This spring, the Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) will be administered in the spring of 2016 to all students in grades 3-5. Below is a list of the specific testing dates for each grade level for Smith. It is very important that students are present in class on these testing days.
Our teachers are planning activities to best prepare the students for these online assessments. You can help by ensuring that students are reading daily at home. As the testing dates are get, please be sure that your child is getting enough sleep and eating healthy foods. We find that reading, sleep, and nutrition are key factors in student success on these assessments.

Parts of the test are audio and will require students to use earphones/ear buds. Your child may bring their own audio devices from home, as they may be more comfortable using something familiar. Classroom teachers will notify you when they will want students to bring their audio device. You do NOT need to go out and purchase a headset or earbuds; we do have a supply at school for our students who do not wish to bring their own. Please do not have your child bring expensive wireless devices. As always, we cannot be held responsible for any lost or damaged personal items.

I am the president of Girls Rock In Science \& Math (GRISM), a program designed to increase interest in girls from 3rd to 5th grade in math and science. GRISM is a 501(c) (3) non-profit organization.
