A Roman Catholic Faith Community

What Do You Know About Angels? (Part 2 of 3)

Last week we began considering the choirs of angels and we described the first grouping or "choir" of angels: *Seraphim, Cherubim, Thrones.*

This week we continue reflecting on these heavenly beings by considering the second grouping or "choir":

Dominations

Dominations are concerned with the government or good order of the universe. They are the first of the three choirs in the second ring of angels, which is the ring of the cosmos, the angels who are charged with great and universal stewardship. The *dominations* in particular are involved in the workings of divine power. They coordinate the ministries of all the angels who deal with creation. These angels mediate God's power in the universe.

Virtues

Saint Peter mentions the *virtues* in his first epistle (1 Peter 3:22) as does Saint Paul in his letter to the Colossians (Colossians 1:16). The *virtues* have a misleading name, since they do not deal with acquired habits which we call "virtues" but rather they exercise innate, raw power over the physical universe. The *virtues* are tasked with ensuring the well-being of the world.

Powers

The *powers* form the third and last choir of the second angelic hierarchy. This choir of *powers* is thought to introduce man to the



higher mysteries while repressing the attacks of the "hostile powers" of Hell against the deepest laws of physical creation. (continued next week)

World Mission Sunday ...







That means, our priests are available for emergency calls for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and the Last Rites of the Church; we are responsible for providing a monthly Mass for the patients/residents; on Sundays, our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion serve Holy Communion at the nursing facility immediately following the Sunday 9:30 AM Mass. Saint Michael's in Georgia Ville has taken on coverage at *Smithfield Woods* on Pleasant View Avenue. Saint Philip Church continues to be responsible for pastoral care at: *Hebert's, Cortland Place*, and *The Village at Waterman Lake*.
