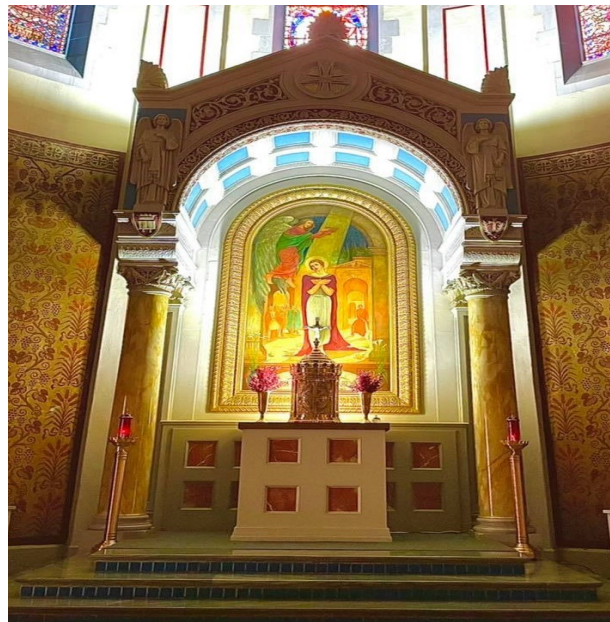

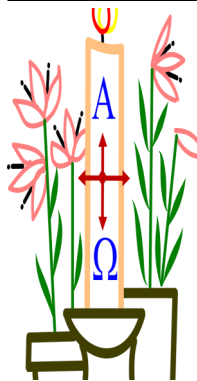

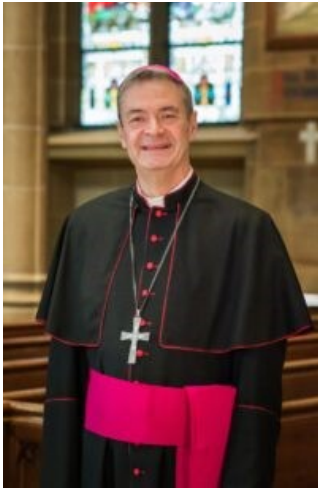

POPE FRANCIS NAMES NEW BISHOP OF THE DIOCESE OF BROOKLYN

The Holy Father, Pope Francis, has named the
 Most Reverend Robert J. Brennan as the
 Eighth Bishop of the Diocese of Brooklyn.
 The appointment was announced on Wednesday,
 September 29, 2021, by Archbishop Christophe Pierre,
 Apostolic Nuncio to the United States.



The Most Reverend Nicholas DiMarzio,
 Bishop of Brooklyn,
 who turned 75 years of age on June 16, 2019,
 had submitted his resignation on that date
 as required by Canon Law.

His resignation was accepted on
 September 29, 2021 by Pope Francis.

NEW COVID-19 GUIDELINES FOR CHURCH

--Please be aware that our church is cleaned regularly and disinfected several times a week. Every precaution is being taken to keep people safe and healthy.

The Music Ministry of St. Pancras

This weekend, we are offered a great parallel between our first reading (the book of Genesis, chronicling the creation of woman as a companion to man) and our Gospel (Mark 10, in which Jesus interprets and condemns divorce). We are made, as Catholics, to understand the depth and importance of familial relationships — and certainly, this begins with a strong and inseparable marriage between man and woman. The Church teaches that marriage comes with great obligations and responsibilities: loving and supporting one another; sharing equally in the things we have; pursuing educational opportunities and fruitful careers; and bearing and providing for children, among so many other things. Our bodies are created (woman from a man's rib-cage, as we are reminded this weekend) to be one flesh which we will return to at death.

In marriage, love renders in the form of a spiritual and indissoluble bond, by which husband and wife come together to exist as new members of God's beloved creation, in order to live and grow with each other in wholeness and harmony. This is much more than just procreation: it is about sharing life together in sickness and in health, facing poverty and luxury, death and rebirth. Therefore, drawing near to God in perfect matrimony with another person establishes its role as a central sacrament in the Church — the perfect conjugal act. As we reflect on the relationship between readings this weekend, may we as Catholics understand the role of marriage — where we are bound by inseparable ties by our Creator. 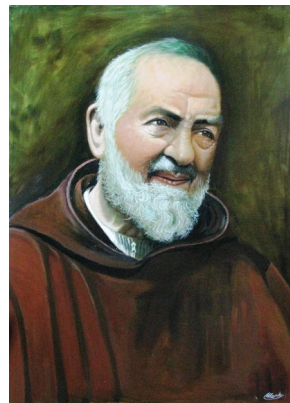

From the Pastor's Desk...

October is Respect Life Month

St. Joseph:

Faithful Protector of Mother and Child

The infant Christ “came into our world in a state of great vulnerability. He needed to be defended, protected, cared for and raised by Joseph” (PC 5). The humble and often hidden carpenter of Nazareth accompanied Mary in her pregnancy, assisted at the birth of the Messiah in a stable, presented Jesus in the Temple, fled with his family far from their homeland to protect them, and lovingly raised Jesus as his own son in the years to come.



While the angel of the Lord appeared to Mary to announce that she would bring forth the Savior of the world, it was revealed to Joseph in a series of dreams how God’s plans would be brought to fulfillment. As Pope Francis highlights, “God trusted Joseph, as did Mary, who found in him someone who would not only save her life, but would always provide for her and her child” (PC 5).

Like every other human family, the Holy Family had to confront real and concrete challenges. Yet, “in every situation, Joseph declared his own ‘fiat’” (PC 3). His “yes” to the Lord meant that regardless of the hardship and personal sacrifice to himself, he consistently chose to put the needs of Mary and Jesus before his own. Joseph’s devotion helps reveal to us our own call to show special care for the lives of those whom God has entrusted to us.

During this Year of St. Joseph, each of us can find in him “an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble” (PC, Intro). Joseph shows us how to say “yes” to life, despite our own fears, frailties, and weaknesses. For it is Joseph who was “chosen by God to guide the beginnings of the history of redemption. He was the true ‘miracle’ by which God saves the child and his mother” (PC 5).

May we, too, be miracles in the lives of those who are most in need, especially at the beginning and end of life.

Dear St. Joseph, you who were “able to turn a problem into a possibility by trusting always in divine providence” (PC 5), help us to imitate your faithful trust and courage.
