

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month: Mandated Reporters in the Diocese of Erie are people who hold positions of trust in our schools. parishes, agencies and institutions and are mandated by Pennsylvania law and the diocesan Policy for the Protection of Children to report suspected abuse of a minor. All employees and volunteers working/ serving for the Diocese of Erie, in our parishes, schools or agencies are considered mandated reporters both legally and morally obligated to report any reasonable suspected child abuse to ChildLine, the local police, or other appropriate agency. St. Patrick Cemetery Information - The cost of opening and closing a burial site at St. Patrick Cemetery is changing as of May 1, 2020. This is due to the increase in the cost for the backhoe equipment needed to dig a grave. The last cemetery price change was made on February 1, 2014. Listed below are the new amounts for interment:

Opening/closing (weekday) is \$850 Opening/closing (Saturday) is \$1,000 Opening/closing (Sunday) is \$1,100

Catholic Rural Ministry – Oil City Deanery Statistics for year 2019:

Aided Families in our Families in Need Program: We have helped 478 persons in 172 families with financial literacy and assistance. \$38,448.74 was distributed in rent, utilities, medical RX, medical co-pays/bills, food, gas, household items, car repairs, and license fees. The average per family was \$224.

Enriched Spirituality and Religious Education Programs: The sisters held 166 programs serving 2332 persons. These programs included:

- ADULT Spirituality programs- including Bible Studies, Spiritual Direction/Companioning, Retreats/Spiritual talks, teacher in –service
- YOUTH retreats for pre K- College students and Christian service day/service week opportunities
- RESIDENTIAL Spirituality groups at Pathways Adolescent Facility and Forest SCI Men's
 Maximum Prison

Visitations and Pastoral Presence: We estimate that over 3000 people were touched by our presence at home visits, wakes, funerals & luncheons, festivals, and conversations sharing faith, personal struggles and issues related to disciple based response to our life's journeys.

Tuition Assistance: We have facilitated a tuition grant for our deanery catholic schools for the past six years. Our deanery total income has been \$129,500.00! Our Deanery schools include VRCS (St. Stephens, former St. Pats, VCHS), Immaculate Conception in Clarion and St. Joseph in Lucinda. For the past two years St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Meadville has been part of this collaboration.

Saint Gianna Beretta Molla

(Feast day, April 28)

God for all that he, in his goodness, sends to

us day after day." Saint Gianna was born in northern Italy, near Milan. Her family was devout, and Gianna learned the value of prayer and Christian service very early. At age twelve she became involved in Catholic Action. As a young adult she joined the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul.

Gianna began studying medicine during World War II, and afterward became a doctor, specializing in pediatrics. After marrying Pietro Molla in 1955, they had a son and two daughters. While pregnant with her fourth child, Gianna was diagnosed with a uterine tumor. She resolved to save the life of her unborn child despite the risk to her own life. Her fourth child, Gianna Emanuela, was born on April 21, 1962, and Gianna died seven days later as a result of complications of the tumor.

In his homily on the occasion of her beatification on April 24, 1994, Pope John Paul II offered Gianna Beretta Molla as a model for all mothers: "By holding up this woman as an exemplar of Christian perfection, we would like to extol all those high-spirited mothers of families who give themselves completely to their family, who suffer in giving birth, who are prepared for every labor and every kind of sacrifice, so that the best they have can be given to others." Gianna was canonized on May 16, 2004.

Saint Gianna understood the realities of being a wife, doctor, and working mother. She believed deeply in the holiness of the family and in the sanctity of human life. It was this deep belief that gave her the courage to entrust herself and her family to God's loving hands.

What are the responsibilities of life that you juggle? Spend some time reflecting on what these responsibilities require of you. Ask God for help to know your life's sacred purpose.
