, Oct. 11 "All too often ... people do not accept the 'Gospel of Life' but let themselves be led by ideologies and ways of thinking that block life, that do not respect life"
- Monday, Oct. 12 "Unborn children are always to be welcomed; life is always to be protected and loved, from conception to its natural end."


