Dear friends in Christ,

Throughout this fall season, we are reflecting on what it means for us as disciples of Jesus to be stewards. The job of a steward is to care for, manage, and responsibly use things entrusted to them by their master. This means that stewardship has relevance for lots of different areas of our lives as individual disciples: our health and our bodies, the environment, our spirits and our faith, our talents and gifts, our time and energy, and our relationships. It also means that corporately, as congregations and as a Co-op, we are called to be trustworthy, faithful stewards of the ministry entrusted to us as part of the body of Christ.

I believe we are doing great things together and are becoming more effective in our stewardship of that ministry all the time. Our Co-op ministry teams are just one example. The Evangelical Outreach team has worked with the administration at Southeast Elementary School and a nonprofit organization called PowerPacks to bring that feeding ministry to Southeast, and they are working through the process of developing Rejoicing Spirits, a worship service for people with developmental disabilities and their families. The Fellowship Team is providing opportunities for people to gather, to break bread together, and to uplift and support one another as sisters and brothers in Christ. The Stewardship Team is putting together learning, worship, and service opportunities for us all to reflect on and grow in our identity as stewards. The Youth Team is working towards developing a robust and dynamic ministry to steward the faith and gifts of our young people. Great ministry is happening, and the good news of Jesus is being shared, in both word and deed, both inside and outside our congregations.

Our congregation councils, committees, and the Co-op board are working hard at being faithful stewards as well. Property committees are maintaining our buildings as springboards for ministry. Finance committees are working to receive, manage, safeguard, and spend the money entrusted to the church in Godly ways that advance the work of the Kingdom of God in our community. Education committees, Sunday school teachers, parish administrators and secretaries, and many others work in hundreds of ways, both seen and unseen, to be faithful stewards of the gospel and of the other gifts entrusted to us for the work of Christ.

As we continue reflecting on our calling to be stewards both individually and corporately, I’d like to invite you to consider where God might be calling you to help steward the mysteries of God. What gift, or talent, or passion has God given you? How might God be calling you to use that gift to share the love of Christ in our community? And how can Pastor Kristal, Vicar Jess, and I help you hone, develop, and steward that gift? We would love to help you listen for God’s calling in your life, whatever that calling might be, because we know firsthand the sense of joy and deep satisfaction that comes from answering that calling.

May we all continue to grow in our stewardship of the mysteries of God, and may we all be found faithful in our response to that calling.

Special Congregational Meeting Announcement

The Salem Lutheran Congregational Church Council, Property Committee and Finance Committee are asking for Congregational approval to accept the bid from Nolt Paving to repave all three parking lots in the fall of 2019, not to exceed \$56,000. The Special Congregational meeting will take place immediately following the October 13, 2019 service in the Chapel. The meeting is to vote on the above recommendation. The scheduled date for paving to begin is Mon., October 21, 2019. The estimated time to finish the work is three days.

Background information:

Nolt Paving came in as the lowest inclusive bidder. The work included in the bid is as follows:

Remove old deteriorated asphalt off site

Line Painting and parking blocks

Paving all three lots

Remove interior concrete curbs on 9th Street Parking lot (formerly where the gates were located).

Any member of the congregation can request a copy of the Nolt Paving three page estimate by contacting the church office.

The Congregational Meeting:

At least 26 voting members of the Congregation must be present to have a quorum.

All actions approved by the congregation shall be by majority vote of those voting members present and voting. Robert's Rule of Order will be used to govern the meeting.

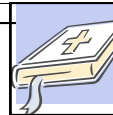

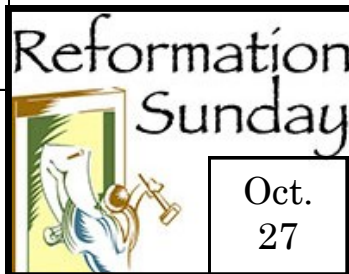

SALEM EVANGELICAL LUTHERAN CHURCH ENDOWMENT FUND

Income from the funds shall be distributed as deemed necessary and/or feasible to accomplish the following:

One-fourth for missions of the ELCA in this continent and worldwide, including, but not limited to grants to the ELCA for new congregational development in North America, professional leadership, educational ministries, global ministries, ecumenism, social ministries, and capital financing.
